BOAT REGISTRATION NOTICE

In March, Governor Janet Mills directed Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Commissioner Judy Camuso to allow boaters to operate without a current 2020 registration and Lake and River Protection sticker until April 30, 2020. Boat registrations normally expire at the end of each calendar year.

This notice is a reminder that as of May 1st, 2020, all motorized watercraft on Maine waters must have a valid registration. In addition, all motorized watercraft on inland waters must display the lake and river protection sticker.

Vinalhaven School News, by Superintendent/Principal Tonya Arnold

At the Regular Board Meeting on April 29, the Board finalized the proposed budget for next school year. The Board, our staff, and I have worked diligently to reduce the costs as much as possible while impacting student services as little as possible. Please see the summary below which I hope clearly shows the areas of increase. Future meetings: Regular Board meeting May 20 and the District Budget Meeting anticipated June 23rd.

Given the history of high turnover rate at the administrative level, the amount of expectations on Principal and Superintendent have been reviewed. Demands are too much to allow for sufficient support for students, staff and families. Therefore, a facilitated visioning session was held to determine needs for stability and sustained improvement over time. The school team and school board together determined that a full-time (1.0) Principal, full-time (1.0) Assistant Principal, and a part-time (0.40) Superintendent is a priority. The year-round housing provision for the Superintendent was eliminated.	87,431	3.56%

Vinalhaven Wastewater District would like you to help keep our wastewater system working properly and avoid unnecessary service interruptions. With the recent events surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, we are seeing a number of changes in our daily lives and it's becoming more important that we make sound decisions to prevent further issues. We have seen an increased number of sewer backups in the last month. As a quick reminder keep the following in mind – these easy steps will help protect and keep the system operating properly:

FLUSH IT: URINE, FECES AND TOILET PAPER. These are the ONLY things to flush down toilets. Toilet paper breaks down in water, other products do not.

TRASH IT: Everything else including paper towels, napkins, disposable wet wipes, cleaning or baby wipes – even if marked "flushable", cotton puffs/swabs – must be disposed of as trash and NOT flushed down toilets.
