





Notes from the Code Enforcement Office & Planning Board

In November, 2023, the town voted on revisions to the Land Use Ordinance for the first time since 2009. These notes are to let folks know what is new when it comes to Permits and a reminder about other parts of the Ordinance that have always been there.

<u>Permits for Commercial Structures or Commercial Uses now have their own Permit Application</u> different from Residential Structures and Uses. The definition of Commercial Use is:

The use of lands, buildings, and/or structures for generation of income from the production, buying, or selling of goods and/or services, exclusive of not-for-profit personal use, rental of dwelling units for purely residential use, or a "home occupation."

The Planning Board may need much more information included with a Commercial Permit Application than with a Residential one - in order to understand the impact of the activity on what is likely to be residential neighborhood.



In accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act, the Town of Vinalhaven Downtown Project, on behalf of the Northern Border Regional Commission (NBRC), has completed a Draft Environmental Assessment (EA) evaluating the potential environmental impacts of the Town of Vinalhaven's proposal to remedy deficiencies in parking lots and boat launches and mitigate flooding impacts to structures and public infrastructure (the Proposed Action). NEPA requires that federal agencies consider the effects of a proposed action and any reasonable alternatives on the human environment. This Draft EA evaluates the potential impacts that would result from the implementation of the Proposed Action as compared to the No Action alternative.

Project Title: Vinalhaven Downtown Parking Lot, Water District Offices, and Boat Launch Improvements Project Proponent: NBRC Project Location: Vinalhaven (Island), Maine Project Date: April 2023 – December 2024

Purpose of the Proposed Action:

The purpose of the project is to renovate the Vinalhaven Downtown area, which serves commercial fishing and supports the Town's tourist activities, the two principal employment sectors on the island. The project will remedy deficiencies in parking lots and boat launches and mitigate flooding impacts to structures and public infrastructure.

Project Description: The Proposed Action considered under this Draft EA is threefold:

1) Upgrading the Downtown Parking Lot and Improving the Boat Launch

This involves reconstructing the downtown parking lot on Main Street, Vinalhaven, across from Carvers Harbor Market (44.047308, -68.833475).

Under the Proposed Action, improvement activities would include:

- Removal of existing surface treatments and existing deteriorated boat ramp materials
- Removal and/or repairs to the existing bulkhead

- Installation of drainage features
- Raising the elevation of the parking lot and existing bulkhead as practical
- Installation of new boat ramp materials, surface parking, and vegetation buffers

2) Preparing Net Factory Site for Eventual Repurposing

This involves relocating the current Vinalhaven Water District Offices (44.048, -68.8328) to the existing wastewater treatment facility (44.045, -68.841) and allowing the use of the existing Water District structure to accommodate short-term project offices for construction employees to support the project. Under the Proposed Action, renovation activities at the new location include the following:

- Excavating existing materials at the driveway area of the existing wastewater facility
- Construction of a new 30 feet by 50 feet (1,500 square feet) office, garage, storage, and lab building

3) Improving Working Waterfront

The scope of this portion of the project includes improving the "Fish Plant" commercial boat launch (44.045, -68.837) and repairing/replacing the bulkheads along the "Fish Plant" parking lot (44.045, -68.838) which is located adjacent to the Fish Plan commercial boat launch on West Main Street, Vinalhaven. Under the Proposed Action, improvement activities would include:

- Removal of the existing deteriorated boat ramp materials
- Removal and/or repairs to the existing bulkhead
- Installation of drainage features
- Installation of new boat ramp materials.







Fox Islands Electric Cooperative (FIEC) and Fox Islands Wind (FIW) **Community Meetings**

The Board of Directors for FIEC and FIW are jointly hosting two community meetings to discuss battery storage, solar generation, and net metering. Jan. 7, 1956

The colored lights and confetti combined to make it a picture postcard scene. 1928

The annual polio campaign for the 1953 March of Dimes opened January 1. Containers in the form of miniature iron lungs have been placed in various stores throughout the town for contributions.

Jan. 6, 1953

Scallops grow larger and more expensive every day. This week a Vinalhaven fisherman brought in one which at 79¢ a pound sold for 12¢. Clams are selling for \$1.50 a quart, shucked. *Jan 31, 1956*

OLD HOUSES

Vinalhaven's Ancient Residences Mentioned—The Huntress House and its Construction

The question has lately arisen as to which is the oldest house in Vinalhaven, and among others, mention is made of the Allston Huntress house. It is a fact that there were several built before the Huntress place, but it is a question whether there are any that have remained so long in their primitive state as the latter. The Jonathan Calderwood house on The Neck, and the Ginn house on Green's Island were built more than a century ago, but how much, if any, of the original remains standing today? The Huntress house was built by Benjamin Mills about 80 years ago. James Beggs, and the latter resided there until several years ago, when it was bought by Mr. Huntress. The house remained as originally built until repaired by Mr. Huntress. A peculiarity about this house is, that while from the outside it has every appearance of being an ordinary wooden building, two sides and one end wall are built of bricks, a fact known to but very few people in town. Why the house was built in this manner is not known, it might have been that the builder intended having a brick house and having run out of material concluded to fall back on wood. We are not informed whether there have been any radical changes in the Ginn or Calderwood houses, so we must conclude that they may possibly antedate the Huntress place by more than a quarter of a century.

Special guests were Richard's young sister Terry and his grandmother, Mrs. Alice Hall.

Jan 3, 1956

5th Grade Historical Stories. "Several years ago a tug, by the name of *Cumberland* came here to tow a large barge-load of paving, the wind was blowing a strong gale and the hawser got caught in the tug boat's wheel and disabled the tug causing it to go ashore on the point at Green's Island. The wind and waves kept pounding against the tug until it was torn into pieces. The boiler is still on Green's Island. That is why it is called Boiler Point. The crew rowed to Vinalhaven to safety." *Herbert Conway*

Vinalhaven Neighbor Jan. 19, 1938
