What is PoG?

Portrait of a Graduate is a School and Community process to define the skills and knowledge that we want our students to have to be successful in life, college, work, and as future citizens of our local and global community.

The first part of the process involves gathering information (doing research, conducting focus groups and interviews, and administering a community-wide survey). The second part involves creating an action plan that will enable our School and Community to take what we've learned and apply it to learning in the classroom and the wider world.

Who's involved?

Everyone! That's right. All members of the Vinalhaven School and Community are invited to be part of this process. There is a **core team of teachers and community members** who make up the "process team" who are doing the work involved. They are guided by **two process facilitators**–Yvonne Thomas from the Island Institute and Val Peacock of Rural Aspirations. Both Yvonne and Val have a long history with the Vinalhaven School, including assisting with the formation of the Skippers Program. PoG is funded by a grant from the Barr Foundation (barrfoundation.org) and works collaboratively with the **University of Maine** and **the Maine Department of Education**.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

A Good Example of hockey spirit was given in the first game of the season, Tuesday afternoon which was played on Sanborn and Arey's ice pond, between the Sons of Rest and V. H. S. teams. It was an even match the first period and neither team was successful enough to get a goal, but the V. H. S. team, keeping the puck in the vicinity of the enemy's goal during the second period, scored by a pass from Raymond to Miller, and later Patrick caught Bunker sleeping and scored another. The game ended in the third period and was called off on account of darkness. Raymond, Smith and Patrick featured for V. H. S, while Cunningham and Merrithew featured for the Sons of Rest. The line up follows:

Courier-Gazette January 15, 1921

Thursday - January 6th was the coldest day we have felt so far this winter. The mercury stood at 12 degrees below zero.

Courier-Gazette January 11, 1887

A reporter of the Courier Gazette visited the office of the late Moses Webster Thursday morning. Every-thing was as the old gentleman left it the last time he was there. On the desk were his glasses as he had dropped them, while his private letters were scattered in homelike confusion. On the floor lay the skin of the deer that he shot, while above it were the cases of stuffed birds, 56 in number, that were his pride. Views of the camp at Jonesboro with his own familiar figure and that of Gov. Bodwell in the foreground, and the boathouse and log cabin at Round Pond were on the wall. The whole appearance of the place was a sad reminder of the old man beneficent who was gone.



January is National Cervical Cancer Awareness Month!

You can prevent cervical cancer by getting a routine screening test called a PAP. A PAP test can detect abnormal cells BEFORE they turn into cancer and can also find cervical cancer EARLY when it is easy to treat. The test is not painful, takes 2 to 5 minutes and can be done here at your Medical Center. Call 863-4341 to schedule. (Try to schedule the test on a day when you do not expect to be on your menstrual period. If your period begins unexpectedly and will be continuing on the day of your test, try to reschedule the appointment).

The CDC recommends women between 21-29 years of age get a PAP test every 3 years. Women aged 30-65 should get both a PAP and HPV test every 5 years.

Had a hysterectomy? If you still have a cervix, you may still need to be screened. Talk to your provider for more information.

Already HPV vaccinated? Even if you've already got the vaccine, it doesn't protect against all types of HPV so it is recommended that women continue having PAP tests and even HPV tests in some cases.

Worried about the cost? The Affordable Care Act covers this screening, check with your insurance provider. If you are uninsured or insurance won't cover PAPs and are a Mainer over 40, the Maine CDC Breast and Cervical Health Program (MBCHP) will help cover costs of an annual PAP/HPV testing (as well as

Mammogram screenings). Call 800-350-5180 to apply. ICMS also has a sliding fee scale for patients without insurance or with high deductibles.





Mom coordinated and purchased all summer home supplies. We could decide what went in our one suitcase. The night before departure at dinner mom would say, "are you packed? did you pack this? did you pack that? you need this, you don't need that and then yes, we all repacked our suitcases. Our Island home consisted of 12 houses. Any of which you could enter without anyone lifting an eyebrow. All of which to me felt like home. It's always been known that traveling is half the fun, Mom and Dad didn't share that thought
