

General Election**

### In-Person Voting

Polls will be open for in-person voting on **November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 8am to 8pm at the Town Office**. We will be limiting the number of people inside and following safety protocols.

### Request an Absentee Ballot

Registered Vinalhaven Voters may request absentee ballots any **ONE** of three ways:

1. Use the Secretary of State's Online Absentee Ballot Request Portal. Go to [apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl](https://apps.web.maine.gov/cgi-bin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl) The deadline to request ballots using this service is 5:00 pm on Thursday, October 29, 2020.
2. Call the Town Office at **(207) 863-4343** to request a ballot by phone. Please Note: the person requesting the ballot must speak with the Clerk. A person may not request a ballot for someone other than themselves.
3. Print, fill out and mail (or put in our drop box) the request form available on the Town website. [www.townofvinalhaven.org](http://www.townofvinalhaven.org)

You will need to fill out a **Maine Voter Registration Card and provide a Maine Drivers License or Maine ID AND proof of Vinalhaven residence** (if your VH address is not already on the license). Most recently, her work in Alaska has been to manage outpatient services for about 1,000 Native Alaskan and American Indian patients, and to consult for two Aleutian Island Villages providing services to over 700 patients. This experience has allowed her to manage patients, living on remote islands, and when necessary, transferring patients to the mainland for more acute care.



2. Create an email message addressed to your Kindle account
3. Subject of the email is the word "Convert"
4. Attach the wind PDF to the email body (no other text)
5. Send email
6. After a short while open your Kindle app and synchronize - the Wind should appear in your library!

To find the Kindle email account mentioned above, you need to open the Kindle app and go to 'App Settings' in your menu at Kindle's home page. It lists 'Send to Kindle Email Address' - copy/paste that address and you're all set.

## A Message from MDOT Maine Local Roads Center (LTAP)

Temporary signs (including political) in the right of way: current law places a 12 week per calendar year restriction on the placement of temporary signs in a public right-of-way.

A recent change, effective June 17, 2020, further restricts the placement of these signs to no more than six weeks from Jan. 1 to June 30 and no more than six weeks from July 1 to Dec. 31. Similar signs cannot be placed within 30 feet of each other. All signs must include or be marked with the name and address of the individual or organization that placed the sign within the public right-of-way and the date the sign was erected.

MaineDOT may remove nonconforming signs on state or state aid highway (not inside a compact area) and towns/cities may remove nonconforming signs on a town way or a state or state aid highway in an urban compact municipality.

Ann was born in Vinalhaven, June 28, 1935, to Kenneth Raymond and Virginia Winslow Webster. She graduated as valedictorian from Vinalhaven High School in 1953 and went off to Portland-Gorham (now USM) to college. She transferred to the University of Maine at Orono and graduated with a B.A. in History. Ann taught at Coney High School in Augusta and then returned to Vinalhaven in 1959 where she taught 4th grade at the Washington School. It was there that she met a music teacher named Norman Guidoboni and began a love story that lasted until her death. Ann was a dedicated wife and mother to Andrea R. Guidoboni of Milford, NH and to N. Webster Guidoboni and his wife Marian R. Guidoboni of Fremont, NH. She was also a loving "Mimi" to Julia, Nicolas, and Owen Guidoboni and to Joshua and Genevieve Beer; as well as a great-grandmother to Greyson Guidoboni.

Ann kept busy with a variety of jobs and found great satisfaction in volunteer work as the head of the Altar Guild and the Womens' Club at St. Phillips Episcopal Church in Wiscasset and later as a worker at the Lincoln County Animal Shelter. She was also a gifted pianist who, along with her husband on the trumpet, played with various dance bands in Maine including the Vinalhaven-based Sonny Polk Orchestra. She enjoyed summers with family and friends on the island at the camp on Big Wharf and quiet evenings at home with her husband, talking things over, reading books and cuddling with pets; most recently with her beloved cats, Cleo and Kit. At the time of her death, Ann and Norman were communicants of Christ Church in Gardiner.

Ann is survived by Norman, her husband of 60 years; her children, grandchildren and great-grandchild; her sisters, Susan McKown and her husband George; Linda Adams and her husband Richard; her brother, Kenneth Webster and his wife Donna; and numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins. ## Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

### He's Smart at 82

*Andrew Ednie, Vinalhaven  
Scotchman, on Shipyard Job Daily*

One of Knox County's active oldsters is Andrew Ednie, of Vinalhaven, who has been employed as a sweeper at the Snow Shipyards a little over a year. Although he is 82 years of age, he has not lost any time since he started work, with the exception of a period over Thanksgiving and Christmas which he spent at his home, and two and one-half days, week before last owing to an attack of "distemper."

Mr. Ednie was born in Newburg, Scotland, March 13, 1862 and came to the United States when a young man of 25, working first at Staten Island, NY. He came to Vinalhaven

in 1898 and worked many years as a blacksmith, principally for Leopold & Co., granite quarry operators.

His wife, the former Mary Brown, died three years ago. He has two daughters, Mrs. Nathaniel Mossman and Mrs. Everett McKinnon; three grandchildren and one great-grandchild all of Vinalhaven.

Mr. Ednie, a quiet, genial man, who rooms near the corner of Main and Park Streets, arises early each morning and consumes a hearty meal at Newbert's Restaurant.

We are notifying customers of a change to the chemical treatment that is currently used in the Water District's potable water system. Providing safe drinking water is a priority for Vinalhaven Water District.

We are investing in new corrosion control treatment for the Vinalhaven system using a zinc orthophosphate chemical which will help to improve water quality by controlling corrosion from certain metals and hardness that may be present in water. The State of Maine Center for Disease Control, Drinking Water Program has reviewed and approved this chemical change.

The new chemical addition is planned to begin on or before August 31, 2020. The Vinalhaven water system has a long history of successfully meeting the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements, but we are aware of concerns for corrosion of internal plumbing and rusty water in the distribution piping. We believe improving our corrosion control treatment will ensure compliance with future regulations and improve the quality of water that our customers receive.

Customers should not notice any immediate changes in the water service as the benefits of this change will appear over time. This notice is to inform users of the change in chemistry in the event your use of the water is sensitive to chemistry changes.

### The Porch

Perched on a precipice some 300 feet from sea level sat the deck of my childhood. Forget HD or 3D this was uncontaminated reality. From the porch our family had witnessed both laughter and tragedy, with nature being both magnificent and merciless. The structure started small in the early 70's and through my life grew and grew. It grew so big it became a multi-leveled wrap around porch. Bird houses, hummingbird feeders, flower pots, retractable awnings, barbecues, telescopes, tables and chairs, and a 50-foot handmade Flag pole adorned this ever-expanding structure. You could tell this was the heart of the home. From the magnificent warmth of sunrise to the waning of the afternoon sun this ever-altering view was impeccable. Even at night we watched the billions of twinkling stars and swatted at the same number of mosquitos. Sometimes the full moon looked so big and bright as to be unreal. If you had enough blood you could watch the heavens all night. From our vantage point hundreds of square miles of unspoiled Ocean, sprinkled with all shapes and sizes of islands lay at your feet. Always the same yet ever-changing. You watch the unsteady Maine weather rolling in and out like the tide. Occasionally you get lucky and witness one beam of sun pierce through the dark clouds and dance like a jewel on the sea. Even in the winter, graceful white plums of sea smoke rise from the ocean's surface in spirals as raw cold air passes over the warmer water.

Below us In Roberts Harbor, more than a few times we would awake to fishermen calling Dad to tell him "Franny, your boat sunk" As what was told to us children "wooden boats when first launched need time to swell up." The fact was Dad took his boat for a ride and never replaced the gravity drain plug in the transom was why she sunk overnight. This also happened to Uncle Paul's Boat, and one year he forgot to set the transom clamps on his engine, the next morning the engine was gone, it had slid off off the stern while moored in rough weather. This would be the second time a family captain had lost an engine. We witnessed countless yachts sailing the Penobscot and once we watched three long ships with beautifully colored Viking sails navigating in a straight line out to Brimstone. Looking at the Atlantic from the porch I can hear my Father chant his favorite weather mantra....  
Red sky in morning, sailors take warning  
Red sky at night, sailors delight.

Gulls and Ospreys and now even Bald Eagles ride the wind searching for their seafood dinner. It seems to me many young people are concerned with the quantity of life, I'm am satisfied with the quality, and on the porch, I'm content.

## Star of Hope Update





## **FOR HOUSEHOLDS GIVING OUT CANDY**

## ANY-ROOT VEGETABLE SOUP

*Adapted from Melissa's Clark's recipe for Root Vegetable Soup in the New York Times*

Yield 6 to 8 servings

### Ingredients

6 tablespoons unsalted butter  
1 large onion or 2 leeks (white and light green part only), chopped  
2 to 3 celery stalks, diced  
3 garlic cloves, finely chopped  
3 rosemary or thyme branches  
2 bay leaves  
3 1/2 pounds mixed root vegetables (such as carrot, parsnip, celery root, turnip, rutabaga, sweet or regular potato), peeled and cut into 1-inch chunks  
8 cups chicken or vegetable broth  
2 teaspoons fine sea salt, more as needed  
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, more as needed  
Juice of 1/2 lemon, and more for serving  
Extra-virgin olive oil  
Flaky sea salt

### Method

Melt butter in a large, heavy-bottomed pot.  
Stir in onion and celery.  
Cook, stirring occasionally, until vegetables are tender, about 10 minutes.  
Stir in garlic, rosemary and bay leaves; cook 1 minute more.  
Add root vegetables, 8 cups chicken broth, salt and pepper.  
Bring to a boil; reduce heat to medium and simmer, covered, until vegetables are tender, 30 to 40 minutes.

Remove and discard rosemary branches and bay leaves.  
Using an immersion blender, purée soup until smooth.  
(Alternatively, you can purée the soup in batches in a blender or food processor.)  
If the soup is too thick, add a little water.  
Season with lemon juice and more salt to taste.

To serve, ladle soup into bowls and top with a drizzle of olive oil, a few drops of lemon juice, flaky salt crushed chili pepper or grated cheese, if desired.

### Optional Garnish

1/2 tsp lemon zest  
c. 2 Tbsp lemon juice, to taste  
Dash of smoky chili powder  
Dash of coarse sea salt  
Drizzle of Olive Oil  
1+ Tbsp chopped toasted nuts (walnuts, pine nuts, sunflower seeds), for pleasant texture



### The Observer

Not everyone knew, all these many years, that my memory was as bad as it was. A few did. But it's clearly getting worse like when I came home the other night and found her cooking dinner I ... well, all I could think of was 'Nice to see you again, here for the summer?'
