A Message from MDOT Maine Local Roads Center (LTAP)

Temporary signs (including political) in the right of way: current law places a 12 week per calendar year restriction on the placement of temporary signs in a public right-of-way.

A recent change, effective June 17, 2020, further restricts the placement of these signs to no more than six weeks from Jan. 1 to June 30 and no more than six weeks from July 1 to Dec. 31. Similar signs cannot be placed within 30 feet of each other. All signs must include or be marked with the name and address of the individual or organization that placed the sign within the public right-of-way and the date the sign was erected.

MaineDOT may remove nonconforming signs on state or state aid highway (not inside a compact area) and towns/cities may remove nonconforming signs on a town way or a state or state aid highway in an urban compact municipality.

Request an Absentee Ballot

Registered Vinalhaven Voters may request absentee ballots any **ONE** of three ways:

- Use the Secretary of State's Online Absentee Ballot Request Portal. Go to apps.web.maine.gov/cgibin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index. pl The deadline to request ballots using this service is 5:00 pm on Thursday, October 29, 2020.
- Call the Town Office at (207) 863-4343 to request a ballot by phone. Please Note: the person requesting the ballot must speak with the Clerk. A person may not request a ballot for someone other than themselves.
- Print, fill out and mail (or put in our drop box) the request form available on the Town website. www.townofvinalhaven.org

Actual ballots will be mailed 30 days prior to the election.

You will need to fill out a Maine Voter Registration Card and provide a Maine Drivers License or Maine ID AND proof of Vinalhaven residence (if your VH address is not already on the license).

Vinalhaven Water District Notice:

Vinalhaven Water District is committed to providing high quality drinking water and remains dedicated to continually looking for ways to enhance your service. We are notifying customers of a change to the chemical treatment that is currently used in the Water District's potable water system.

Providing safe drinking water is a priority for Vinalhaven Water District.

We are investing in new corrosion control treatment for the Vinalhaven system using a zinc orthophosphate chemical which will help to improve water quality by controlling corrosion from certain metals and hardness that may be present in water. The State of Maine Center for Disease Control, Drinking Water Program has reviewed and approved this chemical change.

The new chemical addition is planned to begin on or before August 31, 2020. The Vinalhaven water system has a long history of successfully meeting the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements, but we are aware of concerns for corrosion of internal plumbing and rusty water in the distribution piping. We believe improving our corrosion control treatment will ensure compliance with future regulations and improve the quality of water that our customers receive.

Customers should not notice any immediate changes in the water service as the benefits of this change will appear over time. This notice is to inform users of the change in chemistry in the event your use of the water is sensitive to chemistry changes.





Picnic at Lanes

At least once every summer our Island family made a picnic pilgrimage to Lanes Island. This usually took place when the Families Island attendance was at its peak (sometime in August). All families happily attended and shared in preparing their favourite picnic comfort food. As seasoned summer ierks, we were aware of a few of the Islands twilight givens. When the sun went down and the breeze off the chilly Atlantic arrived it got cold! At dusk, the frigin vampire bugs would attack mercilessly draining all with red blood, and it would get - I can't find the path or dirt road, dark. I mean sometimes it was so dark vou couldn't see your hands in front of your face. So, the plan would be simple, start early and end early, and ward off these Island fundamentals as best one could.

Late afternoon an army of teens and below would hoof it out to Lanes. That would be the family's expeditionary force normally chaperoned by a parent. This group was needed to stake out a prime spot and find dry driftwood to build a fire. After that chore, the children were on their own to explore the tidal pools, driftwood laden beaches or pick black or blueberries. Then the onslaught of elder family members arrived with all the fixings. After enjoying the picnic and as the sun was saying "goodnight", we would all be drawn to Lane's highest elevation bluff. This setting gave access to a view of life's stunning connection to nature and the mighty Atlantic. This unsullied view of uncanny beauty affected the very young and reinforced in the old the Islands Isolation and how special it was. LEMON CURD

3-4 lemons (about 1 pound)
3/4 cup sugar
2 large eggs
1 stick unsalted butter, cut into four pieces

Finely grate enough zest from lemons to measure 2 teaspoons and squeeze enough juice to make 1/2 cup. Whisk together zest, juice, sugar and eggs in metal bowl and add butter. Set bowl over saucepan of simmering water and cook, whisking

until thickened (about five minutes). Force curd through a fine sieve into a bowl and cover with wax paper and cool completely. Makes about 1-3/4 cups.



The Observer

The Chickadees don't migrate far or much at all doubtless they have discerned there's no need since they are so well cared for right here. Perhaps because this species has been patronizing our feeders and this neighborhood for so long, the Chickadee is remarkably untroubled by my own presence while nonetheless finding the deep foliage of a vibrant lilac next to the feeder an irresistible refuge. One would think. given the repeated retreats to the security of those branches, that this bird is very insecure and cautious. In fact, the opposite is true. Walking up the steps from my driveway to my front door, a Chickadee in the nearby lilac, aware that the shortest distance between it and the feeder is a straight line, often finds my head an annoying obstacle. On the other hand they haven't hit me yet and I take that to indicate that they know, on some level, that I have something to do with the feeders being repeatedly replenished and so tolerate my otherwise annoying and impeding presence. pc

VEGGIE CORNER

APPLE CRISP WITH FIGS, CARDAMOM AND GINGER

Adapted from a recipe in Melissa Clark's "Cook This Now"

Ingredients

Apples, peeled, cored and cut into wedges
Dried figs—preferably Mission figs if you can find them

Brandy or cognac Ground cardamom Ground ginger Dark brown sugar Butter-1/2 stick or less 1/4 cup oatmeal 1/4 cup whole wheat flour



Directions

- Pre-heat the oven to 375 degrees. Cut hard bits off the dried figs. Cut each fig into 4 pieces. Warm a small amount of brandy or cognac in a saucepan. Do not let it boil. Remove from heat and add figs. Let figs soak for at least 15 minutes.
- Put apples in a bowl. Add sugar according to the tartness of the apples. Add figs and brandy or cognac and mix. Add cardamom and ginger to taste. Butter an ovenproof dish. Spread apple mixture in the dish.
- Make the topping. In a small bowl, combine butter, sugar to taste, oatmeal, whole wheat flour and a dash of cardamom and ginger.
 Mix with clean fingers until it resembles coarse sand. Sprinkle evenly on top of apple mixture.
- 4. Bake for 30 minutes or longer, until the apples are tender. Let rest some before serving, but try to serve it still warm, with sour cream or plain Greek yogurt on the side.
