

What are CRF Funds?

This year, all schools Maine in have received extra funds called Coronavirus Relief Funds (CRF). These funds come from the federal government. and through the state of Maine, are distributed to schools based upon student enrollment. Schools are required to use the funds to support instruction. safety. ventilation. transportation, or other elements impacted by the pandemic. Vinalhaven School. we've used these funds to make important upgrades to the facility, purchase instructional technology, and buy student supplies. Remember last Spring when staff drove their own vehicles all over the island to deliver meals and school materials? This year, we were able to use CRF funds to purchase a minivan for transportation needs. ΑII of the items mentioned above were purchased with CRF grant funds, not the local budget. Not only were the funds helpful this year, but they will also reduce specific budget needs in the upcoming years.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

POLICE COURT ETCHINGS

The police court was assembled Friday evening of last week, Justice Kittredge wielding the scepter over the case of a man by the name of Benjamin Moore docked on a charge of gluing his digits to sixty-five dollars belonging to Henry Harris. The two men were shipmates on board the fishing schooner Lottie Hopkins. Harris recently lost sixty-five dollars and did lots of charcoal advertising in different places but not sufficient to bring his money to him, so he in some way came in possession of a gold watch belonging to Moore, and would not return it but had Moore arrested charging him with weeding him (Harris) out of the \$65. The usual crowd assembled to witness the trial, but Harris did not put in an appearance and the case was off. Deputy Grey is still holding the watch belonging to Moore.

Vinalhaven Echo November 22, 1888

Pequot is advancing to the front. The new industry started there by Jeremiah Snow and his wife is meeting with encouraging success. The industry is that of making rubber coats and oil clothes. Mrs. Snow's father was a manufacturer of rubber goods, and the process was learned by her from him. We are informed by parties that have seen the work that it is first-class in every particular.

Vinalhaven Echo, April 4, 1888

Vinalhaven can boast of a great many smart old gentlemen, one of whom deserves special mention. Ezekial Ames, who is some over 80 years old, has just completed the job of shingling his house doing the entire work himself.

Veggie Corner

ROASTED **BUTTERNUT SQUASH AND RED ONIONS**

Adapted from "Jerusalem" by Yotam Ottolenghi and Sami Tamimi, reprinted in the NY Times

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup olive oil, plus more for pan
- 4 large red onions
- 4 lbs butternut squash chunks or wedges, unpeeled
- 1/3 cup pine nuts, shelled green pistachio nuts or slivered, blanched almonds
- 2 tbsps coarsely chopped Italian flat-leaf parsley, mint, cilantro or a combination for garnish Salt and pepper

For the tahini sauce

1/4 cup tahini (sesame) paste 2 tbsps lemon juice 1 small clove garlic, crushed

Directions

- Heat oven to 475 degrees. Lightly coat two large rimmed baking sheets with olive oil.
- Peel onions, leaving root ends intact. Cut each onion in half from stem to root. Cut each half into 4 wedges, leaving the root intact so that each wedge holds together. Spread on a baking sheet, sprinkle with salt and pepper and drizzle with oil.
- Put the squash in a large mixing bowl. Add 1/4 cup olive oil, 1 tsp salt and about 1/4 tsp pepper; toss to coat. Spread on a baking sheet.
- Place both pans in the oven and roast for 30 to 40 minutes, until the vegetables have taken on some color and are cooked through. The onions may cook faster than the squash and may have to be removed earlier.
- Heat 1 tbsp oil in a small drying pan and place over medium-low heat. Add nuts and 1/2 tsp salt and cook 2 minutes, stirring often, until they nuts are golden brown. Remove nuts immediately from the heat and place on a cutting board to stop the cooking. Chop pistachios or almonds (if using) roughly—leave pine nuts (if using) whole.
- 6. Place tahini in a small bowl. Add lemon juice, 1/4 cup water, garlic and 1/4 tsp salt. Whisk until sauce is the consistency of honey
- Combine vegetables on a large serving platter. Drizzle tahini sauce on top. Sprinkle with herbs and top with nuts.




