



Know the Risk. Act Wisely.

Lower Risk

Staying home; traveling only if it's essential Restricting close contact (15+ minutes) to only those from your household or pod* Wearing a mask in public Washing your hands often Cleaning and disinfecting surfaces Celebrating outdoors where there is plenty of ventilation

Higher Risk

Traveling off and to the island
(Note: testing and quarantine are required when traveling to and from any state other than NH or VT)
Being in close contact with those not in your household or pod

Celebrating indoors with limited ventilation

Winter Solstice



If she goes right back to the money and success theme, hear her out and accept the fact that your friend Abbie has moved on and is content to have a more superficial relationship with you. You can decide if you want it that way. Maybe she is just not available for a deeper connection or more meaningful conversation. Sometimes even long standing relationships wither and they surely do, when intimacy and mutuality are absent.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

It is rumored that a few courses of the Harlem Bridge will be cut of Dushane Hill and Diamond Rock Granite, the cutting to be done at the quarries mentioned. The Harlem River Bridge parties are so favorably impressed with the B. G. Co.'s granite, its cutting and their superior knowledge of the business, that it has been left to their judgement to select a certain portion of the bridge trimmings, and no doubt the two quarries mentioned will be their choice as the stock very closely resembles each other.

Vinalhaven Echo December 1, 1887

Efforts to raise the 42-foot power-driven fishing smack Adeliade, which foundered on Heron Neck Ledge Saturday have been temporarily abandoned because of rough water. The boat, which had returned from fishing off Matinicus Island, ran on the rocks when the steering gear broke. Owner Birger Magnuson, and his crew, Fred Healey and Leslie Thomas, all of Vinalhaven rowed to safety. A year ago, Magnuson's son Carl was washed overboard from the ill-fated Adelaide near Seal Island and drowned.

But the peace Christmas came sooner than was expected and today the fighting has ceased and the world is only awaiting a peace conference to officially end the great world war.


