

FIDO CAN RELAX – DOG LICENSING DEADLINE EXTENDED

Governor Janet Mills signed Executive Order 29 FY 20/21, allowing dog owners extra time to license their animals. Owners now have until June 2, 2021 to renew overdue dog licenses. Fees: \$6 for spayed and neutered dogs and \$11 for unaltered. If not already on file at the Town Office, proof of current rabies vaccination must be provided at time of registration.

REPORT ALL LOOSE DOGS TO THE ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER

There have been several loose dog incidents recently where dogs have caused harm to pets and livestock on other people's property. DOG OWNERS – the Town follows the State's Leash Law: It is unlawful for any dog to run at large except when it is used for hunting. *At large means off the premises of the owner and not under the control of any person

Preserve Hikes

Hiking is one of the activities we can do safely together with friends. Dress warmly, in layers that can be removed as needed, stay hydrated, remember the limited daylight, and enjoy! For a list of all Vinalhaven trails:

Watershed Preserve

This 1.5 mile trail has a short out-and-back section followed by a loop through four different habitats. You will find forested wetlands and a pitch pine woodland with giant bonsai-type trees on top of a granite mound, which are rare for this forest type. From the ferry terminal, go left on Sands Rd. for 0.4 miles, then right on Old Harbor Rd. for 0.3 miles, then bear left onto North Haven Rd. for 2 miles. The gravel road to Folly Pond will be on your left; the parking lot is 0.3 miles in at the end of this road. For more information and a map:

In 2014, FEMA revised their flood maps, resulting in a redesignation of flood zones for many Vinalhaven properties and a subsequent increase in flood insurance rates. Ransom has provided the Town with a proposal to conduct a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) for various locations around the island. The Town invites property owners and community members to attend this event and learn more about the LOMR process and associated costs.

Vinalhaven School Mounts Public Art Show at Star of Hope

"It's always fun to share what goes on in here. It's always fun to highlight students' creations," says Vinalhaven School Art teacher Heather White.

Due to the pandemic, a lot of school activities or "traditions" aren't going as planned this year. The annual art show usually takes place in the school, and anyone in the community can come look at students' artwork.

This year however, the is no plan for an art show because of social distancing rules. So instead, student artwork from Vinalhaven School will be displayed at the Star of Hope building on Main Street.

"The Star of Hope reached out and offered their window space," said White. "Wasn't something I was seeking, it just came to me."

"I think this will be better because people driving by or people who usually wouldn't come to the art show will get to see it," said Junior, Noah Yeaton "Everyone drives through town so pretty much everyone will get to see it," Yeaton thinks people in the community will enjoy kids' artwork being presented.

This idea has been in planning since September/ October.

"Building projects are complicated so we've just been waiting for there to be space," said White.

There will be two exhibits of students' artwork, and both exhibits will be on display for about two months each, the first from February to March, and the second April to May. Selected students from the two high school art classes will help hang up the art.

White says students helping is good because it gets students involved and be able to look around and see the Star of Hope building.

"I could do it myself but I just think seeing the whole process is important and I wouldn't want to hog it up for myself," she said.

Before being displayed in the Star of Hope building, the artwork display was set up in the school hallway to organize and plan the arrangement.

"A lot of decisions have to be made," said White. "Have to make sure it visually looks good, and I didn't think there would be enough time to do it the day of the hanging."

The display contains artwork from students of all ages from grades K through 12. The artwork that won't be shown during the first exhibit will be on display during the next. Students who aren't participating in hanging the work this time, will help set up the next exhibit.

"If some art isn't in the February through March show, it will be in the April through May show, so looking forward to that!" says White. "I'm really proud of all the student artwork! I never know what kids are going to make so it's fun to let everyone see... The reaction has been overwhelmingly positive!"

"It's exciting," said Yeaton. "I think the parents and teachers are gonna like it, it's a neat idea."

There, There

After reading my grandfather's memoirs I realized that some traits do not fall far from the tree. Grandfather fell in love with his first wife at first sight. She was Protestant, he Catholic, in 1900 that didn't happen, her parents disowned her for marrying, never to see her again. In Grandpa's words, her parents said "Being Catholic was for Maids and Carriage men." But they were married. She died giving birth to his second child. His first child my aunt Virginia at the age of 17 gave her life to God and became a nun. She passed away at 99. Grandfather wrote after he remarried and 11 more children that since the death of his first wife he had lost the "spark of happiness, the joy that life holds." He turned inward, focused on career and attaining notoriety.

There, There.

The first time I read those words I was reading Joseph Hellers <u>Catch 22</u>. Yossarian, the main character, of the book was an Army Bombardier on a bombing raid. His plane had been shoot up pretty good and he went to check on his tail gunner a 17-year-old kid. The gunner was wounded lying on the floor. The boy was saying softly "I'm cold, I'm cold." So Yossarian pulled a parachute out of its pack and draped it over the young man's body. The white silk turned dark red immediately. Yossarian pulled the covering back to find that the boy had been flayed open. Knowing the outcome he took the boy's hand and with gritted teeth screamed, "There, There, Son, There There." That was all he could do.

I'm standing in my grandmothers Doorway. Nan is laying in bed, close to the end of her 80+ years. A thin wafer of what was once a strong woman slept motionlessly. I focused on her, what seemed like minutes to make sure she was breathing, the slight rise of the sheets told me she was still with us. I sat beside her and took her hand into mine. She opened her eyes and stared into mine. Her pained drawn face tried to smile, a moan pursed from her, she did not look away. Stroking her hand I said to her "There There, Nan, There There." There was nothing to be done.

Twenty years later I'm with my mother on the Island, she had a list of Medical problems that were peaking. We had learned earlier that the lump on her lung was not malignant but she had to have it removed by a specialist in Boston. The phone rang, it was the Dr. that made the earlier diagnosis. Happily, Mom start-



ed speaking to the Doctor. Then she was quiet, tears swelled in her eyes as she dropped the phone. Then came these words "I don't want to die, I don't want to die." I knew at once what it all meant. I was physically frozen, I couldn't speak, nothing would come out, so I stood up and went to her, I went to her and hugged her, I held her as tight as she would let me and said. "There There Mom, There There."

There were no more words.

There was an ending of "Sometimes Memories just flood in" that I wrote. It was painful for me to write cause I had the feeling of so much guilt, but I need to finish it. Oh how history repeats itself. Eight weeks later I'm standing at my Mothers door staring at a thin wafer of what was once a strong woman. Her thin frail body fighting for every breath, tears streaming. Mom was a proud woman who hated pain. As I sat beside her I took her hand. Her eyes opened and stared into mine. Fear and agony shouted from them, "Let - Me - Go! ...Pleaseeeee....!" and I knewand I knew, and It was over.

There There Mom, There There.


Did you know our first DEAR-VH (Drop Everything And Read) week was a big success? Once again, we invite <u>you</u> and the community to join us during reading time each Wednesday and Friday. And over the weekend, read to yourself, read to a student, listen to a student read, or just encourage kids around you to pick up a book. It makes a difference.

Did you know that this year grades K-6 have utilized the Pathblazer computer program to help enhance learning? It teaches students at their academic level through a variety of interactive activities, lessons, and quizzes. In November, grades 2-5 were challenged to complete 800 activities/quizzes as a group, and they succeeded. A student earns a sea creature every time they complete 5 activities/quizzes at 80% accuracy and then they throw their "sea creature" into a Net of Success. The Net of Success challenge is back again in February as the 2nd - 5th graders are now being challenged to complete 1,000 activities. Good luck 2-5!

Did you know, beginning Tuesday, February 16, over a dozen staff members will add or shift some of their responsibilities to help meet the needs of Vinalhaven students? COVID-19 Vaccine Update

Due to the limits on vaccine supply, Maine is using a phased but flexible approach to ensure every dose the state receives is used to protect the health of Maine people. Vaccines are available only to Maine residents at this time. Patients of record, those we've seen regularly in the past two years, who are 70 and older are prioritized. The number of vaccines we are allotted is based on the number of patients we've seen regularly. We ask those that aren't patients of record to talk to your primary care provider for vaccination. If you would like to see if you are a patient of record, please contact, Anna Clapham 863-4341 ex. 1126 or email aclapham@icmsvh.org.

- We are currently in Phase 1b-1. Only older Mainers, those 70 and older, qualify for the vaccination in this phase. As soon as the state expands distribution to those under 70, we will update you. By law, we can only give the vaccine to those 70 and older at this time. The only exception is if a 70 or older is unable to make the appointment. In that case, we can offer the slot to adults of all ages with high-risk medical conditions. We use a risk stratification process to select these alternates by age and number and severity of health conditions. We will notify you directly when you are eligible for the vaccine based on the state's guidelines.
- The next Phase is 1b-2. This phase will include people ages 65-69 and critical frontline workers to be determined by the State of Maine.

Our shared goal is to get everyone vaccinated. This will likely take several months. We are working very hard to place special focus on getting vaccines to patients who are the most vulnerable to the virus. The state will be working in stages so that one group may not be fully vaccinated before they move forward with the next approved groups. Vaccines will also be available through city and town clinics, pharmacies and state vaccination sites. We will continue to provide updated information to you about all of your vaccination options through social media and our website.

We appreciate your patience as we work hard to get the vaccine to as many of our patients as we can, as quickly as possible. But I Was Just Being Honest!

How to talk responsibly to someone you love.

Words in relationships

are also very powerful,

with equal potential

for helping

or harming those

we care most about.

How many times have you had your feelings hurt by people speaking to you in the name of "telling the truth." Comments such as "I think you've put on a little bit of weight" or "you're so controlling" or "you care more about your work than you do me," or other hurtful and insensitive comments have all been made in the name of "telling the truth."

In this country, we place such a strong, sometimes overriding, value on free speech, that we may uphold an individual's right to say whatever she or he wants, even when it is clearly harmful, or even intended to be harmful to the larger community. While we can debate the pros and cons of this approach as

national policy, there is no doubt that the same approach does not work well at all in any kind of relationship. Words are very powerful. Words in relationships are also very powerful, with equal potential for helping or harming those we care most about. Couples clearly understand the power of words in their relationships, because when they decide to seek help from a therapist they usually describe their problem as "communication problems."

In relationships it is far more helpful to aspire to the value of "relationally responsible speech." Speech that is relationally responsible is speech that takes responsibility for the impact of your words on the person you are talking to. When someone protests that they are "just telling the truth," they are defending their intent as benign or even helpful, and are indignant at being held accountable for the impact of their words, even if that impact could reasonably have been anticipated.

They are being insensitive, in the true meaning of the word, which is to "show no feelings or concerns for another's feelings."

Relationally responsible speech means the speaker considers what the impact of his or her words is likely to be, and then takes responsibility for the impact of those words, even if the impact is different from what she or he intended.

Returning to our earlier examples, the people speaking defend their speech by claiming a higher priority on "the truth" than the feelings of the people they are talking to. The problem with this argument is that they are not, in fact, telling the truth. It's not

that they are inaccurate, or mistaken, or even dishonest. They are not telling the truth because it's not possible to speak about someone else's truth, only your own. What they are doing is simply speaking aloud some of the critical judgments they hold about the person they are speaking to. The only real truth we can tell is the truth about our own experience.

Let's take the example of one person accusing another of being "so controlling." It may or may not be

true that the accused person is controlling—that's not for the accuser to say. The only truth that the accuser can talk about with complete authority is the truth of his or her own experience, such as "when you talk to me the way you are now, it makes me feel bad, like there's no room for me in this conversation."

In the second example in which one person accuses another of "caring more about your work than me,"

again, the accuser can't possibly know the internal state of the accused. What the accuser can know with certainty is how this behavior makes him or her feel, as in "when you come home this late I start to feel very lonely, and it's hard for me to hold onto knowing that you care about me."

People sometimes add the phrase "I feel that" to the beginning of a sentence to disguise their critical intent and make it


sound like they are talking about the truth of their own experience. However, "I feel like you care more about work than you do about me" is just the wolf of a judgment disguised in the sheep's clothing of a feeling word.

An interesting example of how complex these matters can be is when one person in a relationship has an affair. If the affair has truly ended, and the offending partner emerges from the affair clearer than ever about his commitment to his marriage, should he tell his wife about the affair just because that is the truth? Should he consider whether it would be better for their marriage to tell the truth or keep it to himself? If he decides it would be better for the marriage not to tell his wife, can the two of them truly have an intimate relationship with one of them holding such a secret?

The counter-argument is often made that restricting

the way one talks is not natural, not spontaneous, and that intimacy requires people to talk openly and spontaneously with each other. It is true that to consider the impact of one's words before speaking is less spontaneous and less natural. So is not quitting your job when you have a bad day, or not hitting your children when you're angry at them, or not eating all the ice cream when you open the pint.





It's never too early to discuss next spring for Ticks, Browntail Moths, and Ants.


