Vinalhaven School News, by Superintendent/Principal Tonya Arnold



Oh my, how the world has changed. The silver-lining to any crisis is that Mainers are innovative, creative, independent, strong survivors. This is when we shine, and that is especially true for Vinalhaven.

Our staff deserve great praise! Absolutely amazing teamwork in the past three days brought our school community from the uncertainty of Friday evening to clear plans to support student learning, social emotional connections, and a system to check on family needs in a whole new world.

This week families and staff connect. Moving from the world of learning we knew last week, to remote learning and virtual daily communications. The work included consideration for some routine to support student and parents, but honor flexibility necessary for parents with double duty.



With materials delivered to homes and every staff member trained to conduct live face-to-face conversations using zoom, I can't



wait to share with you some of the exciting and innovative ways staff are planning to engage students, from dance class to publishing writing, read aloud groups and the many well rehearsed ways that students and staff were already using google classroom.

Facilities: We recognize what a positive role the school facility has played in helping community members of all ages socialize and exercise. It was a very difficult decision to close down due to sanitation needs to prevent the spread of illness and do our part to ensure the public gathering limit of less than 10 is honored.

Closing the school will not have been worth the effort IF families were to choose to travel while school is closed or IF groups of children and/or adults continue to gather. The immediate purpose is to slow the spread of illness, especially COVID19, to relieve the demands on our health care system by "flattening the curve" of new cases. While research is not yet certain, some evolving medical studies predict that carriers without symptoms could be shedding the virus in a way that may affect elderly and those with underlying conditions.

Childcare needs and socialization must be navigated in a way that reduces risk, but still allows our economy to carry on and be emotionally supported. Please think creatively with other families with whom you are connected to support one another. The CDC is recommending not using public playgrounds as the virus can live on the equipment for 48 hrs. Thank you to those who are reaching out to help or volunteer to clean the playground for example. We are making a list and will be connecting people to tasks through the Town's new Volunteer Coordinator position. Once we get a routine established, someone will reach out in ways help can be used and shared in support of our families.

Board Meetings: Based on the public gathering limits, we will be finding a virtual tool to share the next budget workshop on Wed 3/25/20 at 6:00 pm. The Board and I thank you all for your support.

ICMS MEMO

March 18, 2020

To the Community of Vinalhaven,

The situation with Covid-19 is rapidly changing. ICMS is working with local emergency services and reviewing guidance from the Maine CDC and federal guidelines.

Some things to note:

The most important thing to do is to wash your hands frequently with soap and water for at least 20 seconds and stay home if you are sick. Try not to touch your face. Please practice social distancing and take advantage of the delivery services offered.

- 1. Per CDC guidelines as of March 15th this week, the Medical Center is cancelling all behavioral health, physical therapy and dental visits in person. You will be hearing from our staff. We are working on setting up telehealth for behavioral health visits and will put out more information as it is available.
- 2. If you are sick, please call the office at 207-863-4341 and you will be triaged by the nurse or medical provider. Please do not use social media or text the providers.
- 3. Patients are being screened by the nurse or medical provider when they call for testing for the coronavirus. If you are going to be tested, it will likely be in your vehicle outside. We are working to reduce exposure.
- 4. If you are tested for coronavirus, you will be asked to self quarantine for at least 14 days. That means staying home and not interacting with others outside from your household. You can go for a ride or a walk with members of your household but please do not interact with others. This will limit the spread of the virus to others and help keep our community safe. No trips to the grocery store, Fisherman's Friend, or anywhere else.

- 5. For those patients who need INR or injections, we are scheduling those visits for 9:00 to 10:00 am on Wednesday mornings. To limit exposure, we will ask you to call before you arrive and the staff will come out to the car.
- 6. If you need groceries or other supplies, ICMS is paying the delivery fee. Please call Vinalhaven Taxi at 207-720-0056 to schedule a delivery. You must prepay for your supplies.
- 7. If you would like someone to call you to check on you, please let us know.

no bags/pail liners, no cups, no cutlery

remove produce stickers

How VH Community Compost Works

- 1. Collect food scraps at home and at work
- 2. Dump food scraps into the collection bin at the Transfer Station
- 3. We mix all the food scraps into an active manure pile
- 4. The pile cures until it becomes nutrient-rich compost
- 5. Our community uses the compost to enrich garden soils



My blood carries memories of generations of survivors I am the reflex action that protects and distracts a mind that doesn't have the time that money buys, I am the driven one with the impoverished spirit like a curse in the blood I own all the machines that erase the drudgery, I have the computer, the fax the cell-phone to communicate my all-important messages at the speed of an old one downing a pint

I use my head instead of my hands and wonder if that machine is holding up for I worry as much as ever my mother did or hers or hers before her I have come so far in the wrong direction, still fight the system, fly to far away places to free myself for time to think as if that would cure this dis-ease of being trapped in a body of need

My fears and longing lie hidden in the wind I would snatch them from its power tie them down and face them, perhaps find that all I really am is the in and out of my own breathing the simple tucking and patting of wool around bodies I love

Ah, and if I'm lucky at all
I shall see the humor
release the pain
kiss my lover and hug me
husband, let my grown children
support me so I can return to
Ireland to taste the malt
and burn the bog again.
