

## Jean Ward's Chinese Chicken Wings

Discard the tips of the wings and split each remaining wing in half.

Marinate overnight 12 to 15 wings in:

- 3 tablespoons soy sauce
- 3 tablespoons vinegar
- 3 tablespoons beer or 7-up
- 1 tablespoon sugar
- 2 crushed garlic cloves
- 2 teaspoons black pepper
- Dash of Tabasco

Bake in a single layer in 350-degree oven including all marinade. They should be cooked until well browned, probably 1½ hours.

The 2021 Broadband Survey is a fast and easy way for you to let the Fox Islands Broadband Task Force know if you would like the Town to build and operate a municipally-owned high-speed internet network.

The Survey will arrive in the mail this week or next and will also be available online through mid to late April.

Based on the results of this survey, the Select Board and Task Force will determine if and how to move forward with this project. Keep in mind that your survey response is not a conclusive yes or no vote for or against this project.

# What is Municipally-Owned Broadband?

Broadband refers to high-speed Internet. Municipally-owned broadband is publicly-owned and controlled internet infrastructure (cables, connections, equipment, etc.) and service.

Many communities with municipal broadband hire an Internet Service Provider (ISP) to manage providing internet service to the community. A contract between the ISP and the Town spells out the rates, levels of service, and other important criteria that have been defined by the community and agreed upon by the ISP.

Under municipal ownership, communities are not beholden to incumbent ISPs. The town hires an ISP that best aligns with the community's goals and may fire the ISP if they fail to meet those goals as defined in their contract. Most communities that invest tax and grant dollars into building municipal broadband, opt to use the best technology (fiber optics) and provide the fastest speeds.






#### The Observer

I was a lost cause in high school. I paid no attention to anything with one intriguing exception. My English teacher was a singularly intimidating and frightful old woman named Gwendoline Greene. One of her eyes wandered endlessly afield of whatever the other, her good and functioning eye, was focused on. She was the brunt of, but oblivious to, cruel jokes, mostly from my fellow male students. Her only interest, though, was in teaching to the one or two kids in the class who were worthy. That one of those people was yours truly was certainly not apparent to me or anyone else but how else to account for the fixation on grammar and expression that emerged decades later. I wonder if she knew that I would one day awaken. Early on, in one of the singular moments of clarity during those twelve years of education I was convincingly admonished never to start a sentence with 'but' or with 'and'. It's done all the time. by even the most acknowledged writers, but I still can't clear that hurdle. I credit Miss Greene, who delivered that admonition so credibly that now, fifty years later, I cannot bring myself to begin a sentence thus.
