### BOAT REGISTRATION NOTICE

In March, Governor Janet Mills directed Maine Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife Commissioner Judy Camuso to allow boaters to operate without a current 2020 registration and Lake and River Protection sticker until April 30, 2020. Boat registrations normally expire at the end of each calendar year.

**This notice is a reminder that as of May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020, all motorized watercraft on Maine waters must have a valid registration. In addition, all motorized watercraft on inland waters must display the lake and river protection sticker.**

**The 20-21 School Budget Approved:** At the April 29<sup>th</sup> regular School Board meeting there was a vote to approve next year's school budget:

\$397,377.03 a 9.12% increase - See details published in the last issue of the WIND.

- 100,000.00 - a 2.29% carry forward offset bringing us down to 6.82% increase [anticipated]

- 141,655.06 - a 3.25% increase in DOE funding [estimated]

\$155,721.97 3.57% net increase impacting taxpayers

A full newsletter and a brochure will be created to allow various formats for the town to review the budget details.

**Widow Island Fund:** The WIF Award Committee has decided to wait until after the Budget Validation Referendum to meet regarding awards in case their offer to use WIF funds to offset the budget increase for 20-21 is needed. In April, the school budget was approved by the school board without a WIF grant offset. School staff and the Board wish to preserve the opportunity for increased physical and creative outlets for students through WIF once community restrictions relax. Applications for 20-21 projects will continue to be collected by Bryan Feezor until the school budget passes without WIF funds.

Vinalhaven Wastewater District would like you to help keep our wastewater system working properly and avoid unnecessary service interruptions. With the recent events surrounding the COVID-19 pandemic, we are seeing a number of changes in our daily lives and it's becoming more important that we make sound decisions to prevent further issues. We have seen an increased number of sewer backups in the last month. As a quick reminder keep the following in mind – these easy steps will help protect and keep the system operating properly:

**FLUSH IT: URINE, FECES AND TOILET PAPER.** These are the **ONLY** things to flush down toilets. Toilet paper breaks down in water, other products do not.

**TRASH IT:** Everything else including paper towels, napkins, disposable wet wipes, cleaning or baby wipes – even if marked “flushable”, cotton puffs/swabs – must be disposed of as trash and **NOT** flushed down toilets.



### **Water District Flushing Notice**

The Vinalhaven Water Division of Maine Water will be flushing the water mains beginning 4/27/20. Due to the flushing you may experience changes in your tap water such as discoloration or low water pressure. You may want to check the water quality before washing your laundry. These flushing activities are a vital part of our maintenance program that enables us to supply high quality water service. We apologize for any inconvenience this might cause you. ## Robert Andrew Clapham - Marine

Robert Andrew Clapham "Andy" of Indian Land, SC, formerly of Simsbury, CT, Atlanta, GA, and Beaufort, SC, died at home on Monday, May 4, 2020 at the age of 82. Andy, son of the late Charles Hesser Clapham II and Mary Nimblett Clapham, was born in Fairmont, WV and grew up in Dobbs Ferry, NY and spent summers in Vinalhaven, ME during his life.

Andy had an engaging, friendly spirit, reaching out to anyone he came in contact with. Andy's devotion to his family and God permeated his life and faith.

Andy earned a Bachelor of Arts in Economics from Pomona College in Claremont, CA. Andy began his career as a salesman for IBM and spent the first part of his career in computer sales. He then worked for Northern Telecom and finally GE. Andy was an active member of St. Albans Episcopal Church in Simsbury, CT, St. Phillips Episcopal Church in Atlanta, GA, St. Helena's Episcopal Church in Beaufort, SC, and St. Margaret's Episcopal Church, in Waxhaw, NC.

In addition to his parents, Andy was predeceased by his sister, Patty and his brother, Jonathan.

He is survived by his life-long sweetheart and wife of 59 years (whom he met on the playground while in elementary school in Dobbs Ferry, NY), Nancy Lloyd d'Avi Clapham; their 4 children: Susie Clapham Morrison and her husband, Jim and grandchildren, Hank, Sam, Tessie & Thomas; Dr. Lizzie Nimblett Clapham; Andrew Hesser Clapham and his wife, Erin and grandchildren, Ryan and Emma; and Christy Clapham Albertson and her husband, Bill and grandchildren, Billy and Tommy. Andy adored his wife and cherished each of his children and grandchildren. When they would leave to return home, he would say "I hate when they leave." Andy is also survived by his brother, Chuck and his wife, Connie; and his brother, Richard and his wife, Anne.

## Ocean View

The last two weeks have been very exciting. Several days early in the morning we've had a female merganser. She swims around and every so often she flies up to the hole in the duck houses and then goes in the water again. There are ducks in the two houses and don't know why she does it. The female wood ducks come out early morning and late afternoon. They and their mates fly off and after a while they're back. They swim for a while and then the females just fly right into the house. Sometimes they don't stop in the water and just go right into the house. Such a surprise to be watching and see it.

We had a black duck this a.m. It's the first time this year we've seen one. They are so shy and there is much more traffic than there was years ago. On May 27, 1973 when I was trying to have my second child we went out to go on a walk and the mother black duck was waddling up the road with all her tiny babies. It was so cute.

There have been three eagles visiting. One adult was seen sitting in a tree, diving down to the water and then going back in the tree. Hope he wasn't eating ducks! The other night there were an adult eagle and an immature. Many times in the summer they come for a drink of water.

On May 1 I saw a mother mallard and maybe ten babies. I saw her twice that day, but I think she took the babies down the brook. Once they're gone they don't come back and I know the gulls are just waiting for a meal. We have a pair of mallards that come for corn. I wonder if she had the babies I saw and is going to have another clutch. This is the earliest I've seen babies and we usually have two, sometimes three different families. Last year I fed two families most of the summer.

I've had as many as eight male wood ducks at a time and there is a beautiful picture of some of them on facebook. When the sun shines on them they are the most beautiful ducks we have.

Chicks, nuts, cardinals, blue jays, black birds, juncos, gold and purple finches, brown creepers, robins, flickers, and myrtle warblers. So strange, the myrtles have been on the suet. Never saw that before. Also a kingfisher and blue herons. No hummers on my feeder yet, but they should be here any day. CD

## OBITUARY

### Andrew Clapham

Robert Andrew (Andy) Clapham has left our family here on earth to be with all the Clapham's and Nimblett's in Heaven. Born on St. Patrick's Day in 1938 in Fairmont, West Virginia and raised by every Nimblett including our grandmother Mac, Julia McGillicuddy Nimblett, also born on St. Patrick's Day. He was the son of Mary and Hesser Clapham. He leaves behind his wife Nancy of 59 years, his four children: Lizzie, Susie, Christy & Andrew and his beloved eight grandchildren. He was the quintessential family man.

He was also the proverbial "Big Brother", who would return home from either college, the Marines or Calif., where he was with the love of his life, Nancy D'Avi Clapham. On his short stays back home, he would help his "little" brother learn how to bike without training wheels (he pushed me down Saranac street in Dobbs Ferry, New York, I could not see the end of this street nor the tree I hit halfway down). He taught me how to swim at our back shore on Vinalhaven by dropping me in the ocean. He introduced me to the fine art of sledding down the tallest, steepest hill in Berwick, Pennsylvania with me on the front of my Flexible Flyer and again, we hit a tree.

My revenge for all his acts of terrorism occurred when he returned from California with the second love of his life, a Vespa motor scooter. He stored it carefully in the back of our father's garage and told me "don't even think about it." As dad was driving him to the bus, a friend arrived and without a key, he started it. Off we went, with me on the back, up and down dirt roads and into farm fields, again and again. The only thing good about me getting shipped off to boarding school was that I missed his eruption upon his return from California and finding the condition of his beloved Vespa had deteriorated.

Brother Richard and I are all that is left of our original Clapham family here on earth.

Andy has been reunited with his family in heaven and he can now tell my son Patrick, all the stories that are not fit to print. cc

### Reading Online Wind on a Kindle

Norbert Leser shared his steps for converting the online Wind into a more easily readable version on a Kindle.

1. Download the wind to your computer/device
2. Create an email message addressed to your Kindle account
3. Subject of the email is the word "Convert"
4. Attach the wind PDF to the email body (no other text)
5. Send email
6. After a short while open your Kindle app and synchronize - the Wind should appear in your library!

To find the Kindle email account mentioned above, you need to open the Kindle app and go to 'App Settings' in your menu at Kindle's home page. It lists 'Send to Kindle Email Address' - copy/paste that address and you're all set.

## Announcement by the Maine State Ferry Service:

The current Standby System at the Vinalhaven Ferry Terminal will no longer be in effect as of Monday, June 1, 2020.

From that date forward, the Vinalhaven Terminal will operate the same as other MSFS terminals for standby status:

Vehicles may line up 1 hour before the first departure of the day, and for all other departures, vehicles may line up once the previous boat has departed.

When vehicles get in line, they must plan to depart on the next boat.

Vehicles will be directed to board the ferry on a first come, first serve basis.

Standby numbers attached to Line Numbers are also no longer in effect from June 1, 2020.

The First Come, First Serve Standby starting point will remain the same, and will continue down to the end of the guardrail/entrance of the upper parking lot.

The beginning and end of the standby line will be clearly marked, and all vehicles lined up must fit completely within the lines.


