## Outreach Patient Navigator 32-40 hours/week

Revised Job Posting

ICMS is looking for an inventive, creative and innovative employee who looks for unique ways to improve the overall health of our patients.

This position will work with patients, healthcare providers, and community resources to remove challenges of obtaining cancer screenings and referral coordination. The Navigator will work with patients to identify resources that would remove any barriers to care, such as identifying financial assistance programs, transportation, and social support.

This position is a telecommuting position that will not require onsite work.

**Medical Assistant** Thursdays & Fridays, 12 hours per wk Join our team 2 days each week in the Medical Center and provide clinical support for medical practitioners, triage patient calls, and follow up with tests results. Manage patient records and act as a liaison between patient, hospital, and other providers. May perform phlebotomy work and injections.

## Patient Services Rep Fridays and Per Diem

The first person patients meet when they call and visit the Medical Center, you'll schedule appointments; verify patient information; inform them of preparations for appointments/tests and costs; and collect fees. Input data and balance financials.

For these positions, experience in a medical setting preferred. We need great team players with excellent patient service skills who will protect patient information. Computer skills and excellent communication skills needed. On-the-job training provided.



The CDC has issued new protocols for outside visits at The Homestead.

Outdoor Visitation: Facilities may allow in-person visitation in a designated outdoor visitation space, provided the facility implements all of the following safety, care, and infection prevention and control measures. There must be no new COVID-19 cases that originated within the facility, including those involving residents or staff, within the last 14 days

## Measures: • Visits Specifics:

- o Must take place in a designated outdoor space and are dependent upon permissible weather conditions, availability of outdoor space, and sufficient staffing at the facility to meet resident care needs, and the health and wellbeing of the resident.
- o Visitations must be scheduled in advance for all designated outdoor spaces
- o Facilities may limit the length of any visit, the days on which visits will be permitted, the hours during a day when visits will be permitted, and the number of times during a day or week a resident may be visited.
- o No meals/snacks are permitted during the visit as this would require the removal of the face mask/face covering.
- o Facilities will post signage or provide a handout for visitors on signs and symptoms associated with COVID-19.
- o Prior to the visit the facility will provide the visitor instructions and requirements for visitation and where to go upon arrival.
- o 6 feet of physical distance must be maintained during the visit.
- o Residents must wear a cloth face covering. Visitors must wear a face covering or mask for the duration of the visit.

Visitors: o Visitors must be limited to no more than two individuals per visit

- o The facility must screen the visitor for fever or respiratory symptoms. Any individuals with symptoms of COVID-19 infection1 will not be permitted to visit.
- o Hand hygiene will be performed before and after the visit.
- o All visitors must remain at least 6 feet from the resident and any attending staff member(s) at all times during the visit.
- o Children must be supervised at all times, maintain social distancing, and wear a face covering when age appropriate
- . Staff: o A staff member(s) trained in patient safety and infection prevention and control measures must be present to monitor the outdoor designated space(s).
- o Monitoring of visitation is required. Facility should assess the number of staff necessary to ensure appropriate masking and social distancing are followed.
- o Staff must wear a surgical face mask.

# **Reading Online Wind**

Norbert Leser shared his steps for converting the online Wind into a more easily readable version on a Kindle.

- Download the wind to your computer/device
- 2. Create an email message addressed to your Kindle account
- 3. Subject of the email is the word "Convert"
- 4. Attach the wind PDF to the email. body (no other text)
- Send email
- 6. After a short while open your Kindle app and synchronize - the Wind should appear in your library!

To find the Kindle email account mentioned above, you need to open the Kindle app and go to 'App Settings' in your menu at Kindle's home page. It lists 'Send to Kindle Email Address' - copy/ paste that address and you're all set.

And I don't mean the Harbor although that's pretty sweet as well!

I mean Carvers Harbor Market! And for that matter the Closet as well!!! I have been coming here with family for over 40years (I was of course a swaddling baby), NOT! A bit older and as a college student at UMA Amherst during pretty active, some might say crazy times I had had been out in the pioneer valley, or the valley of the 5 colleges.

But lest I digress...

Always self-employed, I told dad & mom, I'm going to semi retire and move my business up there by age fifty. Well that didn't happen. I came up in the summer of 2015 to help dad, now entering his eighties with a leak he discovered.

I waved goodbye at the terminal from my too long delayed heartland home. Cause, this is where the heart as long been, and heading back to the family's place shaking my head, or maybe rattling my brain I did beat myself up a bit for taking so long to make the move to my forever home! As grateful as the critter in the pound that finds his or hers.

So here I am occasionally still pinching myself to be sure it's real.

Enough ancient history, here's the point!

Complain about Carvers Market? Are you daft?

No huge stores with endless aisles of stuff that you don't need, while you walk a marathon to find the essentials & maybe if you're lucky a token organic selection to necessarily address that Market.

There's a small Trader Joe's in Hanover MA, just off rte 3 that was my favorite store. Why? Because you could find anything you needed and much of it organic or at least minimally processed. And quite frequently some healthy item I had not been aware of, or seen anywhere since I left the co-ops of the valley. The staff at a Trader Joe's always seemed anxious to help and proud of their store as a healthy & organic provider for the community.

And then I really came to appreciate, staying here full time, that great little market in the center of town that was no bigger than my Trader Joe's! What's more it had a lot of local & organic produce. There are organic's from co-op's and small farm country locally, or on North Haven, or from places like Northern California. A favorite is Dave's Killer Sprouted Grain organic breads.

What's more and better! I mean mo-better, than even that Trader Joe's is the effort Carvers makes to offer many of the same things you'd find at that T J's or my fondly remembered valley co-ops!!

And the topper!!!! I can ask Karen for any number of healthy items I find elsewhere & if they're available, the next order or two they're there!!

Now a pause to point out to those who might miss their big box stores and Walmart's that have EVERYTHING. Well, who needs them. We have our BIGGEST little box store in the magical land of the Fox Islands, The Closet! And it's certainly not an unfriendly big box!

Talk about packing everything you need in a friendly compact store! And, again, if you don't see it the community involved and committed owners will make every effort to get it for you. I know because I regularly have had my wish list fulfilled.

We don't need corporate Big Stores here. These two pretty much have you covered in a low stress and very gratifying way!!

And additionally, and especially there are all those great little eclectic, &/or artistic shops often with artist owners & an ample and varied culinary offering in dining!

When Kim & her husband, owners of Carvers, stopped by while walking at a downtown worksite we chatted about a number of things as I repeatedly praised the store. At one point I said to Kim, the only item I can't find among the Bob's Mill products is whey protein powder for my smoothies. Kim quickly replied, we'll take care of that.

Sure enough, a short time later I found a half dozen bags of Bobs Mill Whey Protein powder right at eye level at the check outs!

Now, we are in crazy times and away people were a little slower to return with Covid 19. But I now see the wide array of license plates from all over America. People walking on mass, and biking in family groups. Same ole' same ole' for this time of year, saving the masks, but something different I noticed. Not a complaint to be heard from anyone! Could it be because it's dangerous out there in America? Might it be that this year no one dares complain, appreciating more than ever that they are in Vinalhaven with everything they need here!

Now to be very honest and fair, most of our summer visitors have no complaints at all, only euphoria of one degree or another. This is especially, even dare I say religiously true, of the long-time summer residents. Some of whom split their time even Steven with their away home. These are the people that roll up their sleeves and emerge themselves in community service; asking not what Vinalhaven can do for them, but what they can do for Vinalhaven! Oompah wasn't a similar line uttered by a too short lived POTUS to be proud of in the also too short-lived days of "Camelot'?

Could it be that even those few pampered, entitled, or just unenlightened that might have been one of those rare, but annoying complainers are rethinking their reality, for, rare reality? I think that dare I hear a complaint here in these crazy times I might lose my Island cool!



Crisp Zucchini Blossoms Stuffed with Goat Cheese

- ✓ 1 tbsp ground sumac
- Boiling water
- ✓ 1/4 cup ricotta
- 3 tbsps soft goat cheese
- 1 tsp finely chopped oregano
- 2 tbsps chopped walnuts
- ✓ 1 lemon finely grated to get one tbsp lemon zest, then cut into wedges
- Salt and pepper
- ✓ 8 zucchini blossoms
- ✓ Enough sunflower or other vegetable oil to come half way up the sides of a frying pan
- ✓ 1/8 tsp baking soda
- ice cold sparkling water
- 1. Prepare the blossoms. Wash inside and out with cold water. Open each blossom to be able to peer inside it to make sure there are no ants, bees or other creatures remaining inside. Dry gently.
- 2. In a medium bowl, cover 3/4 tbsp of the sumac with 1 tbsp of boiling water and leave to infuse for 5 minutes. Add both types of cheese, oregano, walnuts, lemon zest and salt.
- 3. Fill the flowers by gently opening them and filling with either a small spoon or your fingers, pushing the filling all the way to the bottom of each blossom but not filling them too much. Gently twist the tips of the petals to secure the filling inside.
- 4. Put in the oil in a frying pan and turn on the heat to medium high.
- 5. Meanwhile, mix the flour and baking soda together in a small bowl. Slowly pour in the sparkling water, whisking continuously to form a thick, smooth batter.
- 6. Test the heat of the oil by dropping some batter into the oil; if it sizzles, you are ready.
- 7. Lower a zucchini blossom into the batter, turning to coat it completely, before carefully placing it in the hot oil. Repeat, cooking a few blossoms at a time until they are firm and crisp on all sides. Use a slotted spoon to transfer them to a paper towel-lined plate and then sprinkle with salt and the remaining 1/4 tbsp sumac (if you are using sumac). Serve with lemon wedges.

Note: This recipe calls for ground sumac. It's a middle eastern spice. You can either order it from a specialty store, or harvest it, in August, directly from red-berried sumac plants growing on Vinalhaven--a little late, alas, for this year's zucchini blossoms, but ready, once dried and stored, for next year's zucchini blossoms. For more on sumac, see the Hungry Ghost website: Gathering and Processing Wild Sumac. Make sure it's the kind of sumac with red berries and not white, for the white are poisonous. For this summer, you can follow the recipe, omitting the sumac: it still holds up.



# THE ISLAND GROUP

#### **Historical Notes**

from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

The Vinalhaven Echo, November 17, 1887
The longest line of drill holes ever drilled in one line can be seen at the Sands Quarry. The line is one hundred and fifty feet long with over 400 drill holes. There are 172 one-foot holes in the line.

\*\*\*

The Vinalhaven Echo, January 5, 1888
Recently Henry Duncan and Willard Carver of
North Haven were carrying lumber across the
thoroughfare, loaded upon two boats connected by
the lumber reaching across each. The boats were
so overloaded that they filled and sunk, leaving the
two men upon the little pile of lumber out in the
middle of the waters of the thoroughfare and no
way to reach the shore. After hours of weary
waiting, while they were drifting helpless and
alone, a boat happened their way and relieved them
from their uncontrollable craft and assisted them to
tow it to the shore.

\*\*\*

The Vinalhaven Echo, Friday, October 7, 1887 Hurricane Island, our little neighbor, is a bee-hive town now. Several new buildings are under construction, boarding houses being repaired, and preparations being made for livery business for some time to come. The Hurricane Granite Co., at present are at work on the north wing of the Boston Court House, and as they are the lowest bidders on the main building are expecting to be awarded the contract for the complete structure. The coming industry on the island is a feature that has largely developed the island to its present prosperity. Mr. Tilden, the superintendent of this department, informs us that the season's work in total will reach one half million cans of herring and lobsters. Their daily average being from five to seven thousand cans. They employ an average of 50 people.
