



Dear Dog and Cat Owners,

In accordance with the laws published by the State of Maine: Animal Welfare Laws and Regulations: Title 7, §3921 - A dog may not be kept within the limits of the State, unless the dog has been licensed by its owner or keeper in accordance with the laws of this State.

In accordance with Title 7, § 3916 1-A, - A person owning or keeping a dog shall, within 30 days after the dog attains the age of 6 months, cause the dog to be vaccinated against rabies and shall have booster vaccinations administered periodically in accordance with rules adopted by the Commissioner of Health and Human Services under section 3922, subsection 3.



If you own a cat, a license is NOT required by the State of Maine at this time, but a Rabies Vaccination is absolutely required under Title 7, § 3916.

Recently I received a list of unlicensed dogs. I will be mailing notices to owner's in case they forgot. So, with that in mind, I am putting forth this notice for all dog and cat owners.

Thank you to the owners that have licensed their dogs. To all other owners of dogs, even if you have for some unknown reason, not ever licensed your dog, I am provided with information in regard to all dogs that have been rabies vaccinated after 6 months old. Because you have never licensed your dog does NOT exempt you.

As of September 15th, 2020, no verbal warning will be given, and no written warnings will be given! I will have given enough time and notice for you as the responsible owner to comply with these State of Maine mandated Laws or Regulations. So what I am saying is please DO NOT put me in a position that requires me under the guidelines and laws that I am directed to enforce, to issue a summons to any owner who is not compliant to these laws or regulations, as I will!

In addition, all dogs brought to the island by summer residents or visitors who are on the island for a period that exceeds 10 days MUST license their dog at the Vinalhaven Town Office, even if they are licensed elsewhere.

§3950-A. Official refusal or neglect of duty

1. Violation. A mayor, municipal officer, clerk, town or city manager, administrative assistant to the mayor, town or city councilor, dog recorder of unorganized territories, constable, police officer, sheriff or animal control officer commits a civil violation if that person refuses or intentionally fails to perform the duties imposed by:

A. This chapter; B. Chapter 719; C. Chapter 720; D. Chapter 721; E. Chapter 725; F. Chapter 727.

2. Penalty. A person who violates subsection 1 commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$500 and costs may be adjudged.

3. Investigation. The commissioner, at the commissioner's own instance or upon written complaint made to the commissioner by another person, shall investigate an alleged refusal or neglect of duty by a municipal officer.

4. Prosecution. The commissioner shall direct proceedings, actions, and prosecutions to be instituted to enforce all laws relating to animals and to the liability of municipal officers and their agents for failure, neglect, or refusal to comply with the laws relating to animals.

VINALHAVEN COMMUNITY COVID-19 GUIDELINES

We are still in a Pandemic. Do your part to put your safety, your family's safety, and the safety of the community first. Do not take unnecessary risks, and be respectful of others by abiding by these guidelines.

*CDC guidelines state that children under age 2 and anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance should NOT wear a face covering.

Did You Know There Are Rules for Discharging Fireworks in Maine and on Vinalhaven?

The **Town of Vinalhaven Consumer Fireworks Ordinance** requires that you have a permit before discharging fireworks (see SECTION 4). No fireworks may be discharged after 10 pm (see SECTION 4 and SECTION 5).

Fireworks may only be discharged on your own property or on the property of a person who has consented, in writing, to allow fireworks to be discharged (see SECTION 6).

Fireworks may NOT be discharged within 50 feet of any buildings or structures (see SECTION 6).

Failure to abide by the Firework Ordinance may result in fines of \$100 for a first offence, \$300 for a second offense, and \$500 for a third offense plus costs and attorney's fees.

TOWN OF VINALHAVEN CONSUMER FIREWORKS ORDINANCE

SECTION 1: Purpose

1.1 This Ordinance regulates the use of consumer fireworks to ensure the safety of the residents and property owners of the Town of Vinalhaven and of the general public.

SECTION 2: Title and Authority

2.1 This Ordinance shall be known as the "Town of Vinalhaven Consumer Fireworks Ordinance." It is adopted pursuant to the enabling provisions of the Maine Constitution, the provisions of 30-A M.R.S.A. § 3001, and the provisions 8 M.R.S.A. § 223-A.

SECTION 3: Definitions

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

3.1 "Consumer Fireworks" has the same meaning as in 8 M.R.S.A. § 221-A(1-A) and does not include the following products which are illegal to sell, use, or possess in Vinalhaven and in the State of Maine:

- Missile-type rockets, as defined by the State Fire Marshal by rule;
- B. Helicopters and aerial spinners, as defined by the State Fire Marshal by rule; and
- C. Sky rockets and bottle rockets as defined by 8 M.R.S.A. 221-A(1-A)(C).

SECTION 4: Permit Required

4.1 No person shall use, display, fire, or otherwise cause to be exploded, consumer fireworks within the Town of Vinalhaven without a permit.

4.2 An applicant must obtain a permit at the Town Office during regular office hours. Permits are available only for special, non-recurring one-day events, and are limited to a 4 hour block of time.

4.3 Applicants must pay the permit fee established by the Board of Selectmen of the Town of Vinalhaven.

4.4 Applicants who do not own the property on which they intend to use Consumer Fireworks must provide written, signed permission from the property owner at the time of application.

4.5 No permit shall be issued:

- A. To any persons under the age of 21.
- B. For any day when fire danger conditions, as determined by the Maine Forest Service, are class 3, 4, or 5.
- C. For Mondays, Tuesdays or Wednesdays.
- D. For times before 12:00 p.m.

4.6 Permits requested for Saturdays or Sundays must be requested no later than the prior Friday. Permits requested for State or Federal Holidays must be requested no later than the business day immediately prior to that holiday.

4.7 The Town Office shall notify the Fire Chief and the Sheriff of all permits issued.

SECTION 5: Exceptions

5.1 No permit will be required on the following dates and during the following times:

- A. July 3rd and July 5th beginning at 9:00am and ending at 10:00pm
- B. July 4th beginning at 9:00am and ending at 12:30am the following day
- C. C. December 31st beginning at 9:00am and ending at 12:30am the following day

5.2 This Ordinance does not apply to the display of fireworks conducted pursuant to a fireworks display permit issued by the State of Maine in accordance with 8 M.R.S.A §§ 227-A - 237.

5.3 The Town of Vinalhaven is exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: Use of Consumer Fireworks Restricted

6.1 Consumer Fireworks shall not be used or ignited under any conditions, if the fire danger conditions, as determined by the Maine Forest Service, are Class 3, 4, or 5.

6.2 A person may use Consumer Fireworks only on that person's property or on the property of a person who has consented, in writing, to the use of Consumer Fireworks on their property and must contain the debris from those fireworks to said property.

6.3 Means to extinguish spot fires resulting from the use of Consumer Fireworks must be available (such as a

fire extinguisher or garden hose). Users of Consumer Fireworks must be able to access 911 by telephone.

6.4 No person shall use, display, fire, or cause to be exploded, consumer fireworks within 50 feet of any buildings or structures.

6.5 A person may not use, display, fire, or cause to be exploded consumer fireworks while intoxicated or impaired due to use of alcohol or drugs.

SECTION 7: Violation and Enforcement

7.1 ENFORCEMENT: This Ordinance may be enforced by the Knox County Sherriff or the Town of Vinalhaven acting through its Town Manager.

7.2 PENALTY FOR VIOLATION: In addition to the applicable penalties provided by 8 M.R.S.A. § 223-A, any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than the following amounts for each violation plus costs and attorney's fees, which shall be recovered upon complaint to the use of the Town:

- A. 1st Offense: \$100
- B. 2nd Offense: \$300
- C. C. 3rd Offense: \$500

7.4 INJUNCTION: In addition to any other remedies available at law or equity, the Town of Vinalhaven, acting through its Town Manager, may apply to any court of competent jurisdiction to enjoin any planned, anticipated or threatened violation of this Ordinance.

7.5 SEIZURE & DISPOSAL OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS: The Town may seize consumer fireworks that the Town has probable cause to believe are used or sold in violation of this Ordinance and shall forfeit seized consumer fireworks to the State for disposal.

SECTION 8: Severability

8.1 In the event that any section, subsection, or portion of this Ordinance shall be declared by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid for any reason, such decision shall not be deemed to affect the validity of any other section, subsection or portion of this Ordinance.

Homestead COVID-19 Protocols



The CDC has issued new protocols for outside visits at The Homestead.

Outdoor Visitation: Facilities may allow in-person visitation in a designated outdoor visitation space, provided the facility implements all of the following safety, care, and infection prevention and control measures. There must be no new COVID-19 cases that originated within the facility, including those involving residents or staff, within the last 14 days

Measures: • Visits Specifics:

o Must take place in a designated outdoor space and are dependent upon permissible weather conditions, availability of outdoor space, and sufficient staffing at the facility to meet resident care needs, and the health and well-being of the resident.

o Visitations must be scheduled in advance for all designated outdoor spaces

o Facilities may limit the length of any visit, the days on which visits will be permitted, the hours during a day when visits will be permitted, and the number of times during a day or week a resident may be visited.

o No meals/snacks are permitted during the visit as this would require the removal of the face mask/face covering.

o Facilities will post signage or provide a handout for visitors on signs and symptoms associated with COVID-19.

o Prior to the visit the facility will provide the visitor instructions and requirements for visitation and where to go upon arrival.

o 6 feet of physical distance must be maintained during the visit.

o Residents must wear a cloth face covering. Visitors must wear a face covering or mask for the duration of the visit.

Visitors: o Visitors must be limited to no more than two individuals per visit

o The facility must screen the visitor for fever or respiratory symptoms. Any individuals with symptoms of COVID-19 infection1 will not be permitted to visit.

o Hand hygiene will be performed before and after the visit.

o All visitors must remain at least 6 feet from the resident and any attending staff member(s) at all times during the visit.

o Children must be supervised at all times, maintain social distancing, and wear a face covering when age appropriate

. • Staff: o A staff member(s) trained in patient safety and infection prevention and control measures must be present to monitor the outdoor designated space(s).

o Monitoring of visitation is required. Facility should assess the number of staff necessary to ensure appropriate masking and social distancing are followed.

o Staff must wear a surgical face mask.

Veggie Corner: Laurence Perez's Gazpacho

- Equal parts of tomato and cucumber, cut into large cubes
- 1/4 to 1/2 of a red bell pepper, cut into a few pieces
- ✓ 1/4 to 1/2 onion, cut into a few pieces
- ✓ 1 or 2 garlic cloves
- Fresh or dried oregano
- 1 or 2 slices dry French or Italian style white bread, torn or cut into a few pieces
- Oil
- ✓ Vinegar
- Salt
- Pepper

1) Put cut-up cucumbers, tomatoes, bell pepper, onion, garlic, oregano and bread in a large bowl. Add a small amount of vinegar and a slightly larger amount of oil and salt and pepper. Mix thoroughly and cover bowl with a dish towel. Allow to rest for 1 hour or more.

2) Process and put in a serving bowl. Served chilled. Adjust seasonings and oil and vinegar to taste.

3) Serve with at least three the following toppings, offered separately from one another, on the side. All of them should be chopped very fine.

4) Onions, scallions, anchovies or green olives or black olives all chopped fine—or hard boiled egg, chopped fine (or to be more fancy, only the yellow of the eggs, chopped fine).





Vinalhaven Water District is committed to providing high quality drinking water and remains dedicated to continually looking for ways to enhance your service. We are notifying customers of a change to the chemical treatment that is currently used in the Water District's potable water system. Providing safe drinking water is a priority for Vinalhaven Water District. We are investing in new corrosion control treatment for the Vinalhaven system using a zinc orthophosphate chemical which will help to improve water quality by controlling corrosion from certain metals and hardness that may be present in water. The State of Maine Center for Disease Control, Drinking Water Program has reviewed and approved this chemical change. The new chemical addition is planned to begin on or before August 31, 2020. The Vinalhaven water system has a long history of successfully meeting the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency requirements, but we are aware of concerns for corrosion of internal plumbing and rusty water in the distribution piping. We believe improving our corrosion control treatment will ensure compliance with future regulations and improve the quality of water that our customers receive. 


