To REGISTER TO VOTE you will need to fill out a Maine Voter Registration Card and provide a Maine Drivers License or Maine ID AND proof of Vinalhaven residence (if your VH address is not already on the license).



Maine Trivia

The southern terminus is at Springer Mountain, Georgia, and the northern terminus is at Katahdin, Maine.

I wrote to my sister Ginny when she died in 2017 - - a short explanation:

The setting of my poem is Vinalhaven, Maine - - clusters of islands which Ginny and I have loved with a terrible passion since our pre-teens. One of my sons has said the greatest legacy I could ever give to him is that he knows Vinalhaven and the surrounding islands exist. Yes.

It is a place where islands, topped mostly by evergreens, are bound by granite ledges running to the sea. In the past, these islands brought forth, for example, the granite used to make the Brooklyn Bridge and for the seven towering altar columns in the Cathedral of St. John Devine in NYC. And much more.

My artist sister wanted me to become a poet - - Here is a poem to her life.

Brooklyn Bridge

My sister, you paint the sparkle of water You are Brooklyn Bridge, Made of Vinalhaven granite

Remember . . .
Secrets of growing
Hurt of living
Dreams deferred
Finally, sprung loose
You determined your outcome
Success, pride, love, companionship.

Seventy of 86 years kept your promise Returned to granite shores, Slopes rounded by washing seas Our sea, our father's sea

Industry's sharp stroke Made island granite useful And you, too, changed Loving our Mother Loving nature.

* * * *

Now it is time, Ginny, Now, grains of Vinalhaven rest here Brought into hometown soil.

And now you will
Pass through our islands . . .
Spruce rimmed
Anchored with granite . . .

Now, watch . . . The islands move apart . . . Separate . . . drifting To let you go - -

Pass through, Ginny Channel to new life, Nourish our universe The earth Flowers, wheat . . .

We thought it would be fun to ask the Class of 1970 to share a favorite memory of high school. Following is this week's response.


Russell Oakes: Class trip to Washington, D.C. April 1970

This trip stands out to me at this time, because of the Black Lives Matter movement. In the 1960s, there had been a lot of rioting due to race. Being from the island, we did not really have much insight into it, even though we saw it all on the news. We did not have any experience to draw from, so when Randy, Ralph and a third guy (all black), made friends with us in D.C., we welcomed them. Our class invited them to join in and they went on some of the tours with us. Chaperones, Lyle and Laura Griffin, said they were welcome as long as they could pay their own way. We went to the Capital, Lincoln Memorial, Jefferson Memorial, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, etc. They had musical instruments-amps, guitars, a trumpet and they played music at the hotel with the seniors. Randy Knowlton was a riot, and really hit it off with them. They appeared to be about our age, but we did not really know what they were doing in Washington with their instruments. Now when I watch the news, I think back to that week, and what a great experience the trip was and the friendships we made with our new friends.

Jean Thompson: A Memory from the class of 1970

At the school budget meeting in the spring of 1969, the town voted not to support the sports budget. If we wanted to play, we had to earn the money needed, so we did. We held bingos, bake sales, raffles, and sold cases and cases of candy. The biggest expense was for away basketball games. The Army surplus bus that the school had bought, that had previously provided transportation for those games, had died a couple of years before so we had to rely on private cars to get us where we needed to go. Often my father and other parents volunteered their time and took their own cars, usually at their own expense, to save us money, but they couldn't always get away. The trip up north to Oakfield and Danforth was a three-day affair. Finding someone to drive us was more difficult, so it was decided that it would be okay for students to take their own cars. On this particular trip I was a passenger in "Swede's" (Ivan Olson's) car. We left on the first boat one Friday and headed north. Friday night's game was to be in Oakfield. The first leg of the trip went fine. On Saturday morning our host families were eager to get rid of us so we met at the gym (which was upstairs over a pool hall!) and were told to be in Danforth by game time Saturday night. We had to whole day to kill. In order to get to Danforth, we had to go north to Houlton before then heading south. We got to Houlton before lunch and tried to find something to do. We thought it would be fun to go bowling, the only problem being the closest bowling alley was in Woodstock, Canada. (But we didn't really think it was a problem!) Swede drove on up to the customs booth, told them what we were up to and they let us through. (I'm pretty sure he was probably the only one with an ID.) We had lunch, went bowling, and stopped at a store because Swede needed socks. Coming back through customs, the US border guards asked several questions, like if we had anything to declare (Swede showed them his socks!!). They also wanted to know if we bought any food. Swede told them we had eaten lunch there so the only food we had were in our stomachs! We were a little nervous because it was taking time and we were afraid we would be late getting to Danforth. I guess they decided we were safe to let back in the country, so off we set for Danforth. We made it on time, laughing the whole way about our adventure! We thought it was great fun to have left the country!! When I got home and told my parents about it, they weren't as amused as we all were!!



Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

It was discovered by the night watchman Monday evening that George Vinal had gone home and left the lights burning in the dry goods department of the B. G. Co. store. So, he called the attention of the bookkeeper Oberton, who informed John Talbot, that he must get A.K. Simpson to convey the message to I.C. Glidden, and have him see E. S. Bodwell, so that he might tell Jim Armbrust to have Bob Wiley instruct Dr. Phillips to find John Frohock, and send him after Mr. Searles to come and help extinguish those lights. When the whole crowd had collected but Frohock, they discovered him in the store, as he had just arisen from is comfortable position behind a stand where he had been reading during all the hubbub outside!

Vinalhaven Echo January 19, 1888

A piece of granite six feet deep was removed from its bed at Diamond Rock Quarry recently, and a live green snake was found beneath it. The snake had a perfect head upon each end of his body. The truth of this is substantiated by Mr. George Smith,, who saw the snake when it was found. This will destroy the argument that there is a tail end to everything.

Vinalhaven Echo April12, 1888

The Vinalhaven Public Library has received a request from the American Library Association's Headquarters in Washington for more books from this community for the men overseas. The appeal from Washington states that new novels and good western stories, whether new or old are the most needed. Books by Zane Gray, Rex Beach, Jack London, Ralph Connor, Owen Wister, and O. Henry are very popular. The Public Library announces that it will receive and forward all suitable books that are turned in. It urges the friends of soldiers and sailors, many of who have already responded most generously, to give more books.

Vinalhaven August 16, 1918

STAR OF HOPE FOUNDATION

Vinalhaven's Historic Landmark Re-Emerging, Following Major Stabilization Effort

Vinalhaven, ME After almost 12 months of work by a team of architects, engineers, contractors, and historic preservationists, the Star of Hope building on Vinalhaven's Main Street is reappearing. This first phase of a long-term project has been to save and stabilize the building which was in a precarious state.

This historic landmark, prominent in downtown Vinalhaven, was once the Odd Fellows Hall. In the 1970s the building became the home of American Pop Artist Robert Indiana. Indiana, who died in 2018, left his estate to the Star of Hope Foundation. In September 2019, the Star of Hope Foundation obtained Indiana's real estate holdings, allowing work to begin stabilizing the Star of Hope building.

The towering 3-story structure has been covered in scaffolding and wrapped in weather-resistant material. The removal of the staging will begin this week on the south side of the building and will be completely removed over the coming weeks. Because the original building had been enlarged to incorporate a third floor, significant re-engineering of the structure has been necessary for its long-term integrity. The interior building support structure has essentially been rebuilt. Work has included repair to the mansard roof, significant leaks and rotted sills. In addition, restoration of the windows and doors has been underway, as well as replacement of the exterior siding.

Larry Sterrs, Chairman of the Star of Hope Foundation, has led the effort to stabilize the landmark. "This effort has been a huge undertaking, with a number of major constraints along the way. The fact is, there were times when we wondered if the building could remain standing. But kudos to our team of experts who figured out a path forward and whose work has been meticulous, following historic preservation guidelines, and working safely through a pandemic."

Kris Davidson, board member of the Star of Hope Foundation, and a life-long Vinalhaven resident, commented: "This is a very exciting moment for our community as we unveil this important structure. I am excited a piece of Vinalhaven's history is being preserved while we prepare and plan for the future. The building was in rough shape but now, with the building stabilized, we can move ahead to establish something that promotes arts education and fulfills the mission of the Star of Hope Foundation."

The mission of the Star of Hope Foundation is to promote education of the visual arts through various means including exhibitions, a museum, artist-in-residence programs and other outreach endeavors.

While the construction has been underway, the Foundation's board has focused on the data collected during a community engagement phase, which included community meetings and a survey. Ideas expressed during the process are guiding the Board in its strategic planning process and the Board continues to consider the best path forward. Sterrs said, "We have visited a number of artist residencies in Maine to see how others operate educational programs, and we have engaged in a series of facilitated workshops to fully understand how artist-endowed foundations manage art collections, arts programming and community involvement." The strategic planning process will ultimately guide how the Star of Hope building will be renovated. "Now that we have a building that can remain standing, it is important that the space inside be designed in such a way that it provides the opportunity for the Foundation to meet its mission and to collaborate with the community," Sterrs explained.

Sterrs also commented on an effort to document the details of the building's interior. "People have asked, and so we plan to share a slide show on the Foundation's website sometime in September. This way the community can see the inside of the building and the interesting architectural elements." With the exception of the architects, engineers and construction crew, no one has been able to enter the building due to safety protocols.

The timeline to renovate the interior space will be determined by the final plan developed by the Board. Sterrs said, "I expect our planning effort to go through the winter of 2021 and then we can begin to meet with architects and contractors to determine when this next phase can take place. In the meantime, the building is reestablishing its position as an historic gem on Vinalhaven's Main Street."

FOCCACCIA WITH EGGPLANT AND RICOTTA

FOR THE DOUGH

1/3 cup/80 milliliters extra-virgin olive oil, plus more for greasing the bowl

34 cup/180 milliliters lukewarm water (105 to 115 degrees)

1½ teaspoon/5 grams active dry or instant yeast

1 teaspoon/5 grams granulated sugar

1 ½ teaspoon/10 grams kosher salt

2 1/4 cups/305 grams bread flour, plus more as needed

FOR THE TOPPING

34 pound eggplant, thinly sliced

¼ teaspoon kosher salt

1/4 cup pitted olives

1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil, plus more as needed

1 fat garlic clove, minced or finely grated

5 anchovy fillets, finely chopped (optional)

1 tablespoon chopped fresh thyme or oregano leaves, or 1 teaspoon dried

2/3 cup cherry tomatoes, halved

1/3 cup fresh ricotta, plus more to taste

Freshly ground black pepper, for garnish

Torn fresh basil leaves, for garnish

PREPARATION

Oil a large bowl and set aside. (This is for the rising dough.)

Add water to another large bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer. Sprinkle yeast and sugar over. Let stand until foamy, 5 to 10 minutes.

Stir 1/3 cup oil and salt into yeast mixture. Stir in flour until a soft, shaqqy dough forms.

If kneading by hand, turn dough out onto a floured surface and knead until it is smooth and elastic, about 10 minutes. Or knead in a stand mixer equipped with the dough hook for 3 to 5 minutes. The dough is ready when it's elastic but somewhat sticky and damp. If the dough seems unmanageable and won't come off your hands, add more flour, a little at a time.

Place dough in the oiled bowl and turn to coat it lightly with oil. Cover bowl with a plate or plastic wrap. Leave in a warm place until dough has doubled in size, 1 to 2 hours.

While dough is rising, make the topping: Combine eggplant and salt in a large mixing bowl and set aside.

Mince half of the olives and slice the other half.

In a small saucepan, heat 1/4 cup oil over medium. Add garlic, stirring constantly, and heat until opaque, about 1 minute. Add the minced olives and anchovies, if using. Reduce heat to medium-low and cook, stirring, until the oil is fragrant, 1 to 2 minutes. Remove from heat and pour oil over eggplant. Add thyme or oregano and toss until evenly coated. Set aside and cool completely before using.

Lightly oil an 11-by-17-inch rimmed baking sheet. Working on a floured surface, roll dough into an 11-by-16-inch rectangle, then transfer it to the oiled baking sheet and press the dough to the sides. Cover with a damp cloth and let rest for 30 minutes.

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Arrange eggplant slices evenly over dough, and scatter tomatoes and sliced olives on top. Drizzle any leftover oil from the bottom of the eggplant bowl on pizza.

Bake until edges and underside are golden brown, 25 to 30 minutes.

Using a spoon, top with dollops of ricotta. Sprinkle freshly ground black pepper and basil leaves on top, and drizzle with olive oil. Serve warm or at room temperature.




