



Dear Dog and Cat Owners,

In accordance with the laws published by the State of Maine: Animal Welfare Laws and Regulations: Title 7, §3921 - A dog may not be kept within the limits of the State, unless the dog has been licensed by its owner or keeper in accordance with the laws of this State.

In accordance with Title 7, § 3916 1-A, - A person owning or keeping a dog shall, within 30 days after the dog attains the age of 6 months, cause the dog to be vaccinated against rabies and shall have booster vaccinations administered periodically in accordance with rules adopted by the Commissioner of Health and Human Services under section 3922, subsection 3.



If you own a cat, a license is NOT required by the State of Maine at this time, but a Rabies Vaccination is absolutely required under Title 7, § 3916.

Recently I received a list of unlicensed dogs. I will be mailing notices to owner's in case they forgot. So, with that in mind, I am putting forth this notice for all dog and cat owners.

Thank you to the owners that have licensed their dogs. To all other owners of dogs, even if you have for some unknown reason, not ever licensed your dog, I am provided with information in regard to all dogs that have been rabies vaccinated after 6 months old. Because you have never licensed your dog does NOT exempt you.

As of September 15th, 2020, no verbal warning will be given, and no written warnings will be given! I will have given enough time and notice for you as the responsible owner to comply with these State of Maine mandated Laws or Regulations. So what I am saying is please DO NOT put me in a position that requires me under the guidelines and laws that I am directed to enforce, to issue a summons to any owner who is not compliant to these laws or regulations, as I will!

In addition, all dogs brought to the island by summer residents or visitors who are on the island for a period that exceeds 10 days MUST license their dog at the Vinalhaven Town Office, even if they are licensed elsewhere.

§3950-A. Official refusal or neglect of duty

- **1. Violation.** A mayor, municipal officer, clerk, town or city manager, administrative assistant to the mayor, town or city councilor, dog recorder of unorganized territories, constable, police officer, sheriff or animal control officer commits a civil violation if that person refuses or intentionally fails to perform the duties imposed by:
 - A. This chapter; B. Chapter 719; C. Chapter 720; D. Chapter 721; E. Chapter 725; F. Chapter 727.
- **2. Penalty.** A person who violates subsection 1 commits a civil violation for which a fine of not less than \$50 and not more than \$500 and costs may be adjudged.
- **3. Investigation.** The commissioner, at the commissioner's own instance or upon written complaint made to the commissioner by another person, shall investigate an alleged refusal or neglect of duty by a municipal officer.
- **4. Prosecution.** The commissioner shall direct proceedings, actions, and prosecutions to be instituted to enforce all laws relating to animals and to the liability of municipal officers and their agents for failure, neglect, or refusal to comply with the laws relating to animals.

- Library staff is available for requests **Tuesday Saturday**, 9 am 5 pm.
- Cut-off for guaranteed same-day service is 3 pm.
- Your order will be at the rear entrance to the building in a teal-colored plastic bag with your name attached. Items not collected by 5 pm will be available again at 9 am the following business day.
- When approaching the building, please maintain a minimum distance of six feet from other individuals and wear a mask.
- Please return materials to the book drops at front and rear of the building.
- Returned materials undergo a quarantine period before being checked back into our circulation system, so our online catalog may be up to a week out-of-date. To ensure availability of an item, please call or email.

New Release Titles

- Due to quarantine requirements and to make it possible for the maximum number of people to access these materials, **only 2 new release titles per patron** may be checked out for a period of 7 days.
- Patrons may borrow up to 2 more new release titles when the first returned titles have been quarantined and entered back into circulation.
- No renewals allowed.

Interlibrary Loans will not be available through the library until the fall.

A celebration of Buddy's life will be announced in the summer of 2021 when people can all safely gather again.



Vinalhaven School News

THIS WEEK at Vinalhaven School!

The school staff is attending one of three meetings this week to go over specific details for our latest Return-to-School plan. With feedback from teachers, for example, we are able to make sure the plans accommodate safety guidelines, provide opportunities for outdoor instruction and mask breaks, and offer options for a variety of learning situations.

Just a reminder:

1. All schools in the state of Maine will have at least 3 plans. At Vinalhaven School, Plan A = all students are at school in the building. Plan B = "Hybrid", meaning some students are in the building, and other students are learning "remote". Plan C = all students are remote (not in the building). We will be prepared with all plans required by the state. And, with each plan, our goal is to make school engaging, relevant, and fun

- 2. Vinalhaven has significant advantages because we have smaller class sizes, lots of outdoor space, and a large building with great ventilation. Plus, teachers who are willing to put all of these plans together during the summer!
- 3. When we complete our planning, we'll get that info out to the community. It will be on our website, on our facebook page, shared through community links, and we'll produce a video where we can "walk" through the school to show everyone how it will work.
- 4. We will have repeated "zoom" sessions where we'll explain the plans, and then invite everyone in the community to ask questions.
- 5. Even though we will share with you each plan, we will not know which plan the state will recommend for September 8 when school starts. No matter what, we will consistently communicate updates with the Vinalhaven community

No Bake Cookies


- ♦ 2 c. sugar

You can add whatever ingredients you want. Just like candy.



Vinalhaven, ME Islands Community Medical Services (ICMS) is very pleased to announce that Dr. Kimberly Saunders will be joining our organization in October 2020 as Medical Director working with our leadership team. Dr. Saunders, a board-certified family medicine physician, is currently practicing in Anchorage, AK with the Indian Health Service, which serves a patient population similar to that of a Community Health Center. While she, her husband and their two young children have thoroughly enjoyed the experience in Alaska, they are ready to return to the northeast, where they will be closer to family. In past years, they have enjoyed vacation time on Vinalhaven, and they are excited to be returning to this community, in order to make it their new home.

Dr. Saunders, who was born in Washington, DC, attended Clemson University where she earned her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Language and International Trade. She then attended medical school at Virginia College of Osteopathic Medicine where she earned her Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine in 2010. Between college and medical school, Saunders was a Peace Corps Volunteer in West Africa where she assisted in a health clinic and helped with education programs to improve the health of the communities she served. Following medical school, she did her residency in Family Medicine at Eastern Maine Medical Center in Bangor. Most recently, her work in Alaska has been to manage outpatient services for about 1,000 Native Alaskan and American Indian patients, and to consult for two Aleutian Island Villages providing services to over 700 patients. This experience has allowed her to manage patients, living on remote islands, and when necessary, transferring patients to the mainland for more acute care. Dr. Saunders enjoys outpatient-based medicine where she sees up to 16 patients per day. She says this allows her to develop close relationships with her patients and understand their needs and provide the best of care.

Through ICMS's process to locate a new provider for the medical center, the Search Committee was impressed with Dr. Saunders' character. She has been recommended as a highly respected and conscientious physician who is a strong patient advocate. The Committee, comprised of Emily Lane, Chair; Dick Young; Diane Cochran; Dinah Moyer; Jen Desmond; and Jim Hogan, has been thoroughly impressed with her openness and candor, as well as her professional experience which has many similarities to providing community health care to island residents here in Maine.



Veggie Corner: Sformato di Zucchine

In Italian it means "formless zucchini thing." Part of this recipe was included in the 7/23 Wind.

- Zucchinis
- Olive oil
- Béchamel sauce (see classic béchamel sauce recipe)
- ✓ Eggs
- Grated parmesan cheese
- Salt and pepper
- ✓ Whole nutmeg, grated
- ✓ Butter
- Breadcrumbs
- 1.) Grate zucchinis. Sauté grated zucchinis in olive oil in a large pot until tender and most of the liquid has evaporated. Put a dishcloth in a colander and let the zucchinis drain more, then gather up the dishtowel and squeeze the zucchinis until they are very dry.

- 2.) Pre-heat the oven to 375 degrees. Butter an ovenproof dish and dust with bread crumbs.
- 3.) Weigh cooked, dried zucchinis and put zucchinis in a large bowl. Add béchamel sauce (figure 3 cups per 1 lb. of cooked, dried zucchinis), eggs (4 per 1 lb. of zucchinis), grated parmesan cheese (1/2 cup or more per 1 lb. of zucchinis), salt and pepper and several gratings of nutmeg. Pour into the prepared ovenproof dish and sprinkle top with more breadcrumbs and grated parmesan.
- 4.) Bake for an hour or more, until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Serve warm or at room temperature, with parmesan on the side.

Note: chopped fresh mint can be substituted for nutmeg




