Absentee Ballot Request For November 3, 2020 General Election

Registered Vinalhaven Voters may request absentee ballots any **ONE** of three ways:

- 1. Use the Secretary of State's Online Absentee Ballot Request Portal. Go to apps.web.maine.gov/cgibin/online/AbsenteeBallot/index.pl The deadline to request ballots using this service is 5:00 pm on Thursday, October 29, 2020.
- 2. Call the Town Office at (207) 863-4343 to request a ballot by phone. Please Note: the person requesting the ballot must speak with the Clerk. A person may not request a ballot for someone other than themselves.
- Print, fill out and mail (or put in our drop box) the request form available on the Town website.

Actual ballots will be mailed 30 days prior to the election.

To REGISTER TO VOTE you will need to fill out a Maine Voter Registration Card and provide a Maine Drivers License or Maine ID AND proof of Vinalhaven residence (if your VH address is not already on the license).

Recently there was a special town meeting at the high school. Amendments to the Harbor Ordinance were voted on and passed by the voters. Unfortunately, the attendance was very low and just a few voters that were directly involved in the harbor matters were there to vote. Therefore, laws get passed and you as the fishermen have missed your chance to pass or reject whatever issue is being voted on.

This is our community, our wharf, our harbor! The issues that come up for vote are being passed or rejected by just a handful of residents, most of which do not even own a skiff or have any attachment to the town wharf, harbor, moorings, etc.

Therefore, I appeal to you as business owners, fishermen, and residents to attend these very important meetings that the town schedules so we as a community can decide what is, or not, to be implemented as laws, spending, etc. I hope all residents of this community understand that your vote, input, objections, are important to be heard.

I remember when the school was packed with people when we had these public meetings. I ask for this to come back; I would like for all residents to come to these public meetings. This is your town! We are taking safety precautions at all public meetings, masks, social distancing, etc. Your vote is important, your presence is necessary. Let's bring back the days of community involvement, it is so important for all of us. If you want to be involved with the Harbor Committee contact the town office.



Welcome to summer at the Vinalhaven Public Library during the Covid-19 pandemic. It is certainly not the summer we anticipated or wanted but it is the one we have. We are happy to be able to provide some limited library services during a phased re-opening.

Curbside Service – How It Works

- Request books and DVDs from our collection at <u>vpl@vhaven.lib.me.us</u> or 207.863.4401.
- Library staff is available for requests Tuesday Saturday, 9 am 5 pm.
- Cut-off for guaranteed same-day service is 3 pm.
- Your order will be at the rear entrance to the building in a teal-colored plastic bag with your name attached. Items not collected by 5 pm will be available again at 9 am the following business day.
- When approaching the building, please maintain a minimum distance of six feet from other individuals and wear a mask.
- Please return materials to the book drops at front and rear of the building.
- Returned materials undergo a quarantine period before being checked back into our circulation system, so our online catalog may be up to a week out-of-date. To ensure availability of an item, please call or email.

New Release Titles

- Due to quarantine requirements and to make it possible for the maximum number of people to access these materials, **only 2 new release titles per patron** may be checked out for a period of 7 days.
- Patrons may borrow up to 2 more new release titles when the first returned titles have been quarantined and entered back into circulation.
- No renewals allowed.

Interlibrary Loans will not be available through the library until the fall.

Ruth "Bami" Hutchinson Sayward's long, rich life on earth ended September 7th, 2020. Ruth was born April 22, 1934 on Earth Day, in Stafford Springs Connecticut, the youngest daughter of the late Roland W. Sayward and Eleanor Hutchinson Sayward of East Longmeadow, Mass.

In youth, she was a Worthy Advisory within the International Order of Rainbow Girls, an organization within the family of Freemasonry, that taught three basic virtues: Faith in a Supreme Being and other people, having hope in all they do, and Charity toward others. Ruth lived those values and championed the causes that needed a voice both personally and globally. For herself, Ruth pursued advanced education in her 40s earning her Bachelor of Arts from Drew University and into her 50s, pursuing her Master's in Theological Studies from Princeton University.

For the world, Ruth donated her time supporting many causes. In the 1960s, she marched on Washington in support of civil rights witnessing the I have a Dream Speech at the Lincoln Memorial. In the 1970s, she supported the hungry, helping to establish the Crop Walk in Mendham, NJ. In the 1980's Ruth marched against nuclear proliferation collaborating with other concerned citizens, as well as, scientists directly involved in the Manhattan Project. Into her late 70s and 80s Ruth enjoyed serving as a crossing guard, and donating her time to Vinalhaven's elder care, local churches, and participating in book clubs and enjoying nature.

Over the last 33 years, Ruth established a successful woman-owned and operated expatriate mail-forwarding business that continues to this day. Married twice, her former husbands Richard Fehnel and Gery Torborg, for whom she shared her time on Vinalhaven, predeceased her. She was the sister of Virginia Sayward Paul and sister in law to Brenda M. Sayward both deceased. Ruth is remembered and survived by her four sons and their families, Keith & Lisa, Peter & Yveth, Brad & Tricia, and Todd & Dornell Fehnel; her brother, Roland Sayward Jr of Gorham, Maine; and her partner, Charles Hayward, her former childhood sweetheart, with whom she spent the last two years; and is held in affection by the extended Torborg and Sayward families, nieces & nephews, many grandchildren...and countless friends and worthy acquaintances.

A memorial service will be planned in the Spring of 2021 to allow for a more amenable and safer environment for a gathering. Island Barn Music

On a wonderful Maine like Sunday, I was told by my Island friends and fellow musicians (Richie, Goog, Jamie, and Eric). "Ya feel like playing down at Gweeker's today? It's a party for Hal Chiles, he's not doing too good, so this get together is for him." "Sure," I said, "I'm there". The boathouse was about 60' wide and 60' long and with the lobster boat overboard the space was clear. My drum set sat mid-semicircle of 12 chairs, mics and amplifiers abound. In front of the two large overhead doors were 4 chairs facing the impending music. That setup was for Hal. People showed up with kegs of beer and drinks, food was plentiful with a never-ending supply of sea and barbecue food. Musicians from North Haven, The Mainland, and Matinicus (an Island 12 Miles further out to sea) started arriving (most in their boats) all intent on having a great time. With over 100 people cutting loose, Local songs, rock songs, and folk songs rang the day. Intense dance and electric music gave way to emotional local story songs and in musical waves, the day progressed. Finally, 12 hours later, exhausted, it was over. I hadn't a beer as enjoying my passion drove the day. When it was all over, we all hugged and said the proverbial "same time next year" That was 17 years ago, but It seems like yesterday.





END OF SUMMER CUCUMBERS AND TOMATOES

Adapted from The New York Times Cookbook, 1980

CHILLED TOMATO, CUCUMBER AND YOGURT SOUP

2 tbsps butter

2 cups chopped onion

2 cups peeled, seeded, cubed cucumbers

3 cups peeled, seeded, cubed tomatoes

3 basil leaves

2 cups chicken or vegetable broth

2 cups yogurt

Salt

1 tsp chopped fresh mint (optional)

Directions

- Melt butter in a saucepan and add the onion. Cook, stirring frequently, for about 10 minutes. Do not brown. Add the cucumbers, tomatoes, basil and broth. Cook, stirring frequently, for about 30 minutes.
- Process until smooth. Pour most of the processed soup into a bowl, leaving a little bit of vegetables and broth in the processor. Add yogurt to the processor and blend until smooth. Add to the bowl and blend thoroughly. Add salt to taste. Served chilled with chopped mint on top.

QUINOA SALAD

1/2 cup or more quinoa
Cucumber, peeled and cut into 1/2 inch cubes
Tomatoes, cut into 1/2 inch cubes
Scallions, cut into thin rounds or a small amount of onion, chopped fine
1/4 to 1/2 green bell pepper, cut into 1/2 inch squares
Lemon juice
Olive oil
Salt and pepper
Basil leaves

Directions

Lettuce leaves (optional)

- Wash quinoa and soak in lukewarm water for 15 minutes or more.
 Bring water to boil in a medium sized pot. Add quinoa and salt and cook for 15 minutes, or until the quinoa is tender. Drain.
- Put tomatoes, cucumbers, scallions or onions and bell peppers in a bowl and toss. Add as much quinoa as desired and toss. Add lemon juice first so that it penetrates the quinoa and the vegetables, then add olive oil and salt and pepper to taste and toss again. Top with torn basil leaves. Serve as is or on a base of lettuce leaves.



AND WITH THE LEFTOVER QUINOA: QUINOA CAKES

To make the cakes, you will need a metal, smooth-sided 1/4 or 1/3 cup measuring cup with a panhandle.

Cooked quinoa
Chopped scallions or onions
1/4 bell pepper or less, chopped very
1 small clove of garlic, chopped fine
Grated parmesan
A dash of cream
Pine nuts or blanched almonds, roughly chopped
1 egg
Salt and pepper
Bread crumbs

Directions

- Combine everything except the breadcrumbs. Add the breadcrumbs, a little bit at a time, until the mixture seems to hold together.
- 2. Heat vegetable oil in a pan. To make a cake, pack mixture firmly into the measuring cup described above. After the cup is packed, turn the cup upside down a few inches over the heated pan near the edge of the pan. Tap the handle of the measuring cup on the side of the pan to release the formed cake. Ideally, the result will be a perfect cylinder about an inch high. If the cake doesn't hold together, add more breadcrumbs to the remaining mixture. Repeat making cakes and releasing them into the pan, carefully turning cakes as their undersides become well browned.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Schooner J. G. Clifford of Newport, RI, 600 tons, is loading granite at the Sands. She is said to be the largest vessel ever loaded with granite at this place.

Vinalhaven Echo, March 29, 1888

Schooner David Osier this week landed at Lane & Libby's 16,000 weight of fish; Clara Benner 18,000; Esperanza, 18,000; Lena Young 12,000; Lottie Hopkins 26,380. The Lottie's stock was \$720 for the week. The crew of the last-named vessel are large, smart, able bodied med. They are fishermen throughout. Their extra weight comes from heavy ginger-bread they eat which they call sinkers.

Vinalhaven Echo, January 5, 1888

The Schooner William Booth at the time of this writing is ashore on Narrows Island where she drifted last week, after parting her lines at the wharf of the Robert's Harbor Granite Company. Tug Sophie of Rockland is expecting to float her on the high tide Monday. Her Captain Mr. Armstrong of Rockland is in town assisting.

The Schooner William Booth, for the past week, has been ashore on Narrows Island. She has been floated by the Lighter Sophia and Tug Somers Smith. She was not badly damaged and will be towed to Rockland the first good chance for repairs at Snow's Shipyard.


