Absentee Ballot Request For November 3, 2020 General Election

Registered Vinalhaven Voters may request absentee ballots any **ONE** of three ways:

- Use the Secretary of State's Online Absentee Ballot Request Portal. Go to <u>apps.web.maine.gov/cgibin/online/AbsenteeBallot/in</u> <u>dex.pl</u> The deadline to request ballots using this service is 5:00 pm on Thursday, October 29, 2020.
- Call the Town Office at (207) 863-4343 to request a ballot by phone. Please Note: the person requesting the ballot must speak with the Clerk. A person may not request a ballot for someone other than themselves.
- 3. Print, fill out and mail (or put in our drop box) the request form available on the Town website.

Actual ballots will be mailed 30 days prior to the election.

To **REGISTER TO VOTE** you will need to fill out a **Maine Voter Registration Card and provide a Maine Drivers License or Maine ID AND proof of Vinalhaven residence** (if your VH address is not already on the license).

- Your order will be at the rear entrance to the building in a teal-colored plastic bag with your name attached. Items not collected by 5 pm will be available again at 9 am the following business day.
- When approaching the building, please *maintain a minimum distance of six feet from other individuals and wear a mask.*
- Please return materials to the book drops at front and rear of the building.
- Returned materials undergo a quarantine period before being checked back into our circulation system, so our online catalog may be up to a week out-of-date. To ensure availability of an item, please call or email.

New Release Titles

- Due to quarantine requirements and to make it possible for the maximum number of people to access these materials, **only 2 new release titles per patron** may be checked out for a period of 7 days.
- Patrons may borrow up to 2 more new release titles when the first returned titles have been quarantined and entered back into circulation.
- No renewals allowed.

Interlibrary Loans will not be available through the library until the fall.



Bald Eagles

For or 30 years prior to 2002 Ospreys ruled the skies above Vinalhaven. Overnight the Bald Eagle had arrived "there was a new sheriff in town "and run off the ospreys. By the way, Bald Eagles are the supreme Bird of prey and weigh around 14 pounds with a wingspan around 7 feet. Ospreys weight about 3-6 pounds and have a wingspan of about 6 feet, I'd run too.

Early One day in September 2002, I was ferrying a group of tradesmen to a project on Sheep Island a mile or so from the dock in Roberts Harbor. The sea was calm with slow rollers, the sky was clear and crisp. One of the men said "look up "I powered down the boat to idle and witnessed one of nature's marvels. Overhead we observed a dogfight between a Ring-necked Duck and a Bald Eagle. The panic-driven Duck "crazy Ivan" desperately trying to escape. The Eagles talons were inches from its meal, but the Duck pulled its wings back and like a bullet dove for the water, the Eagle followed suit. Down, Down the two spiraled to the Ocean's surface, a mad dash for the sea. 100 feet 50 feet 20 feet, the Duck with no hesitation broke the water's surface The Eagle spread his air braking wings to within a few feet of the Deep, his nails scratched the water. We all thought he had his prey, but the Duck had vanished underwater. We waited 5 minutes or so with the Eagle hovering above to see if the Duck would pop up. Never found out the outcome, nature is both beautiful and wondrous.

Phase I, nearing completion, undertook to stabilize and repair the building so it no longer posed a hazard. Phase II, which will start after the Board's strategic planning is complete, will address building use and incorporate final renovations. The project is a long way from finished.





Norbert Leser shared his steps for converting the online Wind into a more easily readable version on a Kindle.


- 1. Download the wind to your computer/device
- 2. Create an email message addressed to your Kindle account
- 3. Subject of the email is the word "Convert"
- 4. Attach the wind PDF to the email body (no other text)
- 5. Send email
- After a short while open your Kindle app and synchronize - the Wind should appear in your library!

To find the Kindle email account mentioned above, you need to open the Kindle app and go to 'App Settings' in your menu at Kindle's home page. It lists 'Send to Kindle Email Address' - copy/paste that address and you're all set.

LA ZUCCHINATA, OR FURTHER GIANT ZUCCHINI PROBLEMS SOLVED

Marcella Hazan's eggplant Parmesan recipe, reprinted here, works equally well with oversized zucchinis. The eggplant recipe calls for peeling and slicing the eggplants lengthwise. In the case of oversized zucchinis, to make them more manageable, peel them, cut off the ends, cut them in half cross-wise, then stand each zucchini half up on an end and slice lengthwise.

3 lbs eggplant (or zucchini—"eggplant" will be used hereafter for the sake of brevity). Vegetable oil Flour, spread on a plate 2 cups canned imported Italian plum tomatoes, well drained and chopped coarse, or fresh tomatoes, peeled, seeded and chopped coarse 1 tbsp olive oil Salt 3/4 lb mozzarella 8 to 10 basil leaves Butter Grated Parmesan cheese



Peel the eggplant. Cut lengthwise into slices 3/8
inch thick. Stand one layer of slices upright against
the inside of a colander and sprinkle with salt. Stand another layer of slices against it, sprinkle it with salt and repeat the procedure until you
have salted all the eggplant you are working with. Let steep in salt for 30 minutes, then rinse the slices and pat dry.

- 2. In a large frying pan, pour enough oil to come 1 and 1/2 inches up the sides and turn the heat up to high. Dredge the dried slices in flour, coating them on both sides. Do only a few slices at a time at the moment you are ready to fry them, otherwise the flour coating will become soggy. Fry until browned and drain on paper towels.
- 3. Put the tomatoes and olive oil in another skillet, turn the heat on to medium high, add salt, stir, and cook the tomato down until it is reduced by half.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 400 degrees.
- 5. Cut the mozzarella into the thinnest possible slices. Wash the basil and tear each leaf into two or more pieces.
- 6. Smear the bottom and sides of a baking dish with butter. Put in enough fried eggplant slices to line the bottom of the dish in a single layer, spread some of the cooked tomato over them, cover with a layer of mozzarella, sprinkle liberally with Parmesan, distribute a few pieces of basil over it, and top with another layer of fried eggplant. Repeat the procedure several times, ending with a layer of eggplant on top. Sprinkle with Parmesan and place the dish in the upper third of the oven.
- 7. Occasionally eggplant or zucchini Parmesan throws off more liquid as it bakes than you want in the pan. Check the dish after 20 minutes, pressing down the vegetable with the back of a spoon and drawing off any you find. Cook for 15 more minutes, then allow it to settle for several minutes before serving. Serve with extra Parmesan on the side.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

A Great Invention Vinalhaven Has an Inventor That Will Rival Bell

In a certain locality in town there is a cord stretched from one house to another which is used to convey messages and transfer commodities in daily use in families. The cord is an endless one, and so arranged that when the inmates which to converse they write out a message and attach it to the endless cord, yank slightly on the upper string and over it goes to its destination, and if you watch the string you soon see it whiz back with a piece of pork or a pint of molasses attached and perhaps return again with a little vinegar and another message for a washboard or a cake of chocolate. This new invention, as we said, is in daily use in this town in a certain locality and it's called the cable transfer. It was a big head that evolved the idea and will eventually revolutionize the telephone because it has the advantage of transferring packages. If you wish to borrow a toothpick, pull the string and back it comes with the article needed in a few seconds. The invention is now just under trial experiment. The patent has not yet been secured or we would give the locality that you might see it working. We are under obligations not to expose its whereabouts so we are mum!

Vinalhaven Echo November 22, 1888

A lady who is a prohibitionist asks us to write something about rum. Certainly everybody knows that the use of this vile article is most injurious, destroying man's brain and vital powers, filling graves and lunatic asylums. It's horrid, it's ridiculous, it's too bad. Would that we could put an end to... A friend has just called on us and offered us the use of his flask for a moment and it looks like good stuff. We will finish this article in some other issue.

Vinalhaven Echo November 24, 1887

Labor Day was a gala time for Vinalhaven and the weatherman turned on sunny skies after weeks and weeks of fog and rain. Everyone was out to see the parade which started the day's activities at 9:30. Fred Geary, acted as officer of the day. He was followed by the Vinalhaven Band, decorated floats, citizens' automobiles and "horribles". The float by The Buddie's Club was awarded first prize of \$35, and driven by Dorothy Cassie and Ellen Wareham, represented the "The Spirit of St. Louis." The second, "Fairyland" driven by Ada Creed, was awarded \$20. Miss Lida Greenlaw received third prize, \$10, for her decorated auto. Sports were held on Main Street. In the three-legged race, 1st prize went to Arey and Snow; 2nd Swanson and Coombs. Boys race, 1st Wilson; 2nd Coombs; 3rd Lloyd. Girls race, 1st Cecile Columb; 2nd Ethel Nelson; 3rd Ruth Clark. Old Men's race, 1st Marshall Salls; 2nd Winfield Gross. Mile race, 1st Andy Gilchrist; 2nd Neil Fletcher; 3rd Berger Youngquist. One hundred yard dash, Maurice Bickford; 2nd Malcolm Winslow. There was also a ball game, a Tug-o-War, an exhibition soccer game: score Scotland 3, Sweden 0.A broad jump, a high jump, shot put and a greased pig caught by Parker Sloan. The Mardi Gras held on Main Street in the evening made a fitting end to the holiday. The costume prizes were awarded: 1st Hazel Dyer; butterfly, 2nd Marguerite Pierce; Bo Peep, 3rd Rita Greenlaw; Rose. This was follow by a ball in the Memorial Hall, music by Lane's Orchestra.
