

We know that many of you are anxious to know when you will be able to get the COVID-19 vaccine. The state of Maine has provided an update on vaccination phases for patients that begin February 1st. ICMS is committed to giving all vaccines we receive from the state as quickly as they arrive. **We are in this together.** Our shared goal is to get as many people vaccinated as soon as possible.

We will notify you directly when you are eligible for the vaccine based on the state's guidelines. Because currently vaccines are only available to Maine residents, you may be asked about your residency when we call you to make your appointment for your vaccine. Documentation of Maine residence can include any of the following: Maine driver's license, a bill with your name and local Maine address; a letter from your employer verifying your employment in Maine, or another piece of mail that shows a local Maine address. You may be asked to provide this information when you come to the vaccine clinic.

We are currently in Phase 1b-1 which includes patients of record who are 70 and older. We will be holding a vaccination clinic on Saturday, February 13th at the Vinalhaven School, *by appointment only*. Anna Clapham will be calling you from an ICMS cell phone, which may come up as a Brunswick, Maine phone number on your caller ID. We have been told by the state to expect significant limitations on the vaccine supply. We will contact groups of eligible patients as vaccines arrive by phone.

We do not know when the state will allow us to begin offering the vaccine to anyone other than those who are 70 and older. We will share that information with you when we have it.

We are working very hard to place special focus on getting vaccines to patients who are the most vulnerable to the virus. The risk stratification is based on **age and the number and severity of conditions**.

Our shared goal is to get everyone vaccinated. This will likely take several months. The state will be working in stages so that one group may not be fully vaccinated before they move forward with the next approved groups.
