How do we love thee, let us count the ways — chunky, clear, creamy, low fat, with spice, naturally sweet, served hot, or sometimes cold. A hot bowl of your favorite soup can help drive away those winter blues. Please send in a favorite soup recipe, for Jan. and Feb. Here is one to get you started

Butternut Squash Soup

3 T butter

2 T chopped onion

1 med carrot, peeled/chopped

3 T all-purpose flour

4 C warm chicken stock

2 lbs butternut squash, peeled seeded & cut into chunks

1 clove garlic

1 T dried parsley

1 1/2 C milk

1/2 C cream

Maple Syrup to taste

Chopped fresh parsley, salt & freshly ground pepper to taste

In large pot, melt butter over med-low heat, add onion & carrot, cook until tender. Sprinkle veg. with flour, stir constantly, continue cooking for 3 min. Remove pot from heat, add stock. Then add squash, garlic & parsley, and simmer, covered until squash is soft (45 min) Cool. In blender/food proc., puree mixture until smooth. Return to pot, add cream, milk & syrup. Stir, heat through and garnish to taste


The Little Food Pantry has moved!



Vinalhaven Students Working on Local Boat

The Vinalhaven School shop class is working on a boat owned by Vinalhaven resident James Dickey. The boat is a 19-foot Seaway from the 1970's.

Students in the shop class have been learning to use bondo, fiberglass, resin, hardener, marine paint and hand power tools to work on the boat, all under the supervision of Vocational Teacher Steve Burgess.

They have been installing the boat's frame and deck to make it sturdy and usable. The boat is in a cradle that was made by a previous shop class so that the boat is easier to access and work on, and for safety.

The work is being done outside, mainly for airflow to move the dust around and the heat of the sun to quickly dry the materials.


"I have worked on five boats before and know what is required to be done," said Burgess. "The customer is paying in full for all of the materials."

Burgess continued. "I expect and know that some kids already know and use the techniques and materials and that some don't, but that's ok because they learn from each other and help out as much as they can."

Senior Colby Beverage is taking shop class for his second year. "I started working on it last year, fiber glassing and painting, so a lot of it isn't new to me," he said.

The boat is expected to be finished by June and ready to be further modified by Dickey.

Harbor Master Notice: Permits Required to Use Public Floats & Long-term Parking

As of January 1, 2022, Permits must be obtained to use the (3) three floats provided by the Town located at the Ferry, Fish Plant Wharf, and the Downtown Parking Lot Wharf for more than 2 hours. There is NO FEE! There is a limited number of permits available and specific requirements are as follows:

Fish Plant Wharf Float – only a person possessing a current commercial fishing license, a commercial fishing industry license, or working for a company that supports the fishing industry may obtain a punt tie-up permit. Only punts with a permit are allowed to tie-up at the Fish Plant Wharf.

Downtown Parking Lot Float —
There will be a limited number of permits available for commercial Fishing license holders ONLY. Only punts with a permit are allowed to tie-up at the Downtown Parking Lot Float.

Ferry Wharf Float – There will be a limited amount of punt tie-up permits available for commercial fishing license holders or residents of Vinalhaven's outer islands. Only punts with a permit are allowed to tie-up at the Downtown Parking Lot Float.

Punts tied-up for ALL 3 floats must be registered (that have a motor) and be16 feet or under.

Permit Stickers must be attached to the punt/skiff, preferably beside the registration sticker.

All other punts/skiffs have a maximum of 2 hours only at any of the 3 floats. The end of the floats at the Ferry and Downtown are for Pick-up and drop off ONLY.

Any extension of time at these two float areas must be approved by the Harbor Master or Deputy Harbor Master.

No equipment is to be left at any float at any time. (Traps, rope, crates, trash, etc.)

Floats are to be used at your own risk. Permits are issued for the calendar year January 1 to

December 31, on a first come first serve basis.

Fish Plant Wharf Long Term
Parking Permits are also required
as of January 1, 2022. There is No
Fee. There are a limited number
available for long-term use. They are
also for the calendar year, January 1
to December 31.

All Long-Term Parking needs to be parked parallel to the paved road, Vehicles ONLY – no trailers! Long Term Parking Permits are needed if parking for over 48 hours only.

All vehicles, trailers, equipment, etc. have a 48-hour time limit. All autos must be parked at least 40 feet from the front of the Wharf to allow for wharf accessibility.

If you would like a copy of the Harbor Ordinance, please stop by the Town Office, or see me and I will get you one.

Islands Community Medical Services announces the launch of a new Remote Patient Monitoring (RPM) service for hypertension. This service provides continuous tracking of a patient's blood pressure and related signs and symptoms and alerts the patient's healthcare provider to changes that warrant attention. Using secure digital conferencing technology, patients can now manage their health and stay in touch with their provider - all without setting foot in a doctor's office.

Remote monitoring enables a provider to intervene quickly when necessary and focus resources on the patients who need care the most. This can improve patient health and safety and decrease unnecessary, costly utilization, such as ER visits and hospital admissions. Upon enrollment in ICMS's RPM, an individual receives a kit, including a monitoring device and blood pressure machine. The biosensors send readings to the monitoring device, which transmits the data to a BlueStar monitoring center, staffed by trained clinicians. The patient's ICMS provider is notified immediately if data indicate medical intervention is needed, as determined in advance by the provider for the individual patient.

ICMS is partnering with BlueStar Telehealth, a healthcare technology company, to use its remote monitoring platform and devices. In business since 2013, BlueStar serves thousands of families across all 50 states. The business is Service-Disabled-Veteran-Owned and certified by the Veterans Administration. Its CEO and COO are retired two-star admirals. BlueStar's board of advisors consists of 15 generals and admirals from the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, and Coast Guard, including doctors and nurses. BlueStar has won commendations from the Small Business Association, the Governor of Maryland, and the Better Business Bureau.

BlueStar's CEO, retired Admiral Robert Wray, said, "We're delighted to be able to help Islands Community deliver remote care to their patients in their homes. It's good for patients, and good for the healthcare system as a whole to be able to manage health in the home, rather than react to health crises in the Emergency Room."

"Plus," he added, smiling, "As a New Englander myself, we always like to help out fellow Patriots and Red Sox fans!"

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Recently Henry Duncan and Willard Carver of North Haven were carrying lumber across the Thoroughfare, loaded upon two boats connected by the lumber reaching across each. The boats were so over-loaded that they filled and sunk, leaving the two men upon the little pile of lumber out in the middle of the waters of the Thoroughfare and no way to reach the shore. After hours of weary waiting, while they were drifting helpless and alone, a boat happened their way and relieved them from their uncontrollable craft and assisted them in towing it to the shore. Vinalhaven Echo Jan. 5, 1888

The ending of the old year 1918 marks an epoch in the history of Vinalhaven by the closing of the Bodwell Granite Co. Store. It was the oldest corporation of the town and the original company being Bodwell & Webster, established nearly 60 years ago: In 1874 it was the Bodwell Granite Co., Inc. The business was located in the Carver Block in 1879, where they continued to do business until Dec. 31, 1918. E. P. Walker first had charge of the store, then E. S. Bodwell, I. C. Glidden and F. L. Roberts. The store will open Saturday for a 10 days' sale of the entire stock, including fixtures. Courier-Gazette Jan. 3, 1919

The boat Verna G., arrived Monday from Rockland with a load of lobster trap stock, valued at \$600 for the Fishermen Co-Operative Association. The directors of the Association will meet with Wallace Young Thursday night. A scallop stew will be served. Courier-Gazette Jan. 27, 1940

Smith's and Small Fish Co., who have been making extensive repairs on their plant, will be ready to buy fish about the 20th of this month. They will deal in fresh, salt, smoked and slack salted fish. Courier-Gazette Jan. 19, 1915
