





Harbor Master Notice: Permits Required to Use Public Floats & Long-term Parking

As of January 1, 2022, Permits must be obtained to use the (3) three floats provided by the Town located at the Ferry, Fish Plant Wharf, and the Downtown Parking Lot Wharf for more than 2 hours. There is NO FEE! There is a limited number of permits available and specific requirements are as follows:

Fish Plant Wharf Float – only a person possessing a current commercial fishing license, a commercial fishing industry license, or working for a company that supports the fishing industry may obtain a punt tie-up permit. Only punts with a permit are allowed to tie-up at the Fish Plant Wharf.

Downtown Parking Lot Float –
There will be a limited number of
permits available for commercial
Fishing license holders ONLY. Only
punts with a permit are allowed to
tie-up at the Downtown Parking Lot
Float.

Ferry Wharf Float – There will be a limited amount of punt tie-up permits available for commercial fishing license holders or residents of

Vinalhaven's outer islands. Only punts with a permit are allowed to tie-up at the Downtown Parking Lot Float.

Punts tied-up for ALL 3 floats must be registered (that have a motor) and be16 feet or under.

Permit Stickers must be attached to the punt/skiff, preferably beside the registration sticker.

All other punts/skiffs have a maximum of 2 hours only at any of the 3 floats. The end of the floats at the Ferry and Downtown are for Pick-up and drop off ONLY.

Any extension of time at these two float areas must be approved by the Harbor Master or Deputy Harbor Master.

No equipment is to be left at any float at any time. (Traps, rope, crates, trash, etc.)

Floats are to be used at your own risk. Permits are issued for the calendar year January 1 to

December 31, on a first come first serve basis.

Fish Plant Wharf Long Term
Parking Permits are also required
as of January 1, 2022. There is No
Fee. There are a limited number
available for long-term use. They are
also for the calendar year, January 1
to December 31.

All Long-Term Parking needs to be parked parallel to the paved road, Vehicles ONLY – no trailers! Long Term Parking Permits are needed if parking for over 48 hours only.

All vehicles, trailers, equipment, etc. have a 48-hour time limit. All autos must be parked at least 40 feet from the front of the Wharf to allow for wharf accessibility.

Osprey's Enchantment of a Summer Resident

I am in awe of the guides who lead the VH Land Trust bird walks. They can identify birds from their song or flight pattern and differentiate similar species by slight differences in bird anatomy. While I marvel during the bird tour, I haven't regularly participated – we have guests who visit and often the bed seems so comfortable! So, my knowledge gained on a tour is fleeting and by the afternoon the bird names fade, and their songs become a medley. Obviously, I could not be considered a "birder."

However, when you spend the summer in a cottage in the woods, you begin to awaken to your surroundings and become part of it. We learned early that our neighborhood is the kingdom of Osprey. I don't know where they nest on the rest of the island, but I suspect they are well represented elsewhere as well.

On the Crockett Cove peninsula, they are here in force. We have frequented this area over several years and for the past three years observed the osprey for most of the summer. Earlier we often noticed their presence, observing a nest or watching them skillfully fish Crockett Cove, but it has been during these past couple years that we have begun to learn more about them. Their nests are easily seen, from the roadside or the water's edge. High up in trees or on top of towers are large interwoven baskets of sizable sticks. When occupied the young osprey can be observed with parents or when the male is off hunting, the female and later the babies can be heard screaming for food. The adult osprey can be seen from Tip Toe as they glide down the cove searching and diving for fish. When successful you see the classic image-the osprey with a fish beneath it in its talons, head first and tail behind. Osprey have a unique feature to them and owls, two toes in the front and two facing behind its leg that allow them to carry prey this way. When they are overhead, you can see them majestically soaring, but these are fleeting glances too soon obscured by the tall spruce. With more familiarity their presence is announced by their calls. Most times I can't see them or their nest, but their presence is obvious.

I learned the call of the osprey with the help of "googling" osprey calls. There you'll find plenty of You tube recordings. From watching, it became clear that the osprey were ever present on Crockett Cove and very noisy. Driving up to our cottage I could now locate the woods where they had a nest. Since they are diurnal, they can be heard and seen during the day. Their eggs are lain in April and May and are incubated in the nest for a month. The new birds remain with the parents for a couple of months. The most amazing experience for me has been to watch a young bird learn to fly. For the past two years, I have watched an osprey directly above our cottage, high up in the sky, madly flapping its wings but instead of moving it hovers in place. I expect it to plummet down on top of me, yet it somehow remains above. The whole while it is emitting ear splitting screams as if panicked and afraid of falling. After some time, as if it knew all along how to fly, it smoothly glides away. I feel privileged to have been able to see this critical life event of a young osprey. Once acquainted with our August neighbor I chose to learn more. Apparently, their diet is 99% fish, and no doubt Crockett Cove offers a perfect hunting ground for them. But once a fish is caught other birds here about, it is usually the eagles, can come to steal their catch. While I have not seen it myself, several others have described eagle-osprey battles. Several have told me of seeing a squadron of imperial osprey flying out over Crockett Cove to drive away eagles invading from outlying islands. The osprey are always here when we are but I have learned that like us they too migrate in the winter, some to South America or to the southern extremes of the US. Pairs mate for life and happily return to the same locations year after year. While they can live up to 25 years, 7 to 10 is more typical.

Our woods are usually quiet with an occasional blast of the ferry horn or the dinging of a buoy. But at times the air fills with sounds of osprey, crows, and jays. Then too there are the cheeps of smaller birds that dart around too fast for this inept watcher to identify. In all, it feels inspiring to blend into the sounds and life of the woods and to see the woods alive

undisturbed by man.
