

Parking Ordinance Revisions

The Board of Selectmen will be considering amendments to the Vinalhaven Parking Ordinance at the November 15th meeting. Among the amendments to be considered are limiting the number of hours someone can park on Main Street and the front row parking spaces in the Parking Lot to Two (2) hours. 





PRISCILLA ROSEN, OBITUARY



Priscilla Chilles Rosen (Hulla), 97, passed away quietly on October 12, 2022, surrounded by her beloved family. She had lived a long, good life. Kind and gentle, without a harsh word for anyone – she was also a survivor. A classy lady who looked her best whenever she went out – she did not like anyone making a fuss over her.

Priscilla was born on May 15, 1925, and grew up in a family of three boys during the Depression. She attended Vinalhaven schools, graduating in 1943. Early on, she became a caregiver, nursing sick family members and others. Except for a stint in a Whitinsville, MA munitions factory and as a telephone switchboard operator during WW2, she lived and worked on Vinalhaven. After the war, she married Navy veteran Fabe Rosen, a brother of one of her closest friends, and had two sons, Doug and Steve.

Priscilla treasured her grandchildren Yvonne (Beba), Emma, and Sam, and she was happy to be part of their lives. She was a second mother to Beba and spent many hours with Emma and Sam, who lived just a short walk away and often came by after school. She loved to do crafts with her granddaughter, Emma.

During her long life, Priscilla was very active in the Vinalhaven community. She was a founding member of the Vinalhaven Planning Board and a member of the American Legion's Ladies Auxiliary. She spent many years volunteering on the board of the Vinalhaven Historical Society. She was passionate about genealogy, researching different branches of her family tree back to the earliest years of Vinalhaven settlement, as well as her Chilles family, who had immigrated from Scotland just two generations before to work in the quarries. She was knowledgeable about antiques and collected depression glass and local memorabilia. Her ability to determine prices for older items made her a welcome volunteer at estate sales or tag sale fundraisers for local organizations. She was a member of several women's clubs on the island, which provided entertainment for her and her many friends, who gathered weekly for tea: to knit or play cards.

Hulla held many jobs on Vinalhaven over the years. She was a switchboard operator for the Vinalhaven telephone company until it was automated in the early 60s. She cooked and sewed for several summer families on Vinalhaven but especially for the Elisofons, whose daughters Elin and Jill remained close with her until her death. In the 70s, she ran Rosen's Spa, a small convenience store on the first floor of the Star of Hope building, and in the 80s, she cooked and was an integral part of The Haven Restaurant "family" until her retirement. After retirement, she enjoyed being a member of the Red Hats, who met regularly for lunch and traveled by bus through New England, and she also loved gathering with friends to play the card game "May !?"

In her final years, Priscilla made her home at the Ivan Calderwood Homestead of Vinalhaven Eldercare. She was beloved by staff and residents; family and friends visited her regularly and took her out for breakfast or lunch at her favorite places.

Priscilla was pre-deceased by her husband, Fabe Rosen, son Doug, brothers John and Harold Chilles, sister-in-law Astrid Philbrook, and brother-in-law Kaye Rosen. She is survived by her younger brother, Paul Chilles and wife Lauretta, son Steve Rosen and wife Alice Bissell, granddaughter Yvonne (Beba) Rosen, granddaughter Emma Rosen and partner Trevor Rhodes and grandson Sam Rosen and partner Molly Miller. She is also survived by many nieces, nephews, grand-nieces and nephews, and great-grand-nieces and nephews.

FOX ISLANDS ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE (FIEC)

CONSUMER ALERT: NEW LOW-INCOME ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (LIAP) RATE

FIEC consumers will see a new LIAP fee on future bills. FIEC is collecting this fee for the Maine Low-Income Assistance Plan (the "Plan"), which is a state-mandated program that provides payment assistance to low-income consumers and credits for consumers requiring oxygen pumps and ventilators.

The Plan is funded by an assessment paid by each electric utility in Maine. Until now, FIEC has paid the assessment with funds collected through its delivery charge. In response to recent changes to the Maine Public Utilities Commission's rules governing the Plan – which increased FIEC's annual assessment by 47% the first year – the Commission approved FIEC's request to collect the Plan assessment through a separate passthrough fee.

As noticed and discussed at the FIEC Annual Meeting of the Members, FIEC's assessment increased from \$18,717 for 2021-2022 to \$35,548 for 2022-2023. The 2022-2023 assessment will be collected via a \$0.0033573/kWh charge on monthly bills. For example:

Monthly kWh Use	LIAP Assessment Amount
100 kWh	\$0.34
200 kWh	\$0.67
300 kWh	\$1.01
700 kWh	\$2.35
1000 kWh	\$3.36
1500 kWh	\$5.04

The entire LIAP assessment goes to low-income consumers in FIEC's service territory and throughout the State of Maine; FIEC does not keep any of the money for other purposes.

A portion of the funds FIEC collects for the Plan is used to help consumers in need in North Haven and Vinalhaven. If you need assistance, Penquis (CCAP) administers LIAP funds and assists qualifying consumers with electric bills. Call (207) 596-1043 or visit www.penquis.org for more information.



THE OBSERVER

Approaching the national treasure that is Baxter State Park, we began to encounter signs that warned of the danger of forest fire. On this day in early October, the danger was low to moderate.

I'll bet there are signs like these similarly guiding the lives and helping to ensure the safety of the family of mice that live under each cabin at the various campgrounds. We stayed at Daicey Pond and had a wonderful little cabin next to the Ranger Station. The family of mice behind one wall of our cabin comprised five individuals. They kept out of sight busying themselves, much like ourselves, with the chores required to keep one's life orderly and efficient, a particularly necessary exercise when camping. Periodically the mice would peek in at us to see how we were doing, to assess the opportunity for venturing out safely for scraps. No doubt they also had a little sign, similarly quantifying the danger of apprehension or worse. The mouse charged with peeking-they probably worked in little shifts--I speak here of the breadth of service, not of the uniform of the day-although little folks do have little shifts-watched we big human occupants to see how we were doing, to make a judgement relative to how we were progressing toward the end of our day and the beginning of the theirs. Customarily, around 5 o'clock in the afternoon, we'd return from an invigorating hike up the mountain or from the forest glades we'd wandered and freshen up. During this period, highly charged down below, their little sign would probably read DANGER OF ATTACK HIGH/ DANGER OF CAPTURE LIKEWISE. After a while we'd have a drink and settle down to talk about the day and all the beautiful, often breath-taking things we'd seen. The peeker on duty watched from near the baseboard and probably made a judgement, always after we'd refreshed our drinks, that the alert be changed to DANGER OF ATTACK HIGH/ DANGER OF





The date will be Armistice Day, Nov. 11, at the Net Factory, beginning at 2 p.m. There will be wonderful attractions, such as "The Electric Maze," "Rainbow Doll Game," "Hoopla," "Blanket Games." Cakes, candy and ice cream will be on sale. The Vinalhaven Band will furnish music. The big picture "America" will be shown at the Memorial Hall in the evening, followed by a dance. Lane's Orchestra furnishing music for the evening. Commander Wilbur Coombs, Jr., is chairman.

Miss Ruth Guptill was the winner of the sweepstake prize on the "Double or Nothing" radio program Friday afternoon. The question she sent which was used on the program was: "To what mountain range does Annapurna, the highest mountain ever climbed (climbed by two men in 1950) belong?"*

Nov. 13, 1951

Kenneth W. Snowdeal, is with the 17th Airborne Division, when the division representing the Airborne veterans of the European Theatre of operations, returns home for deactivation. Pfc. Snowdeal is a member of the 507th Prcht. Inf. He served as a messenger in the 504 Prcht. Inf. and is a qualified parachutist. He participated in the campaigns of Sicily, Italy, Salerno, Anzio, Holland, Ardennes, Central Europe and wears the Purple Heart, six battle Participation Stars, Combat Inf. Badge. Presidential Citation, Invasion Arrowhead. The 17th Airborne Division is now composed of high-point men from all the fighting airborne units in the European Theatre. Although no one unit nor any individual took part in all the airborne operations the composite membership of the present 17th has taken part in each one.

Election of officers with Miss Anne Webster chosen president, Miss Betsy Kelwick as secretary and treasurer. Lunch was served by the hostess and a pleasant evening enjoyed Nov. 11, 1950

O. F. Rosen, FC1c, U.S. Navy has returned to his ship after a short leave with his parents. He holds the following decorations: American Theater of war ribbon, African-European theater ribbon, Asiatic-Pacific theater ribbon, three Battle Starts and Philippine Liberation Ribbon.

A large bookcase containing 100 richly bound volumes of Harper's Magazine, was recently presented to the Public Library by Mrs. Huntress in accordance with the wishes of her late husband, Alston Huntress. The books are in perfect condition and date back as far as 1852. It is a valuable acquisition to the town.

Nov. 5, 1929

The Maine Air Transport, Inc., performed another timely act last night when it brought Mrs. Marietta Winslow to the Knox Hospital. It was the first time in 13 years that Mrs. Winslow had left the island. Stanley Boynton was pilot.

Nov. 10, 1931

Vinalhaven people will be glad to know that the war bulletin service has been resumed at F. M. White & Co.'s Drug Store. The messages arrive each norming at about 9 o'clock and in the evening about 5 o'clock.

Nov. 1917

The first person to receive a Liberty Loan Bond in this town was Miss Elizabeth, little daughter of Mr. and Mrs. George Grey.

Nov. 1917

The Honor Flag won by this town in the 4th Liberty Loan Drive, is on display in the window of the White Drug Store.





Final Notice and Public Explanation of a Proposed Activity in a Floodplain – Vinalhaven, Maine

To: All interested Agencies, Groups, and Individuals

The Town of Vinalhaven, Maine (the applicant) intends to complete the following Proposed Action with funding from Northern Border Regional Commission's (NBRC's) State Economic & Infrastructure Development Investment (SEID) Program. NBRC has prepared an 8-Step Decision-Making Process review in compliance with Executive Order (EO) 11988 (Floodplain Management) as amended by Executive Order 13690 (Establishing a Federal Flood Risk Management Standard and a Process for Further Soliciting and Considering Stakeholder Input).

The purpose of the Proposed Action is to renovate the Vinalhaven Downtown area, which serves commercial fishing and supports the Town's tourist activities, which are the two principal employment sectors on the island. The project will remedy deficiencies in parking lots and boat launches and mitigate flooding impacts to structures and public infrastructure. This is aligned with the SEID Program's Transportation Infrastructure, Basic Public Infrastructure, and Resource Conservation, Tourism, Recreation priorities.

Components of the Proposed Action includes:

- Upgrading the Downtown Parking Lot and Improving the Boat Launch, which involves reconstructing the downtown parking lot located on Main Street, Vinalhaven across from Carvers Harbor Market (44.047308, 68.833475), improving the commercial and recreational boat launch, and repairing/replacing the bulkheads, which are located at the downtown parking lot. The purpose of the improvements to this site are to reduce flooding and support economic activity.
- 2. Preparing Net Factory Site for Eventual Repurposing and Construction of New Water District Offices, which involves relocating the current Vinalhaven Water District Offices to the existing wastewater treatment facility property located at 62 Sands Road (44.044985, -68.840564). The purpose of this action is to accommodate short-term offices for construction employees to support the project and to enable the site to eventually be repurposed for the benefit of the community. The future use of the Net Factory site is still in development.
- 3. Improving Working Waterfront, which includes improving the "Fish Plant" commercial boat launch (44.045297, -68.837313) and repairing/replacing the bulkheads along the "Fish Plant" parking lot (44.045019, -68.837577), which is located adjacent to the Fish Plant commercial boat launch on West Main Street. The purpose of the renovation is to build resilience to the impacts of sea level rise and increased precipitation and to support the commercial fishing economy.

The applicant considered the following alternatives in selecting the Proposed Action:

Upgrading the Downtown Parking Lot and Improving Boat Launch

No Action Alternative: The no action alternative would result in the continued deterioration of the existing parking lot and boat launch, making these key Town resources for both commercial and recreation use unusable. This would not address the Town's desire

to maintain key resources that support their commercial fishing and tourism industries.

Alternative Site: No other alternative locations for this project are practicable. There is very little undeveloped useable land in the direct vicinity of the harbor area, which is key to be able to continue to support the commercial fishing and tourism industries. A boat launch must be located in the water and therefore cannot be moved out of the floodplain.

Nature-based Approach: EO 13690 requires federal agencies to consider a nature-based approach when developing project alternatives. Nature-based approaches were considered as alternatives to the Proposed Action. However, no viable nature-based alternatives were identified that would still meet the needs of the Proposed Action.

Preparing Net Factory Site for Eventual Repurposing and Construction of New Water District Offices

No Action Alternative: The no action alternative would result in the Water District Office remaining at its existing location and no new development on the wastewater treatment facility site. If the Water District Office remains at its existing location, the Net Factory Site would no longer be available to support the Town's long-term goals for revitalizing the Downtown by adding additional parking, workforce housing, or growing commercial development.

Alternative Site: No other alternative locations for this project were practicable. There is very little undeveloped useable land in the direct vicinity of the harbor area. The existing wastewater treatment facility has some land available for development and is already a Town owned parcel, making it an ideal location for the office to be moved to.

Nature-based Approach: EO 13690 requires federal agencies to consider a nature-based approach when developing project alternatives. Nature-based approaches were considered as alternatives to the Proposed Action. However, no viable nature-based alternatives were identified that would still meet the needs of the Proposed Action.

3) Improving the Working Waterfront

No Action Alternative: The no action alternative would result in the continued deterioration of the existing parking lot and boat launch, making these key Town resources unusable. This would not address the Town's desire to maintain key resources that support their commercial fishing and tourism industries.

Alternative Site: No other alternative locations for this project were practicable. There is very little undeveloped useable land in the direct vicinity of the harbor area, which is key to be able to use this parking lot as for the commercial fishing and tourism industries. A boat launch must be located in the water and therefore cannot be moved out of the floodplain.

Nature-based Approach: EO 13690 requires federal agencies to consider a nature-based approach when developing project alternatives. Nature-based approaches were considered as alternatives to the Proposed Action. However, no viable nature-

based alternatives were identified that would still meet the needs of the Proposed Action.

Through the 8-Step Decision-Making Process, NBRC identified the potential for the Proposed Action to impact property, lives, and natural values. The applicant has identified the following to minimize potential impacts:

Upgrading the Downtown Parking Lot and Improving Boat Launch

Property Impacts – The Proposed Action includes renovations to existing structures currently located within the floodplain. No major expansion of the site into the natural floodplain will be done as part of this project. The design will incorporate improvements to the stormwater management systems on site to better drain flood waters after a flooding events. The boat launch will be updated with durable materials from experienced manufacturers to minimize future deterioration. The design will ensure the existing parking lot and boat launch facilities will remain usable for industry users.

Impacts to Lives – The Proposed Action, with repairs being made to the parking lot and boat ramp, will help increase safety, ensure access to the natural resources, and minimize impacts of flooding events on these facilities. By repairing these items, they will be safer for users to utilize in the future.

Natural Values Impacts – The Proposed actions are located in an already developed area of the floodplain. Improvements to the site will help drain flood waters of the site after a flooding event with improved stormwater infrastructure.

2) Preparing Net Factory Site for Eventual Repurposing and Construction of New Water District Offices

Property Impacts – The new building as part of the Proposed Action will be constructed with measures in place to protect the structure from flooding events. Electrical equipment will be located three (3) feet above the FFRMS floodplain elevation to ensure these items are not impacted during flooding events. The building will be constructed using water resistant materials to the extent practicable, including waterproof siding, a concrete foundation and potentially flood barriers. The existing wastewater treatment facility building on the site has flood insurance and flood insurance will be obtained for the new building, as practicable.

Impacts to Lives – By elevating critical infrastructure in the proposed building above the flood elevation, there should be minimal impacts to the users of the office space due to flooding.

Natural Values Impacts – The site layout will be designed such that drainage and infiltration are encouraged away from the new building. Additional impervious surface will be minimized to the extent practicable.

3) Improving the Working Waterfront

Property Impacts – The Proposed Action includes only renovations to existing structures located within the floodplain. No major expansion of the site will be done as part of this project. The design will ensure the existing parking lot and boat launch facilities will remain usable for industry users. The existing gravel parking lot will

be refinished with pavement and new stormwater infrastructure measures on site to better drain flood waters in the parking lot area after a flooding event. The boat launch will be reconstructed with durable materials specifically designed for boat launches by experienced manufacturers to minimize future deterioration.

Impacts to Lives – The Proposed Action, with repairs being made to the parking lot and boat ramp, will help increase safety on site, and minimize impacts of flooding events on these facilities. By repairing these items, they will be safer for users to utilize in the future.

Natural Values Impacts – Proposed actions are in an already developed area of the floodplain. Improvements to the site will help drain flood water on the site after a flooding event with improved stormwater infrastructure design.

It is NBRC's determination that due to lack of practicable alternatives and the importance of the Proposes Action to address the needs of the Vinalhaven community, the importance of the Proposed Action in the floodplain outweighs the requirements of EO 11988 and EO 13690 to avoid direct and indirect support of floodplain development and reduce the risk of flood loss.
