



The Glue of the School

Do you know who is the glue that holds Vinalhaven's school together? Amanda Wentworth is Vinalhaven School's secretary, and has been since 1995, when the school was still in the old building.

"I went to college, and then I took some online courses, and then Candy Frye resigned so the position was open, so I applied for and accepted the position. This was back in 1995," said Wentworth.

Some of Wentworth's responsibilities include relaying information via phone calls and emails, storing and managing nursing supplies, "especially ice packs." She's also in charge of school vans, sports logistics, and the lunch count for tardy students, among many other things.

Since Wentworth has been the secretary, the job has changed a bit. "Some parts are the same, kids still need ice packs and bandaids, but a lot more stuff is on the computer compared to the other building," said Wentworth.

What makes this job special to Wentworth is that "every day is a different day, no two days are the same, and I get to see the students walk-in as pre k, and I get to see them walk across the stage in June their senior year."

Wentworth has worked 9,490 days at Vinalhaven School, and some days have been more memorable than others. She described one of the most memorable.

"You know how dogs run up to the school? Well one day, there was this kid that came into my office saying, 'Ms. Amanda, there is a horse on the field', and I thought how come they don't know that was a dog?

So, I walked outside, and sure enough, it was a horse eating grass on the soccer field," said Wentworth.

Bryan Feezor is Vinalhaven School's vice-principal and former math teacher.

"Amanda is very crucial in the way that you could play basketball without your sneakers. You could still play, but you wouldn't play your best," he said. Becoming vice-principal has given Feezor a different look on all of what Wentworth does.

"As a teacher, I had a few ideas of what Amanda does. I think at some point every teacher says Amanda is their savior. But on the days Amanda is not here, I work twice as hard, but get done half the work," said Feezor.

Sometimes the people who warrant the most credit, don't get recognized as much as they should. "I think people really appreciate Amanda, but they don't tell her enough," said Feezor.

Going to Viking sporting events, hanging out with friends, and going on walks, on land trusts trails are Wentworth's favorite things to do outside of work.

Steller's Sea-Eagle's Amazing Journey


Everything about seeing a Steller's Sea-Eagle in New England is incredible. It's an awe-inspiring bird, about a foot longer and taller than an adult Bald Eagle and as many as five pounds heavier, a wingspan of eight feet, with a massive golden bill. It's rare: There are only about 4,000 of this vulnerable species left in the wild. And of course, it's not supposed to be here. Steller's Sea-Eagles are native to far eastern Russia, the Korean peninsula, and northern Japan.

How did this bird get to New England? It flew. The whole way. Will the bird stay in Maine, looking for a mate, new residence or move on? *Vagrancy*-the tendency for birds to show up far outside their normal range-possibly through loss of habitat, climate change or navigation failure.

The Sea-Eagles' journey so far begins with the first sighting on Aug. 30, 2020, in Matanuska-Susitna County, Alaska; second sighting was recorded on March 10, 2021, Coleto Creek Park & Reservoir, Victoria, Texas; third was Jan. 28, 2021, at Gaspé Peninsula, Quebec/New Brunswick, Canada; fourth was Nov. 3-4, 2021, at Avon River, near Falmouth, Nova Scotia; fifth was Dec. 12-20, 2021, Taunton River, Mass., and finally late Dec. into late Jan, 2022, at Sheepscot River, ME. (an update... the sea-eagle was sighted again on Feb. 13 & 14, 2022 from the Rte. 127 bridge connecting Arrowsic and Georgetown).

February 21, 2022 Presidents Day

President's Day, officially Washington's Birthday, in the U.S., is a holiday celebrated (3rd Monday in February). It is popularly recognized as honoring Washington and Lincoln, but also understood as a celebration of birthdays and lives of all U.S. Presidents.

The origin of this day lies in the 1880's, when the birthday of George Washington-commander of Continental Army during the American Revolution and first president of the U.S.-was celebrated as a federal holiday. In, 1968, Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Bill, which moved several federal holidays to Monday. The change was designed to schedule certain holidays so that workers had a number of long weekends but was opposed by those who believed those holidays should be celebrated on the dates they commemorate.

During debate on the bill, it was proposed that Washington's Birthday be renamed President's Day to honor both Washington and Lincoln (Feb. 12); although Abraham Lincoln's birthday was celebrated in many states, it was never an official holiday. Following discussion, Congress rejected the name change. After the bill went into effect in 1971, however, President's Day became the commonly accepted name, due in part to retailers' use of that name to promote sales and the holiday's proximity to Lincoln's birthday.



Browntail Moth Awareness Month

February 2022

This month has been recognized as Browntail Moth (BTM) Awareness Month in Maine to encourage people to take action to mitigate the negative impacts caused to both humans and the environment by this invasive insect. The Maine Forest Service campaign "Follow the Four Rs to Knockout Browntail In Our Communities and Reduce the Itch!" addresses the four important steps necessary to take action: Recognize, Remove, Recruit, Reach out.

Last week our add covered tips on recognition, and this week we're sharing information about the second 'R': Remove.

February and March are the best months to clip and destroy the webs of BTM, before the caterpillars hatch in April-May. Here's what you'll need to remove and destroy BTM webs:

gloves
· hand pruners (and loppers/pole pruners if available)
· bucket of soapy water or safe fire pit

Using hand pruners for branches in reach, and loppers for higher areas of the tree, snip off just the tip of the branch that contains the web (cutting farther back than that is unnecessary and damages the tree). Once you've cut off the webbed areas, make sure to destroy it - if left on the ground, the caterpillars will just climb back up the tree come spring. Destroy the webs by soaking in soapy water for a few days or burning them. BTM hairs shouldn't be able to cause a rash yet, but make sure to wash your hands afterwards to be safe.

Do you remember...For three decades, Maine viewers were treated to what might have been the first reality show, and it was very real.

It all began in the late 1950's, when Bob Whitten launched "Frankenstein's Country Jamboree" from Milbridge, ME on NBC affiliate, WLBZ-TV in Bangor. Amateur singers lined up to appear on the show that had no rehearsals or auditions.

Talent was not a requirement. One stationary camera meant viewers watched performers walk to and from the mike.

In 1972, Dick Stacey, Bangor gas station owner, took over sponsorship of the show, renaming it "Stacey's Country Jamboree." Dick did his own commercials, always using the line, "See these hands, they pump gas, and they stink."

Everything about the show was down-home. A little old lady from Bucksport named Jenny Shontell appeared regularly, usually singing "Wings of a Dove"-off key. But she had a big following. At least once per show, a guitar strummer in a fancy Western shirt would sing "Haynesville Woods" the trucking song written by Maine's Dick Curless.

Stacey had agreed to sponsor the show for a maximum of 13 weeks, but that stretched into 11 yrs. The show went off the air in 1983 when Maritime cable companies opted for feeds from Detroit rather than Bangor.



Portland Daily Press Feb. 3, 1881 (The light was also extinguished in 1873, 1896, 1905, 1907, 1908 and 1911)

On the evening of Feb. 17, the following party enjoyed bridge at the Darres Camp at Calderwood's Neck: Nina Ames, Dorothy Thomas, Annice Gross, Flavilla Arey, Phyllis Black, Catherine Calderwood, Homer Darres, Edward Ames, Sigvard Melin, Keith Carver, Alex Christie and Arthur Thomas. The ladies' prize went to Annice Gross; men's to Edward Ames. Sandwiches, cake and coffee were served.

Courier-Gazette Feb. 24, 1934

Seventy years ago (1868) the building now occupied by the L. R. Smith Co. clothing store sat on the other side of the street and was used as a cooper shop. Later it was moved to its present location and used by the Roberts Brothers as a horse net factory. A small el adjoining the building was used as a barber shop. In 1899, D. Rovinsky & Son remodeled the building as it appears today.

Vinalhaven Neighbor Feb. 2, 1938

Members of the Pleasant River Grange wish to state at this time that an agricultural Fair will be held on the Grange grounds at some date during the coming autumn. We ask the hearty support of the farmers and small gardeners of the town as well as any others who may be interested to make our fair a success. The fair committees will arrange for prizes for the best exhibits of vegetables, fruits, etc., and it is earnestly hoped that the boys and girls as well as grownups will raise something during the coming year to exhibit at the fair this fall. Watch for other notices and premium lists that will be circulated later.

Courier-Gazette Feb. 9, 1922

One of the first entertainments whose receipts were to be donated toward the building of the Memorial Hall was the Business Men's Carnival held in the Town Hall on October 27, 1891 in which a great many young folks took part. Vinalhaven Neighbor Feb. 23, 1938

Between the Light and Iron Point a gasoline boat of the Shell Fleet became caught in the ice. Tuesday last week seeing a flag of distress Leslie Dickey and Neil Burgess walked over the ice to the boat, and found the two occupants warm and very comfortable, thank you. The boat continues locked in its icy berth.

Courier-Gazette Feb. 17, 1934

News was received by Supt. Charles Chilles of the Leopold Paving Co. of the death of contractor Joseph Leopold of New York, which occurred Monday. Mr. Leopold has operated quarries for the production of paving blocks in this town for a great many years and employed large crews of workmen. His loss will be greatly felt throughout the community.


