Sprinkle over top of "cake" Pour 3 C hot water over, do

not mix. Bake 40-50 min. or until

2021-2022 Property Taxes -Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. Tax bills are sent to the owner of record on April 1st, 2021. If you sold your property after April 1st, 2021, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner. Payments are due on November 1st, 2021, and May 2nd, 2022. Dog Licenses - All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed. Otherwise, there is a \$25 late fee. 2022 Licenses can now be issued.

Vinalhaven Medical Center Destroyed by Monday AM Fire

A fire which is thought to have started from an explosion in an oil stove gutted the Island Community Medical Services medical center and the offices of Dr. Ralph P. Earle on Vinalhaven Monday morning. Also damaged was the MacIntosh Grocery Store owned by Andrew Gilchrist and the offices of the district nurse.

Considered a total loss was the office and equipment of Dr. Walter Conley, Rockland optometrist who visited the island several times each year. He shared adjoining offices with Dr. Earle.

The ICMS building donated to the group which serves Vinalhaven, North Haven and Matinicus by Mrs. Margaret Glidden in 1953, is a three-story wooden structure in the center of the community.

The second floor is occupied by the offices of Dr. Earle and the ICMS. The top floor was used for lectures by the island physician. This section of the building was completely gutted by the fire which raged most of the morning. The ground floor where the grocery store and the nurse's office is located sustained mostly water and smoke damage. Damage is expected to reach as high as \$25,000 for the building and contents.

The fire was discovered about 8:15am by Andrew Gilchrist who turned in the alarm. It was noon before firemen under Chief Richard Healey were able to start moving equipment back to the fire station, leaving one hose line and men on watch against an outbreak of fire.

Chief Healey observed that as near as he could determine at the moment, the fire started from an explosion in an oil stove in the second-floor offices of Dr. Earle.

The physician, whose home is elsewhere in the village, was called and was able to salvage only two medical bags before flames engulfed his office.

Lost in the fire was considerable clinic equipment owned by ICMS. Included was a complete dental clinic which the ICMS operates, an autoclave for sterilizing, an x-ray unit, records gathered over the years in various clinics and by the physician, the doctor's instruments, and surgical and medical equipment. Also, all office equipment and some Red Cross equipment recently sent to the island for home nursing training classed which were scheduled soon.

The ICMS group, all island people banded together to provide a medical center and services for themselves and their families, have raised funds to equip the medical center over the years with fund drives. The Vinalhaven Health Council has contributed funds earned with its annual Fourth of July celebration and has brought equipment and donated it to ICMS on several occasions.

The loss to the islands was a heavy one which momentarily stripped them of the medical services they have established for themselves.

A meeting of the ICMS, the Vinalhaven Health Council and the town selectmen was scheduled for Monday night. At that time, offers of other buildings were to be considered and plans made for reestablishing the medical center.

At Augusta, Col. Walter Kennett of the Maine Civil Defense was checking the availability of supplies and equipment from his department to aid the island people.


Richard Leavitt, administrator of Knox Hospital, called the island with the offer of help from the institution which he heads. Mrs. Reita Holden of the Knox County Chapter of the Red Cross was in contact with the island and the local chapter women were busy supplying a meal to the firefighters at noon. Heading the group who fed 45 firemen was Mrs. William Parmenter. Assisting her were Mrs. Winona Peterson, Mrs. Eleanor Conway, Mrs. Margaret Adams, Miss Vivian Hatch, and Miss Muriel Conway. Murray's Restaurant served coffee to the fire volunteers during the morning.

Mrs. Lucy Skoog, chairman of the Island Community Medical Services, and Mrs. Helen Webb, chairman of the Vinalhaven Health Council were prepared Monday to start the task of reestablishing the medical center with the help of the members of the organizations.

The work of many years by the two groups went up in smoke in a matter of hours and there is thought to be only a minimum of insurance on the property and its equipment.

The ICMS was founded in 1945 and has been a community project from the start with many people giving to its support in the building, its equipment and supplies and of their time and skills to operate the clinics.

Mrs. Marjorie Rascoe, RN, was the town nurse for eight years, leaving last fall to continue here studies in Michigan. The town has been without services of a district nurse since September. Another is scheduled to arrive in Augusta.
