- 1 T dry vermouth

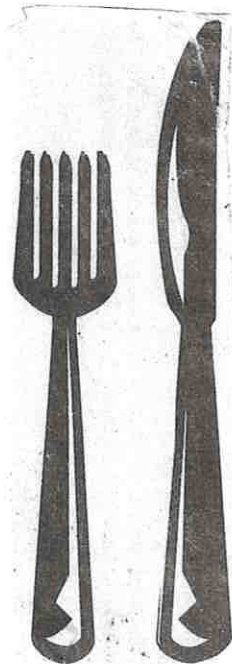

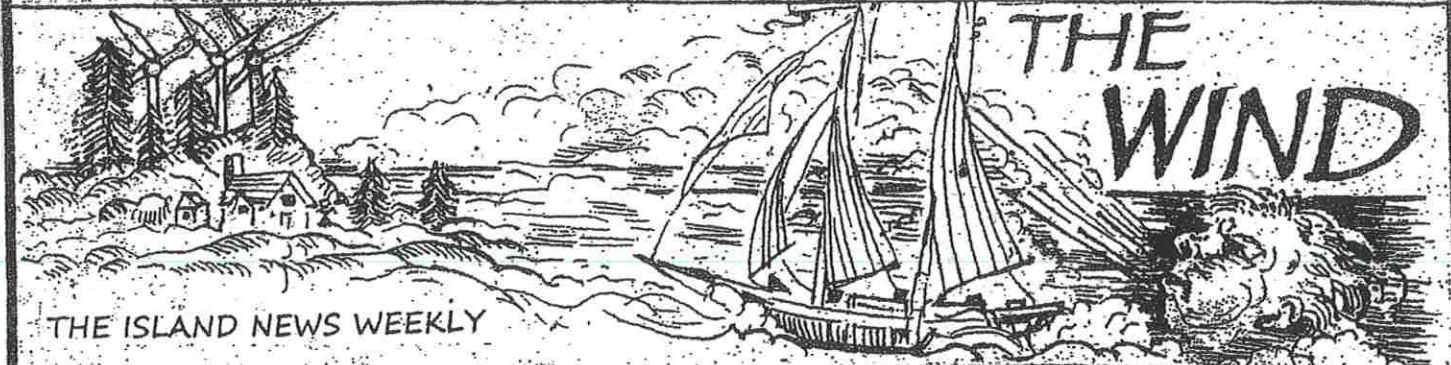

2021-2022 Property Taxes -Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1st, 2021. **If you sold your property after April 1st, 2021, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner.** Payments are due on November 1st, 2021, and May 2nd, 2022. Dog Licenses - All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed. **All dogs not licensed for 2022 will now have the \$25 late fee per dog.**

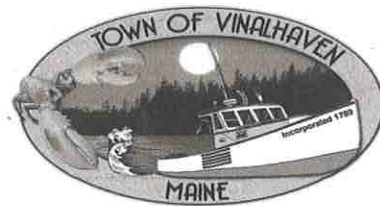

9 elders are having trouble finding housing
17 elders said their current housing does not meet their needs

13 elders said they would move to smaller efficient housing that meets their needs

34 elders expressed concern about staying on the island as they age

Support Needed for Elder Islanders to Remain in Their Homes

- Home repair or modifications to enable people to remain in their homes
- First floor apartments (currently living on the upper floor of a building without an elevator)
- Concern around accessing medical care on the mainland and emergency care
- Lack of transportation for those who do not drive and the cost of transportation
- Need for in-home programs to provide care, support and socialization for older people in their own homes

Hello Vinalhaven Adults,

Before you say, "No thanks!", did you know **SUBSTITUTE TEACHER** pay has increased to **\$110 per day? And lunch is included?** Yes, it's true. Questions?

What if I'm asked to teach a grade level or a subject area that makes me nervous? Anytime we ask you to substitute, you are welcome to say no. Better yet, just let us know what subjects and grade levels you're comfortable with. It's important to us to help you have a good experience. When you have a positive day, students have a positive day.

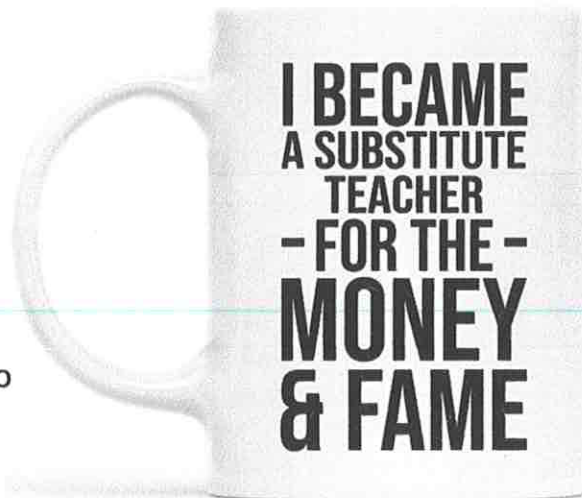
How do I sign up? Is there a cost? Contact Tina.Davidson@VinalhavenSchool.org to request an application. Or stop by. It's not a complicated form. The real challenge is that everyone working at school is required to have current digital fingerprinting on file with the Department of Education. Tina can point you in the right direction. We have just started paying for your fingerprint application, and we are working at creating options closer to Vinalhaven for you to get digital fingerprints. *Your cost is traveling to a fingerprint location.*

What else do I need to know? Before your first day in a classroom, we'll make sure you know the daily routine, where to find lesson plans, how to sign up for lunch, how to take attendance and our expectations regarding student confidentiality. If you have questions, reach out to the principal, Monte Selby: Monte.Selby@VinalhavenSchool.org

VOLUNTEERS. We'd love to have more help at school with specific volunteer tasks. Volunteers can support some of the elementary teachers with specific tasks like helping students sound out words in a book, or practicing basic math facts. Other ideas? Help supervise recess, greet students in the morning by opening the door and saying hello, help clean up snow/mud/water in the hallway after recess, help supervise in the lunchroom (open milk cartons), help organize books in the library, help prepare the fields for sports events, or read with a student during Drop Everything And Read.

Volunteers who work directly with children may be asked to be fingerprinted. If so, the school will cover the Department of Education cost and help you with the process. 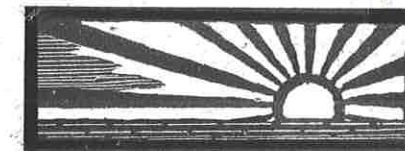

Penelope Lord received the following as an email from TheGlobalSilentMinute.org. She writes: For those of us who are devastated by Russia’s invasion of Ukraine, concerned about the possible consequences, and feel helpless to do anything about it all, here is one small thing that can be done by anyone, regardless of his or her belief system, either alone, at home or with others at The Union Church, every day at 4 p. m. after the bell has been rung.

Global Silent Minute: Silence as Action for Global Cooperation, Peace & Freedom, a brief history.

The Silent Minute was born from a conversation between two soldiers on the eve of a battle in the mountains around Jerusalem in the First World War. One knew he would not survive the war and prophesied the coming of an even greater conflict that would be fought out in every continent via ocean and air. He urged his comrade to provide an opportunity for him, millions like him, to assist from the “other side.” He said, “Lends us a moment...each day and through your Silence give us an opportunity. The power of Silence is greater than you know.”

The Silent Minute was instituted by his comrade, Major Tudor Pole O.B.E., during the London Blitz in 1940 as a moment to enter into Silence and to provide a portal for cooperation with an “unseen but mighty army” in the subtle realms.

The Silent Minute called upon all citizen of the British Commonwealth nations and territories on land, sea, and air to unite in thought—irrespective of philosophy or religion—in Silent Prayer for Peace and Freedom. Every night on BBC radio, at one minute before the hour, the bells of Big Ben signaled the Silent Minute to begin at 9:00 p.m. Tudor Pole knew that if enough people joined in the gesture of dedicated intent, the tide would turn, and the invasion of England would be diverted. Indeed, its success in bringing peace was acknowledged after the war by a high-ranking German officer who was quoted as saying:

“...you had a secret weapon for which we could find no countermeasure and which we did not understand, but it was very powerful. It was associated with the striking of the Big Ben each evening. I believe you called it “The Silent Minute.”

Ruth Bader Ginsburg: Born March 15, 1933, in Brooklyn, NY. She received degrees from Cornell and Columbia and attended Harvard Law. She had a very illustrious law career. In 1971, she co-founded the Women’s Right Project of the ACLU. She served on different boards of the American Bar Foundation, Assoc., and Journal. She was appointed a Judge of the US Court of Appeals (D. of C). Nominated by President Clinton as Assoc. Justice of the Supreme Court, she took her seat Aug. 10, 1993. She was the second woman to serve on the Supreme Court, a legal pioneer for gender equality. She died on 9/19/2020.

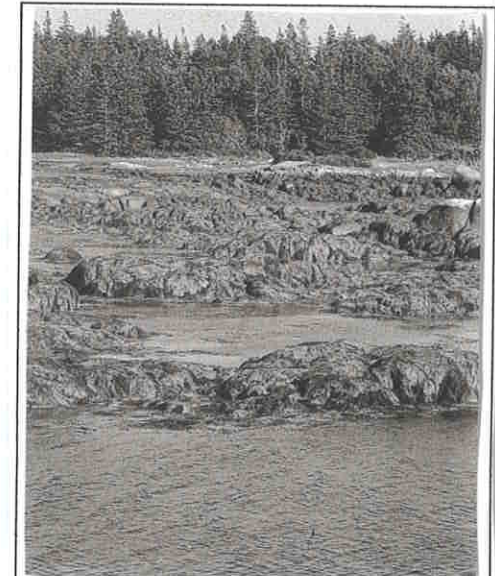

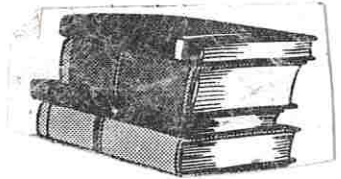

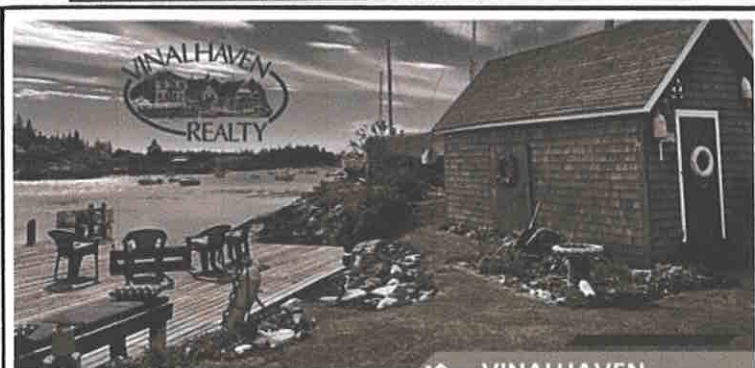


Fun Birthdate

Albert Einstein: Born March 14, 1879, which is easy to remember, because it is also Pi Day. The German born theoretical physicist developed the general theory of relativity. He left Europe in 1933 and became an American citizen in 1940. Among his awards was the Nobel Prize in Physics, 1921. He is generally considered the most influential physicist of the 20th century. He died 4/18/1955 in Princeton, New Jersey.

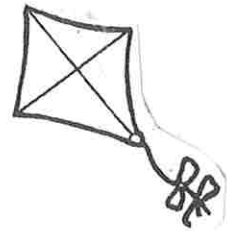

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Article from "Vinalhaven Wind" Jan. 26, 1884 cont. So modest is this firm in its pretensions, that it is not generally known that they are the inventors of many useful appliances in their line of business which they hold the right to. All the water used in their yard is pumped by steam, iron pipes leading the water to all parts of the building. All fish cured are handled by three-wheeled carts which were first adopted and used by them, and are now only used here and Matinicus. During the past year an icehouse has been erected with a capacity of 300 tons with arrangements so that ice can be placed aboard vessels with great speed and ease. The invention which we particularly refer to is that of a hydraulic press which was arranged by Thomas G. Libby, junior member of the firm which has entirely revolutionized the system of handling fish, which, in large measure the firm owes its extensive business today. This is the first and only hydraulic press used for packing fish in the country. (To Be Continued Next Week) *VH Neighbor* Mar 1, 1939

Solitary Family At Hurricane Island Has Unpleasant Experience. Ansel Philbrook and his 11 children at Hurricane Island had their supplies give out recently and they lived for several days on a very little dry corn meal. Capt. Philbrook was unable to get to Vinalhaven, but finally reached Heron Neck Light, where he was given enough provisions to tide over the emergency. Returning to Hurricane his craft became frozen into the ice. Keeper Robbins of Heron Neck Light telephoned to Vinalhaven and Capt. Robert A. Snow of Rockland who happened to be there went to Capt. Philbrook's assistance. He not only liberated the latter's craft, but went back to Vinalhaven after more provisions for the family. Capt. Philbrook's gratitude for this kindly act, for which Capt. Snow would take absolutely no recompense, knew no bounds. *Courier-Gazette* Mar. 2, 1920

The Silent Sisters combining with the different clubs of this town will give a fair and entertainment in the near future. The funds will be used for the purchase of markers to be placed in the several squares of the town, which will be named for our heroes of the World War, who made the supreme sacrifice. *March 16, 1922*

The twins that were born March 1 at the Ames farm were from Orrin Ames' cow and have been named Oscar and Allie *Courier-Gazette* Mar. 20, 1920

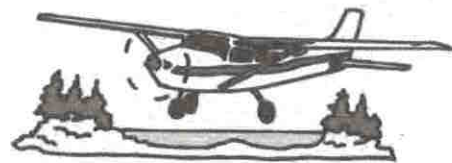

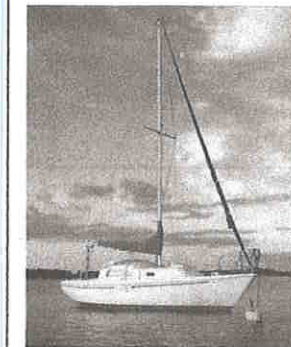
