Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Article from "Vinalhaven Wind" Jan. 26, 1884 cont...An idea A sleighing party Monday at Camp Alyosea, Shore Acres, of what this press can do may be had from the fact that the first year in business they packed only 528 1/2qtls. The past year the amount was 8,103qtls. A branch of the fish industry which has greatly increased of late is the method of cutting and packing fish in 40# boxes and crates for Boston, New York and neighboring markets. The total number of men estimated employed in vessels and boats catching for this firm is 660; total number employed in the yard is 4-16. The lobster industry has also been attended to by this firm. Last year they shipped 1920 barrels and placed 41,000 in Johnson and Young's lobster pound and paid \$13,990 for them, prices per barrel ranging from \$4 to \$11 equaling in some instances 25¢ each.

Vinalhaven Neighbor Mar. 1, 1939

Refreshments of ice cream and a beautifully decorated birthday cake made by Albert's mother, were served adding to the joy of the occasion. Albert received many nice gifts. Guests were Ladd York, Michael Bunker, Bobby Bennett, Kenneth Conway, Jim Dickey, Charles Dyer, Alfred Osgood, Lauretta Shields and Jacqueline Ames.

Courier-Gazette Mar. 29, 1952

Mrs. Lloyd Crockett was hostess Wednesday to the V for Victory Girls' Club with 12 girls present. Chocolate marshmallow sundaes were served.

Courier-Gazette Mar. 21, 1942

proved a most enjoyable affair. The weather was one of those perfect days in winter, mild, warm and sunny with plenty of snow for the ride. As a social gathering is never complete without something to eat, a fine dinner was served. Beefsteak, green peas, rolls, fruit cake, white cake, frosted (in spite of the scarcity of sugar) doughnuts, raspberry preserves, coffee, candy and nuts. The afternoon was spent in dancing and debating on the general topics of the day. Those present were Mr. and Mrs. Oscar Lane, Mr. and Mrs. E. C. McIntosh, Capt. and Mrs. C. E. Young, Mrs. Russell Whitmore and Misses Ethel Young, Erma Whitmore and Frances McIntosh. The ride home was a most fitting ending to a perfect day.

Spiders

My wife is in a fierce battle with spiders in our cottage in Vinalhaven. She sees them everywhere and when spotted immediately attacks. Being a man, I tend not to notice them or if I do, I am intrigued by their appearance or their constructs. They can be quite fascinating. I also feel a sense of alliance with them. After all they are trapping bugs which I encourage. There is no greater annoyance in life than lying in bed, drifting off into half consciousness and then hear the buzz of a mosquito in your ear. It sends all notions of sleep away and raises deep hostile emotions. The swat which follows never deals a killing blow. It just drives the monster away for a time. You are left with the anticipation of another attack. Just when your vigilance has waned, it comes back. A more robust response from you yields nothing again except perhaps a kick from your partner who is annoyed by disruption or her slumber and portents a day of grumpiness. It might return several times and either you give up, hoping that it will bite you and stop buzzing or it will find your bed mate. This experience has rekindled an interest in bug zappers but sadly that is not the solution. While these flashing, zapping gadgets kill plenty of bugs, they don't kill the right ones. The zappers attract bugs with light, but the mosquitoes are drawn by CO2 from our breath.

The spiders in the cottage accumulate over the winter as do other unmentioned critters. My wife's first sweep eliminates those in plain sight and over our stay she finds crevices and elevated spots that harbor overlooked inhabitants. Then on what seems like a daily basis spiders reappear spinning webs with great alacrity. There follows more energy and great agitation from my wife and words of disgust and great hostility. It is a bit scary to see this woman who is a warm and caring mother and grandmother and who devoted her life to caring for others in a career as a social worker exhibit such murderous rage. I know not to say anything and quickly find some chore, long on the to-do list, but now demanding immediate attention. Sometimes too a trip to Viking becomes critical for survival. Where I do see spiders as unsettling is in our bunk house, our personal euphemism for what has turned into a storage hut. Spider bodies are everywhere in the spring. I am amazed by the ability of spiders to reproduce without limit. This hasn't caused a real problem yet. I do a cleaning as best I can. My wife keeps proclaiming that we will clean out the bunk house bout for the past two years we have not made it that far. There are too many cottage chores yet undone.

However, I do have a genuine fascination with spiders, they reveal themselves early mornings when the dew covers the grass and I see a lawn spotted with dinner plate sized, glistening silver disks. I had seen these before, even at home but never appreciated what they were. They are much more noticeable and abundant here on Vinalhaven. These structures are made by spiders known as funnel web spiders or grass spiders. They construct a web with a funnel or cave at one end where they hide until a prey rest on the web. Unlike those beautiful nets spun by web spiders, these grass level webs are not sticky. The grass spider darts out to capture its prey once it lands on the filaments. It then draws its capture into the cave where it spends most of its life. In England, these webs are called angel hairs. I was intrigued to learn that some collect these webs by coating the filaments with spray paint or corn flour and collecting them with a sheet of paper coated with hair spray. This seems interesting but I know my wife's response to this artistic endeavor will not be welcoming.

My wife is not reassured by the fact that Maine has no venomous spiders. I believe she has a touch of arachnophobia of these harmless creatures that rid us of mosquitoes. Perhaps her encounter with a few of the sticky webs face first or a jumping spider may have had some unwanted effect, I gifted her a copy of Dana Wilde's, "A Backyard Book of Spiders in Maine." Perhaps if she reads it, she might grow to view spiders with more respect. In the meantime, I will seek out the many varieties of spiders I find in our cottage. I am looking forward to finding a wolf spider and watching it chase down its prey.
