





Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

The Carrying Place Bridge spans the narrow inlet where the waters of Pleasant River meet those of Mill River, on the Calderwood's Neck Road. Before the bridge was built the residents of Calderwood's Neck, when going to and from the village with produce or supplies, could not drive across the stream so were compelled to carry their goods to the other side; this could be accomplished on foot at low tide, but when the tide was in the material had to be carried in boats, which, we have been told, caused it to be called the "carrying place." The bridge was built in the year 1851 by the late Mr. F. A. Hunt who received \$73 from the town for doing the job.

Vinalhaven Neighbor Apr. 19, 1939

The retail price of lobsters has taken quite a fall since a few weeks ago, when lobsters could not be bought, even at wholesale, short of 35¢ a pound. The retail figures are now 25¢ a pound and there they will probably hang for some time to come. Shore haddock, which have been very scarce, are not in the market at 6¢ a pound. Cod have been extremely plentiful in the bay during the winter.

Courier-Gazette April 14, 1906

One of the most interesting and entertaining occasions of the year was the entertainment presented Friday night at the Memorial Hall to a capacity audience by more than 150 pupils of the first eight grades of the village schools. The colorful operetta "Gypsy Gay" was given by the pupils from the Washington Building, teachers Mrs. Erma Carlsen, Mrs. Marion Martin and Mrs. Ethel Doughty; and the amusing "Punch and Judy Show" by those from the Lincoln Building, teachers Mrs. Isabelle Calderwood, Mrs. Marie Teele and Miss Ruth Billings. The young people deserve praise for the excellent performance and teachers for the patience and work shown in the training. The baskets of beautiful flowers which decorated the stage were presented by Clark the Florist and Silsby's Flower Shop of Rockland. The proceeds will be used to purchase playground and recreation equipment for the schools.

Courier-Gazette April 22, 1947

Fifty-two thousand pounds of pollock were landed at the Lane & Libby Fisheries Co., Saturday. Courier Gazette April 5, 1910

A small family party was held April 3 at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Polk in honor of the first birthday of their twin sons, "Billy" and "Rolly." Twin birthday cakes, each with one candle, were made by Mrs. Polk and the twins received many nice gifts.

Courier-Gazette April 11, 1947

News was received this week of the marriage of Nina Davis, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. LaForest Davis of this town, to Henry Ewell, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ewell also of this town. The marriage took place March 31 at Newport News, Va., where Mr. Ewell has employment in the cold storage business. Rev. Manning Hank performed the ceremony. The bride was gowned in silver gray duchess satin and georgette crepe with head trimming. They were attended by Mr. and Mrs. Frank Ewell. The groom is a popular young man and was nearly two years at the front in France in the World War. The bride is one of Vinalhaven's smart and bright young ladies and both bride and groom have a large circle of friends who wish them a life of happiness.

The French Club held a tea Friday afternoon. Sadie
Gustavson poured, and Miss Phyllis Black gave a special talk
on formal tea etiquette. Patricia Skoog and Jean Kelwick
assisted the hostess. Marion Woodcock, Priscilla Carlsen,
Phyllis Bogren and Phyllis Robertson prepared the
refreshments. Other members present were Harriet Martin,
Helen Philbrook, Ada Dyer, Greta Skoog and Ann Robinson.
Courier-Gazette April 1, 1949

There was an occupant in the "Jug" Tuesday night and Wednesday morning he had to ante up \$10.79 (about \$315 today).

Courier-Gazette Vinalhaven Edition April 18, 1893

Thursday is the 100th anniversary of the birth of Gen. U. S. Grant, President of the United States '69-'77. During his term he visited the Maine coast in the Presidential yacht. Becoming fog bound, the yacht found a harbor in the Fox Island Thorough -fare. The Presidential party came ashore and spent the night at the Mullin House, now Haven's Inn. (North Haven)

VINALHAVEN

The Vinalhaven CTE/Shop students went with Mr. Burgess to Surry, Maine to tour the Wesmac boat building facility. Students learned about the different stages; from how the hulls are made from molds, to framing the deck, and finishing hull alignment. One of the boats the students observed is an oceanographic training vessel.

My great-grandfather bought a summer home on Vinalhaven in 1910 and my grandfather married his daughter and bought a house in, I think, the 1920's. So, he came to Vinalhaven summers from the 20's till the 70's and was a lover of the island. He also was an author and a Naval Captain. I inherited some of my grandfather's papers and this winter was going through them when I found this story which I thought might be of interest to Wind readers. —Banner Moffat

Occurrence in White Island Harbor During the Summer of 1813

As found on page 18 of "The History of Vinalhaven" published in 1900

Words originally transcribed by longtime Vinalhaven summer resident, Sandy Moffat (1891 - 1988)

In this, the second year of the war with England (War of 1812), our mariners were greatly harassed by the enemy and the coast was so beset by their warships that it was unsafe for any vessel to put to sea. In June or July an occurrence, of which the White Islands was the scene of action and the settlers of these islands the actors, will be of interest.

The British schooner "Fly", while lying in the roadstead at Owl's Head, flying American colors, had captured five or six coasters, two or three of which managed to escape by being run upon the beach, after having received orders from the Britisher to get under way and follow.

Eaton, in this history, says:

With her three prizes, the privateer stood out of the harbor and stretched across the bay towards the southern extremity of the South Fox Islands where, in one of the most romantic harbors on our coast (White Island), they all came to anchor. The sun had now set and a brisk northeast wind, which had been sweeping over the water all day, had died away leaving a long ground swell heaving in upon this rock-bound and apparently uninhabited island. In this secluded spot, in anticipation of uninterrupted security (a small whaleboat only being seen to have entered the harbor), the privateer commenced putting on board "The Oliver" (one of the prizes) the goods taken from the other two prizes. But by means of that whaleboat, it afterwards appeared, the inhabitants - notwithstanding the ominous silence that prevailed – had been warned of their close proximity to a British privateer, and as soon as the dusk of evening had begun to gather, men collected from every nook and corner with musket, fusee (flintlock rifle) and fowling piece, ready to give battle at early morn. At its coming, the men of the privateer were busily engaging in finishing that transfer of goods while the fishermen from their well-selected positions were watching unconcernedly these operations.

"What schooner is that?" cried at length a voice from the shore.

"The Shearwater of Baltimore; won't you come on board?" replied the Captain of the privateer.

"No, but we invite you to come ashore."

"I'll see you damned first!" replied the officer.

This abrupt answer caused a simultaneous fire from the land in all directions. The Captain of the privateer fell at the first discharge having two balls shot through his body. Taken so completely by surprise were the officers and crew that they sought safety below while their boat was ordered ashore and captured. There they were, 75 in number, driven from the deck and not a solitary being could show his head without being shot. But the inventive genius of man, always greatest when put to the severest test, was called into requisition and one man, stimulated by the dying injunction of the Captain "not to be taken", volunteered his services to cut the cable. He accordingly ventured on deck and by creeping along under the hammock mattings, succeeded in accomplishing his object. But while in the act of passing below the halyards of the jib and mainsail, he dearly paid for his temerity for the bullet of some correct-sighted fisherman shattered under his jaw. He fell but succeeded in creeping below. Changeable as fortune had thus far been to this luckless vessel, a ray of hope yet lingered among her crew, and an attempt to escape was resolved on. To keep in check some measure of the continual pelting which they were receiving, it was proposed to open fire from the main hatch, but in the first attempt to do this a well-directed bullet grazed the beard and lip of one of the venturesome Englishmen and lodged in the combings of the hatch. The plan was then abandoned as futile in the extreme.

But a gentle breeze and favorable current came to their assistance and by hoisting the jib and mainsail and managing to steer the vessel by means of a bayonet and musket thrust through the skylight, at length they got out of harm's way and finally made their escape leaving the brave and hardy fishermen of the Fox Islands the successful captors of the boat's crew and the three prize vessels.
