
I'm preparing for another awkward summer, day after day of folks who are familiar but nothing more, hurrying up to greet me, to ask about Elaine, about my kids and grandkids, about me, about how we survived the winter and so forth. 



## Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

A Husband wanted. Mr. Editor: Knowing that you are interested in the welfare of all your subscribers, and that you can never turn away from poor, suffering mortals without giving them what there is in your power, I have thought that perhaps you would do me a favor. I saw in the WIND sometime since. a list of bachelors. Now I want a husband. Although I may not answer every requirement, I can come so near that there will be no trouble on that score, I think. And to give some idea of my good points, I will say I am 23 years old, medium size, with blue eyes and light brown hair; a well-rounded form, such as men admire, and keep house in a first class manner. I do not claim to be a belle, but flatter myself that I can appear well in society, so I see no good reason, if some young man will come to my aide, why we can't "fee the parson." Now, I am not so particular about the size of my suitor as I am the size of his purse, still I would not wish him to be rich-ten thousand, and about six hundred yearly. A man with an amiable temper and good moral character, who is willing to rock the baby half the time. If anyone thinks that such a description suits him and that he will fill the above description, I should be most happy to meet him the first Saturday evening in May at the skating rink. F.D. Courier-Gazette April 4, 1947

A new store owned by the Atlantic & Pacific Co., was opened Friday by the local manager, Scott Littlefield Vinalhaven 1921

Miss Audrey Coombs took part in the State Prize Speaking contest Friday in Rockland. She was chosen to represent Vinalhaven High School. Her selection was "Camille."

Courier-Gazette April 8, 1941

An Amateur Night was observed Friday at Andrews Hall
(NH) with the prize in the teenage group going to Elaine Gillis and Elliot Brown, duet. Second prize to Douglas Stone, guitar and song. In the younger group, first prize was won by Brian Burgess, piano solo, second prize by David Joy, cowboy song and lariat twirling. Third prize duplicated because of equal applause, and given to Carol and Gertrude Beverage, duet, and Elizabeth Joy, Piano solo. The newly organized band, directed by Ira Curtis and composed for the most part of youngsters, ably assisted by a few older members, made their first public appearance and received hearty applause.
