Encanto follows Mirabel (played by Stephanie Beatriz), the only born member of a Colombian family, the Madrigals, to not get a magical gift. Often left out, she aspires for a moment to prove her worth to her family and community. When the family's magic appears to be at stake, Mirabel takes it upon herself to figure out what's happening and save the miracle. Her actions bring the family together, and help heal (or start the process of healing) old wounds that threaten to break the family from the inside out.

The film does a good job illustrating the effects of unhealed trauma, and how each member of the family is affected by it. Each Madrigal fills a unique role in the broken household. The scapegoat, the golden child, the mascot. All of them have expectations and traumas inflicted on them by their community and relatives, and each is unique to them and accurate to real world toxic family dynamics.

All of the characters' models are carefully designed with realistic hair and clothing physics, and meticulous attention to detail. An example of this detail is the designs on the characters' outfits that are connected to the powers each Madrigal has, like Isabela's flowery dress or Camilo's chameleons on his Ruana. The colours of the costumes are also used in the storytelling, with each side of the family being associated with certain colours; Mirabel's side has cool blues, while her cousins' side has warm yellows and oranges.

Each Madrigal also has a defined personality that comes across in almost every scene they're in, I can't help but be endeared to them. How could you not love the mischievous Camilo or the kind-hearted Anotonio? And of course, who could forget Mirabel, the optimistic young lady who loves her family with all her heart, and is trying her best to help them, even if they don't appreciate her efforts.

Lin-Manuel Miranda wrote all eight of the original songs in Encanto, from the upbeat introductory song "The Family Madrigal," to the beautiful "Dos Oruguitas" that tells everything you need to know, even if you don't know Spanish. Each song works to move the story along and many are done in Latin American styles, which Miranda hadn't worked in before.

The ending was a little rushed, and some conflicts were forgiven a little too quickly for the sake of a picture-perfect happy ending. Though, what can you expect from Disney?

Encanto is a well-written, well-designed film that does an excellent job telling a story many people overlook. It truly is magical.

Then each of the 5 are supposed to entertain 4 friends next who also donate 25¢ to the cause. Then these 4 are required to entertain 3 more an so on. If perfectly carried out the plan will net the sum of \$81. One of the first of these teas was held at Mabel Dunlap's last Monday and the second at Mrs. Nina Ewell's last Tuesday Vinalhaven Neighbor April 27, 1938

The Capital City Granite Co. is cutting the Trimmings for the Marymount College Building at Tarrytown, NY. The stone is the pink granite from the company's quarry near Isle au Haut Mountain. Vinalhaven Neighbor April 27, 1938

At the opening of the new store in the Carver Block, with Walter F. Lyford as proprietor, Mrs. Aurelius Calderwood was awarded a Betty Crocker electric iron and Abbott Martin, a Coleman camp stove. Courier-Gazette April 4, 1947

The Board of Health wishes to announce that from April 15 to May 15 has been appointed as weeks for everyone to "Clean Up" and make their premises neat and orderly, and all rubbish to be removed. Courier-Gazette April 13, 1922

F. S. Walls has had a cement walk of 153 feet placed from his residence across the park. The work was completed Wednesday April 27, 1917 To celebrate the 25th anniversary of their marriage, April 17, Mr. and Mrs. Albert Guptill entertained a party of friends at their home. Wedding cakes made by Ruth Philbrook, Mrs. Hazel Dyer and Mrs. Annie Geary were served with ice cream and punch. The evening was delightfully passed with various games. Mr. and Mrs. Guptill received many fine gifts. Present were Capt. and Mrs. Charles Philbrook, Mr. and Mrs. Victor White, Mr. and Mrs. George Geary, Mr. and Mrs. Irving Gamage, Mr. and Mrs. Lyford Conary, Joan Guptill, Mr. and Mrs. L. B. Dyer, Jesse Greenlaw, Mr. and Mrs. Frederic Hartford of Camden. The youngest guest was Hazel Ruth Conary, granddaughter of Mr. and Mrs. Guptill.

Courier-Gazette April 30, 1948

Smith and Mrs. William Shirley. Secure seats early to avoid the rush. The regular supper at 13 cents will be served in the dining room proper. The birthday table will be placed in the assembly room and decorated for the occasion. Courier-Gazette April 9, 1912

To celebrate her 2nd birthday, Ruth Ann Bennett was given a party Monday afternoon by her mother, Mrs. Clarence Bennett. A daintily decorated birthday cake, made by Mrs. Arthur Brown, was served with ice cream. Pictures of the happy guests were taken by Ernest Clayter, Jr., as they gathered around the refreshment table with its attractive pink and white decorations. Ruth received a number of appropriate gifts. Present were Leeanne Healey, Bobby Lou Conway, Gail and Beth Carleton and Nancy Tolman.

Courier-Gazette April 8, 1949

Stationed in France during WWII, Vinalhaven native Staff Sargent Colon L. Winslow (1917-1995) was assigned to the 23rd Depot Repair Squad that repaired and maintained the famous "Norden" bomb sight used on the "Iconic" American B-17 Bomber!

Retuning to civilian life Colon moved to North Haven, ME, and married Phyllis Marie Waterman (1948) and became that islands mail delivery man.

menu was as follows: Soup, tomatoes, cauliflower, omelets, roast duck, cherries, steak, salad. chocolate pudding, apple pie, fruit salad, fresh fruit and coffee.

They took pictures of us in front of the Eiffel Tower and other places of note. They are going to give us copies of the pictures as soon as they are finished.

There was a young married couple visiting hosts and they wanted us to come to their home the following Sunday to dinner so we all went. They had pea soup, omelets, and a dish I never heard of before—calf's head: then we spaghetti, fruit salad, cake and coffee.

I would like to go to Paris again sometime when the stores are open but don't know if I will be able to get there or not.
