is for Carver's Millstream Bridge- In the 1839 town warrant, a request was made to build a bridge across the Millstream (on Main St.), wide enough to accommodate teams of horses. No action was taken on the article. In 1841, several citizens petitioned the County Commissioners pleading to have a bridge constructed. Once again, town members vetoed the idea. It wasn't until 1849 that a contract was awarded to John Carver, to build the bridge, for which he was paid \$300.





Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Marilyn Gay Johnson celebrated her 4th birthday at the Down Easter Inn, home of her grandmother Mrs. Vera Johnson. Marilyn in her yellow organdy dress was a charming little hostess meeting each guest at the door eagerly reaching for the gift wrapped package saying "Happy Birthday to me." The time was happily passed with balloons until one little miss was heard to say to her mother, "where is the ice cream?" The group formed a line and marched into the dining room, where Mrs. Charles Chilles and Mrs. George Geary sat at the head of the table honored guests of Marilyn. Douglas Rosen was the Beau Brummell with his Scotch bow tie, red corduroy coat and gray slacks, Cynthia Conway with her silver curls and big blue eyes was becomingly gowned in a ruffled blue dress, Sandra Webster in her chic blue dress with plaid petticoat, Ruth Ann Bennett in dark blue taffeta very swish, Tamara Hopkins with sandals the envy of each and every girl there, Lucy Dyer with her apple blossom complexion complimented by a ruffled pink taffeta, June Bennett with her lovely long curls in a smart blue plaid, Linda Johnson in aqua pique. When seated around the table with their your mothers made a very pleasing picture. The table had a centerpiece of a miniature garden, donkey cart full of candy, tiny wheelbarrows, watering pots and rakes. Two birthday cakes with their roses and candles made by her mother and grandmother. Individual birthday cakes with lighted candles and a basket of goodies at each place setting. It was truly a garden of lovely little faces.

Courier-Gazette May 4, 1949

The "Giggle Girls" met Wednesday night with Miss Judy Clayter. Miss Lois Romer was admitted to membership. Lunch was served. Courier-Gazette May 11, 1948

Courier-Gazette May 13, 1952

Our Milkman met with an accident on Sunday, the 8th. Shortly after leaving home his horse took fright at something on the road, and shied to one side, upsetting the cart and spilling every drop of milk. Loss about \$9.00




