





days that they do not occasion much comment, but it did yesterday morning when our faithful Green's Island Correspondent called up to say that a cow moose had been contentedly grazing near Heron Neck Light Station. In the past 16 years the island had sheltered but one other wild animal, to the knowledge of man, and that was a fox. Judge then, the astonishment of the little island colony when the members of it saw this big moose stalking majestically around, with water dripping from its sides, doubtless of a recent swim, probably from Vinalhaven, where a moose had aroused much curiosity the previous day. The visitor arrived before sunrise, and remained in the community the better part of an hour. As the island contains about 300 acres, and is quite heavily wooded, it is more than likely that the moose is still CG Sept. 29, 1927 within the precincts of that domain.

Mrs. Minnie Smith entertained Thursday at a neighborhood children's picnic on Kittredge's Hill. About 30 were present. They enjoyed the playground which has recently been made possible for the boys and girls by Archie Beggs to whom much CG July 9, 1927 credit is due to his kindness and work.

June 25, 2021 is the 232nd anniversary of Vinalhaven as an incorporated town.

A Strange Visitor: Moose are so plentiful in Knox County these MATINICUS ROCK: It may be interesting to some to know the fog whistle at this station for the month just passed sounded 327 hours and 15 minutes; and today, Aug. 1, we are listening to the same melodious whistle. July 1926, the whistle sounded 157 hours, and July 1925 we got 229 hours. A picnic party came from Matinicus Saturday much to our delight. This is the second picnic party to visit us this summer. A number of persons get an idea Matinicus Island and Matinicus Rock are one and the same place, but there are 5 miles between, all salt water. CG Aug. 4, 1927

Vehicles are not to extend beyond the guardrail. Vehicles beyond the appointed standby line (the length of the guardrail) are not considered. 

My family spent every summer with my grandparents on the shores of Lake Michigan. We called my grandfather "Fafa" and my grandmother "Gama." Fafa (Harry Stiles) was an amateur naturalist. During the off seasons from 1952 (when we were 5 and 7) to 1955, Fafa would write letters to entertain us and maintain our interest in nature. I recently found copies of those letters in an old box of papers. Here is the fifth one in the series. Enjoy!

The Black Snake

Hello children,

Remember the black snake that grandma found in the pump house at the cottage and Fafa caught it? We put it in a cage and kept it for a few weeks and then let it go. It quickly disappeared in the stones of the foundation.

Well tonight I have a story to tell you about that snake. A couple of weeks ago Fafa was in the basement of the cottage and noticed back in the corner hanging over the pipe from the furnace what looked like a piece of cloth. Was he angry! To think that someone would be so careless as to hang a cloth on a pipe when it might catch fire. So Fafa stormed over to remove it and what do you think it was? Our old black snake had climbed up on the pipe to shed its skin. I am sure from the size of the skin that it was the same snake. The skin is quite perfect and you can see it next summer.

Isn't it funny that a snake sheds its skin, but then a lot of animals do. Remember how many insects grow by shedding their skins for new and bigger ones. Well, old Mr. Snake does the same thing. As he grows and his skin gets too small for him, he just grows a new skin of the proper size underneath the old one and sheds the old one. (Wouldn't it be funny if we could crawl out of our clothes when we grow out of them and have a whole new outfit underneath?)

In shedding its skin, Mr. Snake literally turns its skin wrong side out as he crawls out of his skin. First the skin becomes loose around his head and then he rubs himself against stones or bushes or anything he can find. The skin finally gets comes off entirely and it is the turned the wrong side out, just like when you take your socks off, only Mr. Snake doesn't stop to turn it right side out again because he is never going to reuse it.

I bet you were wondering how, if the skin was already too small, he ever gets out of it. It doesn't stretch like your socks! It's really pretty simple when you remember the snake is scaly. The skin fits around each scale lapping over the edges. When it loosens, it flattens out and becomes bigger around it sort of like a pleated skirt of mommy's. When the pleats are all pressed it fits and but those pleats get mussed and unpressed, the skirt gets two times too big. The skin comes off completely except for the mouth parts. You can see the entire shape of the snake even a part of the skin that covered Mr. Snake's eyes.

Generally I can find some good for all animals and the reason for them in nature. I am not too sure about snakes, but not because some kinds are poisonous. After all, we have poisonous plants, but we learn what they are and how to avoid them. We also just have to learn about poisonous snakes and avoid them. True the snakes eat lots of rodents, especially those bothersome little field mice, but they also eat birds and bird eggs. We should not condemn any animal just because he eats other animals for that is part of the balance in nature and even our favorite birds eat other animals. As long as we have snakes we should learn to know them and not be like so many people who have a hysterical fear of them.

There's one very funny snake that I must tell you about called a hog-nose snake. He wants to seem like a vicious old fellow, so if he is molested, he raises his head high. He can make it twice as wide as it really is. Then he blows out air with an awful hiss. He might strike furiously, but as often as not he forgets to open his mouth! If this doesn't scare you away, he has another tactic. He drops his head into the dirt and rolls over on his back. He sure looks like a dead snake. You can pick him up and he is limp and seems lifeless. But you can fool him into showing he is not dead. Someone must have told all Mr. hognose snake that a dead snake always lies on his back. But if you put him back on the ground on his belly, he quickly shows he's alive by turning over on his back. Foolish fellow isn't he?




Would you encourage a student to consider opening their own business?



How often do you have the opportunity to work with high school students?


