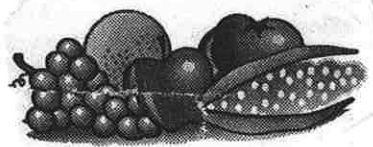

Rhubarb Pineapple Jam

3 cups rhubarb, cut fine
 1 cup crushed, drained pineapple
 4 cups sugar

Put ingredients in a porcelain pan on medium heat. Let come to a boil and cook for 12 minutes or more, until pineapple is tender. Stir frequently to prevent scorching. Take from stove top and stir in 1 pkg. of strawberry gelatin. Stir in gelatin until dissolved. Pour into jelly glasses and cool for 30 minutes. Then seal.

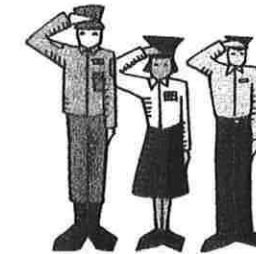

Vinalhaven M.S.F.S. Standby Line Policy

The standby line, located along the guardrail on the road opens at 6:00 a.m. **WORLD CLOCK TIME.** Vehicles are not allowed to line up anywhere in the standby line until 6:00 a.m. sharp.

Passengers must be inside their vehicles, with tickets 30 minutes prior to scheduled departure time. Anyone not in their vehicles 30 minutes prior to sailing time will be directed to the end of the line. Vehicles are not to extend beyond the guardrail. Vehicles beyond the appointed standby line (the length of the guardrail) are not considered. If you do not get on the ferry you may leave your vehicle as long as you intend to travel on the next departing ferry and are in your vehicle 30 minutes prior to the next scheduled departure time.

The standby is a first come, ability to fit, first serve basis.

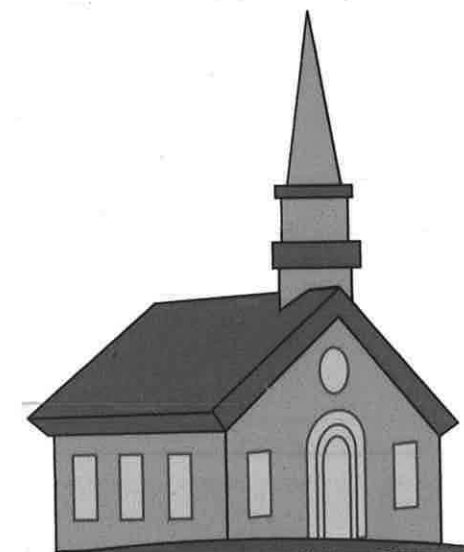

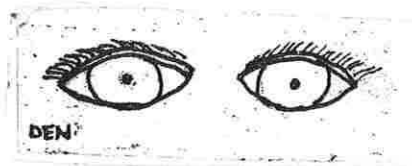

During the off seasons from 1952 (when we were 5 and 7) to 1955, Fafa would write letters to entertain us and maintain our interest in nature. I recently found copies of those letters in an old box of papers. Here is the third one in the series. Enjoy!

The Bittern October 9, 1952

Hello children,

I promised some time ago to tell you about the bittern that landed for an overnight stop in the pool at the new cottage.

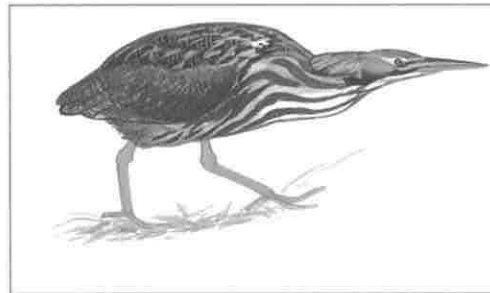
One night I was working in my shop "when out on the lawn there arose such a clatter" and it wasn't Santa Claus either.

I didn't know whether to be scared or not, but I sure had to investigate.

After I turned on the outside lights, I searched and found old Mr. Bittern sitting on the pipe in the pool. Gama and I had a wonderful chance to study him for he just stayed there and performed for us by twisting and turning and puffing and trying to scare us away with all his contortions.

Why he landed there I will never know, for ordinarily he likes lots of rushes and reeds so he can hide easily. Have you ever seen a bittern in the swamp? You have to have sharp eyes to see him, for he is colored so much like the reeds around him. He is a buffy brown, and even his front is streaked with light and dark brown so that it blends in with the reeds.

In addition, he stands there almost upright with his neck stretched out skyward and his bill pointed straight up. I bet you could look right at him and he was nothing but a large reed.



He is, however, a noisy fellow when no one is around. Do you know his song, or better, I should say the noise he makes, for noise it is? Some people call him the "pump-primer" and others the "stake-driver." Can you guess why he has these names? Perhaps you never heard someone priming a pump. Nowadays there are so few pumps, but when I was a little boy, all farmhouses had water pumps, and in fact even in the cities most people had their own pumps for drinking water. When one couldn't draw water, you had to prime it by pouring some water into it. Then you started pumping and at first the old pump merely said "oong-ka-choonk" until finally it took hold and water started. Well, that is exactly what old bittern says, "oong-ka-choonk" over and over. It sounds exactly like someone priming an old-fashioned pump. So, some people say, "there is the old pump primer."

Mr. Bittern is quite a ventriloquist too and it is difficult tell where he is located. You listen and you are sure you know exactly where the noise is coming from, so you quickly search him out only to find when you get to where you were sure he was, he isn't, but now sounds away across the swamp from you.

But where does he get his name of "stake-driver"? Well, there is something peculiar about his voice, and if he is quite a distance from you, you don't hear the "oong-ka-choong" but lose the first and last parts and only hear the "ka." From a distance it sounds just like someone driving a stake in the ground with a big hammer.

There are people who believe that he actually does drive stakes to show the boundaries of his feeding field. Of course, this is foolish, for Mr. Bittern never, never drives a stake, but it sure sounds like it!

One time I chased the noise of Mr. Bittern for a long time before finding him. Each time I was sure where he was, he wasn't. Finally, though, I found him and watched him as he primed the pump and drove stakes.

Do you children know anything about ferns? Well, you must learn about them. Do you know there is a Christmas fern, a ladies' fern, a New York fern, and Oh! - a lot of others. We must learn how to tell them apart.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Leon Crockett met with a painful accident Friday, when a can of varnish remover exploded. While trying to get the can out of the house, Mr. Crockett's right had was badly burned, but at last reports he was quite comfortable. *Courier-Gazette Mar. 8, 1927*

Mackerel have been in the harbor the past week and the space on the bridge between the old mill and F. H. Winslow's art studio has been lined with fishermen of all ages with fishing lines of all descriptions. Some big catches have been made besides the fun of fishing. *C-G July 28, 1931*

Saturday, another archery contest was given by F. H. Winslow at the West Side of the bridge. With so many boys enrolled it was best to divide in two classes, the Seniors from 11 to 14 yrs. and the Juniors 6 to 11, in the second group. The high wind prevented large scores being made, but the average was better than on Thanksgiving Day. Byron Thomas, an East Side boy, won the Senior class with 125 points and Colon Winslow, a West side boy, won the Junior class with 75 points. The prizes in each class was a bow and five arrows. *Courier-Gazette Jan 4, 1927*

James Tabbutt, Argyle McDonald and Nelson Sprague have bought Ford engines from the Knox County Motor Sales Co. for their boats. *Courier-Gazette April 21, 1927*

The Lane's Island Bridge is unsafe for auto passing and is now undergoing repairs. *Courier Gazette Dec. 12, 1931*

The fish business is flourishing here. The firm of Lane & Libby is one of the most enterprising and square dealing along the coast. They have just purchase 2000 hogshead of salt in New York which is being freighted here by schooners. The firm's force is busy putting up their famous bricks of boneless fish—a very interesting operations by the way. The firm has been shipping big orders to Philadelphia. Fish are quite plentiful. Schooners *David Ogier* and *Lottie Hopkins* recently landed good fares. R. T. Carver, one of our enterprising fishermen, is getting his eel pots ready to catch that favorite delicacy for the NY market. Lane & Libby had 150,000 pounds of fish afloat alongside their wharf yesterday, the largest batch since they have been in business. *Courier-Gazette July 19, 1887*

Memorial Day passed by in the usual solemn way. Details from G.A.R. Post visited the various graveyards and deposited flowers early in the morning. At 2 p.m., Lafayette Carver Post, G.A.R., and T. G. Libby Camps, S. of V., formed in front of their hall and marched to the cemetery where the graves of comrades were decorated. In the evening, the Rev. D. W. LeLacheur delivered a fine address to a large audience in the Town Hall. Our Post always observes the day impressively and the usual careful management was evident this year. *Courier-Gazette May 31, 1887*

The B.G.Co. have completed a fine monument to be erected to the memory of Mr. C. P. Dixon late of Dix Island. *Messenger Friday April 17, 1885*

Memories

Dateline 1976. The first thing that comes to mind is the US Bicentennial was going full steam ahead. It also marks my first visit to Vinalhaven. We came over on the Everett Libby. We were newlyweds and two active kids, 7 and 4, headed for Bridgeside with no clue as to how anything looked or worked on the island. We knew Prof. Peter Goodwin would be our host. He was department chair in Geology at Temple U. where my spouse was on the faculty.

We walked past the fish flakes, kicking up dust and holding our breaths. Shortly Pete picked us up in his ramshackle Jeep Cherokee, thus being spared the rest of the walk, through down street in the heat of the day. The next four days it rained. Well, not real rain more like a heavy mist leaning into a healthy drizzle. The kids had no rain gear but did manage to enjoy going outdoors and ride bikes on Round the Mountain Road. When our time was up, we'd all fallen in love with the Bridgeside Inn and Vinalhaven.

Fast forward to 2014, kids grown up, different spouse and the Bridgeside no longer an operating inn. We rented on Pequot Road for three weeks, didn't have a long distance phone line and our cell phones didn't work on the island. We did have a land line. During one week we got a call telling us that one of those rambunctious boys, now the father of sons himself and living in California, was in ICU. A spinal tap indicated a rare subtropical viral infection—potentially fatal. My older son was in a nursing home in NJ, terminally ill with a hereditary disease that would lead to his death in 2019.

I was instantly overwhelmed with fear, anxiety and panic. Our only link was to receive second hand information by email. Because I'm blessed with a level-headed husband, he contacted psychological services at ICMS asking for an immediate, urgent appointment. Shortly we sat down with Careyleah MacLeod. She listened and she taught me how to breathe as waves of panic washed through me. Within 36 hours we learned that the spinal tap result was a false positive and that my son **only** had viral pneumonia.

In the course of being with Careyleah, I told her I am a Quaker and she shared that Roy Heisler, then living at the Homestead, was a Friend. In my darkest hours and days, I found that being with one who shares a common faith would lift me up. I learned that the skill of the staff at ICMS and my friendships with folks like the late Roy Heisler and Linda Whittington mean I can power through life's toughest challenges.

In 2016, after 40 years of sporadic visits and many rentals, we were able to buy our home on Cottage Street. 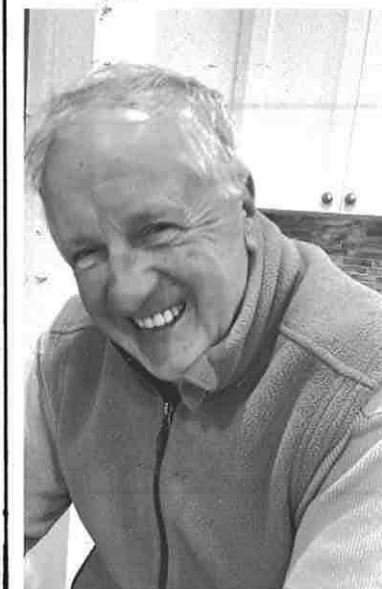
