3 cups 1/2" pieces fresh rhubarb 1 pint strawberries, washed, hulled and halved

¾ cup sugar

6 tbsp. flour 1 tbsp. grated orange rind

1 tsp. grated lemon rind Pinch of salt

2 tbsp. butter, melted Sugar to sprinkle on crust

Prepare pasty for two crust pie. Line 9" pie plate with half the pastry. Preheat oven to 450°. Combine rhubarb, strawberries, sugar, flour, orange & lemon rinds, and salt in large bowl. Toss to mix. 





The Observer

There's a lot going on that will ultimately affect Maine State Ferry Service operations, fares, convenience, and dependability.

The State's *Maine Won't Wait* initiative asks that emissions be meaningfully reduced in operations across the state so alternatives to diesel propulsion (realities in other parts of the world) are being considered.

And alternatives to costly rusting steel hulls—composite, fiberglass, plastic—a reality in Scandinavia, are being thought about seriously.

Meanwhile, while new steel, diesel driven ferries continue to roll off the production line, having been put together with inadequate specifications or supervision resulting in our taking delivery of inoperable or deficient vessels, thoughtful consideration is being given to precisely the oversight that's been missing.

Half the cost of running the ferry service is paid through fares. The other half comes from the state highway fund. Some in the Maine legislature and the D.O.T have made it known that they are unhappy with that arrangement, some are unhappy with having to fund it at all.

Last year Maine's legislative Joint Standing Committee on Transportation, concerned with costs across the broad spectrum of public transportation, asked the state D.O.T. to review Maine State Ferry Service operating costs. The D.O.T., in turn, asked the Island Institute to help. The result is a survey, now on-line and available to us all, which will be active and inviting input for the next month or so.

In recent years, we've all been asked to complete way too many surveys, surveys that were clearly gratuitous responses to one mandate or another. And they've often been clearly pointless because the outcome that was professed to hinge on survey results had already been determined. Surveys have often left us asking, "Why bother?"

Each of the six islands were represented in compiling this survey and while it didn't meet with unanimous approval, it is the result of consensus. I am confident and will work to see that the results are carefully considered, analyzed and result in a comprehensive report to the Transportation Committee that will, in turn, result in improvements across the board.

Vinalhaven Neighbor June 1, 1938

A collection of magazines, paper, rubber and metal of all kinds is being made by the Women's Counsel of Civilian Defense, Citizens may notify the Motor Corps - Ada Creed, Isabelle Calderwood, Frances Gilchrist, Fronia Tolman or Mrs. Fred Greenlaw, who will come and collect. June 19, 1942

White and Lincoln Schools were first in Knox County to establish playground equipment. This was done through the Improvement League and the effort of these teachers: Cora Crabtree, Ruth Brown, Edith Beverage and Harriet Tolman. The 8th grade, Miss Tolman teacher, have recently added a \$20 swing. Courier-Gazette June 22, 1922

Matinicus: school closed June 5 and the children enjoyed a picnic at the Southern Sand Beach. The teacher, Mrs. Velma Teel who has taught here for the past 4 years has resigned. Her many friends presented her with a gift of \$23.25 a token of their respect and good wishes. Courier -Gazette June 9, 1942

Robert Bennett, son of Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Bennett, celebrated his 2nd birthday by entertaining at his home Patsy Ann Smith, Richard Walker, Peter Palazzolo, Susan Webster, Delwyn Webster and Albert Osgood, Jr. The table decorations were blue and pink. The Christian Science Monitor will give a Solid Silver Cup to the winner. This handsome product of the silversmith is now on exhibition in Vinalhaven. Words used in this Spelling Bee will be taken from the editorial pages of The Monitor during the month ending June 17. The contest is open to all. 06/1912

L. C. Chase & Company have discontinued making horse nets and the business has been sold to Net Manufacturers in Wisconsin, where the stock and machinery are new being shipped. The Net business was one of the paying industries of this town and furnished employment to a great many. The L. C. Chase Company manufactured nets since 1889, having bought it from the American Net & Twine Co. of which Edgar Roberts was first in charge. June 25, 1925

Friends in town listened Saturday night at 8:30 to the "Truth or Consequences" program over WBZ, as Bruce Gerry spoke from Hollywood. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Laurel Gerry of South Hollywood. Mrs. Gerry was Formerly Helen Ames of this town. Courier-Gazette June 15, 1948

Vinalhaven **High School Visits Botanical** Gardens

Vinalhaven High School went on a trip to the Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens in Boothbay, Tuesday, May 3rd.

The high school student body, as well as the staff, were given the opportunity to go to the gardens. Students were divided into groups of 6-7 with a teacher chaperone and were allowed to explore the areas as they wanted.

The trip was organized by Science Teacher Daniel Ganoza, who had gone to the gardens in the summer of "21. He'd considered the trip after learning that most students and teachers had only visited the gardens in the winter.

There were many species of flowers, ferns, and other plants. Some examples include rhododendrons, narcissuses, and hyacinths.

For many students, this was their first time visiting the botanical gardens. However, some had gone before with their families.

"I liked seeing the gardens during the daytime," said junior Bella Tolman. "I've only ever seen them during the Gardens Aglow seasons."

A staple of the trip were the five statues of trolls made of wood, each relating to a part of a tree. Science students were tasked with taking pictures with each of the trolls.

"I like [Roskva] because she was holding a tree," said Ganoza. He

was interested in how the artist built the hand around a tree. "I also like her because she was the first troll I saw. It was a shock to me how big it was."

The gardens consisted of several areas for guests to learn from or interact with. These included an apiary, fairy house village, and the shoreland trail waterfront.

One area, students enjoyed was the Bibby and Harold Alfond Children's Garden, themed after various children's books written by Maine authors. The area is divided into a series of separate spaces, each with its own identity and focus. Attractions include a treehouse, small pond, and a maze

Another favorite was the pond in the Giles Rhododendron and Perennial Garden. There students could see turtles swimming in the water and sitting on the edge.


