



SCHOOL NOTICE

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Vinalhaven School and ICMS are working together to provide an opportunity for all children to be in, compliance, with the new vaccination requirements. A new law takes effect on September 1, 2021 that removes both philosophical and religious exemptions from the immunization requirements. A student covered by an individualized education plan (IEP) on September 1st, 2021 who prior to that day may continue to attend school under that student's existing exemption. The parent or guardian of the student must provide a statement from a licensed physician who has made that parent or guardian aware of the risks and benefits associated with the choice to immunize.

All children needing vaccinations were mailed a letter last week.

Beginning September 1, 2021, no child will be permitted to attend school without evidence of immunization or proof of immunity against disease. Students enrolled in grades pK - 12 are to be immunized against diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, measles, mumps, rubella, polio and varicella. Additionally, all students enrolled in grades 7-12 must be immunized against meningococcal disease.

Since it takes time to complete an immunization series, this is the time to call your child's primary care provider to schedule vaccines, if your child is going to attend the first day of school this fall.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

The oldest club in town, known as the *Apron Club* met at Bridgeside Tuesday afternoon and enjoyed a banquet whose menu included fruit cocktail, lobster stew, tomato salad, roast chicken, potatoes, onions, squash, turnip, baked sweet potatoes, creamed cauliflower, jelly pickles, cream cheese, chocolate and white cake, sherbet and homemade candy. Fruit and salted nuts were served in the afternoon. Courier-Gazette Oct 27, 1928

The B. G. Co. have had a new platform built along the front entrances of their store. During the construction a young man looking on in verdant wonder lost a twenty-five cent piece. Then of course the whole business was stopped for him to hunt for it. After consuming lots of time, with no prospects of recovering it, he left one hack fare short. A young boy standing by had his eye on the silver, and at the first opportunity dove down among the dirt and brought to the surface the shining piece and skipped away with it, his smile extending clear across the street in his joy.
Vinalhaven Echo Nov. 24, 1887

Passengers on the Vinalhaven Thursday had a somewhat rough trip. Upon getting outside the breakwater the sea became what one might call tumultuous. Captain Kent is a man who knows his job and takes no chances. On one bell the steamer took its course leisurely and after two hours by way of the inside channel docked at Vinalhaven. One serious mishap was averted when Mrs. Lottie Dyer, a passenger, was thrown violently from one side of the ship to the other without suffering injury. One passenger saw the air-craft carrier, the 22-million-dollar boat, anchored away outside, and it loomed up like an island in the mist.

A Story

FOR UNCLE TOM

A ship is a large vessel intended for ocean going or at least deep-water navigation. A boat is anything else. According to the Navy, a boat is "a small craft capable of being carried on a ship." Fishing craft, submarines and even the Santa Maria (it was 60' long) are exclusions. The Black Ship was the name given to western vessels arriving in Japan in the 1600's. This definition was inscribed in the first western-Japanese dictionary in 1603.

Many Vinalhaven islanders dread the deluge of vacationers coming to their island in the summer months. As the population swells from 1,100 year-round residents to maybe 3-4 thousand, the island demeanor is tested. I have seen (every now and again) locals wearing t-shirts that read -DEPORT ALL SUMMER JERKS- with that said many yarns develop. These accounts are told camped around the wood burning stove in the Port O Call every winter. This story is another in our families "Lake Boat Trilogy's." This arduous adventure began in Dayton, Ohio, when Uncle Tom got a great deal on a lake boat. Never in history has a man passed up -A Deal- on a toy to which he wanted and could afford. Uncle then schlepped his trophy some 1,021 miles to the harbor in Rockland, Maine.

CAPTAIN TOM AND THE BLACK BOAT

Warren, Spaz, Bigg, Boo and I were sitting on mom's deck in Roberts Harbor, brain frozen by the view. Even though we had the privilege to witness this masterpiece every day, it still kept us in awe. I was thinking, someday someone will take me off this deck for good. When that happens, is it, what's really left behind that matters? Photographs, letters, clothes? No, it is the stories behind them, those are what really matter. Stories live forever, but only if they are told.

The phone rang and with so many family members swarming in and out of the house, no one paid attention. A loud (God dam it, shut the door, your letting the bugs in), bellowed from the queen (mom). Someone finally answered the phone and in a loud voice (meant to be heard by whomever cared), "Uncle Tom and Aunt Nancy are in Rockland, Aunt Nan is taking the 1 o'clock ferry and Uncle Tom is driving over in his boat, meet him at the dock."

Uncle Tom was on the shakedown cruise on his recently acquired boat. On his excursion between Rockland and Carvers Harbor, he would have to cross 12 miles of ocean, reminiscent of a cork in the tub. Once he made the islands, he would have to meander through a series of shoals and small outcroppings, then pass thru "the Reach" to enter his new port.

All the boys hurried to the public pier in town to greet his arrival. The five of us stood on the dock. A seasoned Salty was sitting on the stern of his fishing boat, mending his seine net. We searched the harbors' entrance for Captain Tom's arrival. There he was, on the last leg of his sea trial, he was standing at the controls of the Black Boat.

O Captain! My Captain! our fearful trip is done
The ship has weather'd every rack, the prize we sought is won,
The port is near, the bells I hear, the people are exulting,
While follow eyes the steady keel, the vessel grim and daring;

Prim and proper and looking regal in his blue cardigan and gold trimmed captain's hat. Tom's golden side hair "tussled in the wind." Through the moored lobster boats, the Black Boat slid, closer and closer to its new home. What he did next would go down in the islands "annals of boat etiquette." He glided stealthily along-side the dock, in an instant his hands were fighting to command the boat's controls, the engine powered up, up, up. His black beauty rammed and jumped over the docks side, As Captain Tom regained control it slid silently into its berth hitting the massive fishing boat in its stern. The fisherman looked up, shook his head and said, "Summer Jerk", and went back to his mending. The only real damage was to Captain Tom's pride. He could have blamed this faux pas on his uneven stance, that could have initiated the lopsided approach (as he had polio as a child, leaving him with one leg shorter than the other). But he thought better and decided one of his minion would have to be sacrificed on the "sword of Neptune." Quickly the captain started yelling at those still on the dock. We scattered like rats abandoning a sinking ship, laughing. With his spirit crushed, Captain Tom, with hat in hand, pattered away from the glare of the old fisherman. He tied his recently purchased great deal, Black Boat to the stationary bollards, of the town parking lot. He climbed up the seaweed encrusted ladder and after thirty seconds all was forgotten. We said our hello's and went off to the Mill Race for lunch. The now, ten of us, sat in the Mill Race for about an hour. A new old fisherman came into the restaurant and walked directly up to Captain Tom, "Tom", he said, "your boats a hangin'." Even old people forget lessons learned. We all ran over to where he had parked his prize. There she was, hanging cockeyed some three feet out of the water. We scattered and laughed hysterically for the second time in one day.

It's been told to the children, "only kids screw up." You would think that this was the end of the Black Beauty's misfortunes, but bad things come in threes.....After the Ohio Flagg's two week vacation, Tom and the family left the island with the Black Boat in tow. Back the 1,021 miles to Dayton, but with a pit stop in New York. Nan (grandma) and I were the only ones at home, when the phone rang. Uncle Tom, "the trailer for the boat had a flat tire and we have no spare." Rich, "OK, where are you? I'll drive up." Tom, "we followed the state trooper to a place that had a phone." Rich, "you left the boat on the side of the road?" "Yes", Tom went on, "he told us the boat will be fine, they have to flatbed it to fix the tire." So, I went up the thruway to meet the Ohio Flagg's and we both drove to where

the boat was, some 20 miles, off course. Boy, was that cop wrong, \$300.00 for the flat bedding of the boat and to fix that flat, a hole kicked in Black Beauty's bow, the mini-bike, golf clubs and Christmas presents all; gone. As we were getting into the car to return to Tappan, Aunt Nancy said to Tom, "I'm telling you, that woman was wearing my new yellow dress." But with our proverbial tail between our legs, we drove back to my parent's house, dragging the now "Black Hole." The following day the Ohio Flagg family left Tappan for the now 1,000-mile tow home. The Black Boat made it back and went in Captain Tom's back yard graveyard where it sat.

RESPONSE FROM AUNT NANCY FLAGG



Does that fit into the category of being a FLAGG?
