In large pot add empty corncobs to 6-8 C water. Bring to boil and boil for 15 min. Remove cobs and strain liquid through fine mesh strainer, another container. 
The Town Fireworks Ordinance is available at the Town Office and on the Town website. Permits are required and may be obtained at the Town Office during regular office hours.





The risk of taking to the road with unwarranted exuberance, perhaps even waving with two hands, to all the wrong people or ignoring all the right ones can set your immigration status back decades. Curb your enthusiasm.





My family spent every summer with my grandparents on the shores of Lake Michigan. We called my grandfather "Fafa" and my grandmother "Gama." Fafa (Harry Stiles) was an amateur naturalist. During the off seasons from 1952 (when we were 5 and 7) to 1955, Fafa would write us letters to entertain us and maintain our interest in nature. I recently found copies of those letters in an old box of papers. Her is the eighth one in the series. Enjoy!

Scouring Rush

April 12, 1953

Hello Boys,

This afternoon Gama and Fafa took a walk in the woods to see what plants were waking up from their long winter sleep. We found many that were already making their appearance and I would hope that you would know the common ones at least – skunk cabbage already past its flowering prime, hepatica, spring beauty, and spring cress were in bloom, and many others were peeking their way out of the ground; blood root was sending its sheath upwards, violets had made their appearance, and others were showing signs of renewed life.

But it is really not any of these that I want to write you about. Instead, I want to tell you about one that has not sent up its new shoots, but its last year's stems still stand. Do you know what "scouring rush" is? I'll bet you do, only you may call it jointed grass, bamboo reeds, or even pop-grass. Anyway, it is that round reed-like plant that does look something like bamboo because it is jointed. By pulling it separates at the joints, and as a little boy, I used to have fun pulling it all apart, mixing the parts up, and then make a puzzle out of trying to put it together again.

But there is more of interest than just this. Where did it ever get its name of "scouring rush"? Well, would you believe it, before we had sandpaper, cabinetmakers used it to smooth their woodwork and mommies in their homes used it to scour pots and pans. Hence, its name – scouring rush. The stems are really rough, hard, and harsh. Of course, now it is not used, for the cabinetmaker has his sandpaper and housewives have good soap and mechanical cleaners. I can't think of any use it now has except to amuse little boys and girls.

I said that it was called "pop-grass." Whoever gave it that name? I don't know, but I bet little boys had something to do with it. If you take one joint of the plant, you will find that it is hollow and that both ends are sealed off. If you press sharply it will pop, sometime quite loudly. That's a pretty good reason to call it "pop-grass;" There is a story that in the days of long ago, Indian medicine men used this popping to awaken their patients, thus adding mystery to their business.

The scouring rushes, like ferns, have no flowers and thus no seeds. They do develop spores, so small that they cannot be seen except through a microscope. But many people at that time believed they grew invisible seeds. This led to superstitions and among them was that if a person gathered these invisible seeds that he would immediately possess the power to become invisible himself.

I guess no one ever gathered the seeds, unless it was small boys, for I have certainly seen some of them become invisible in a hurry after they had raided the cookie jar!

February 19,1929-July 24, 2021



Her spirit will be here forever in the wind, on the waves and on the shores of Green's Island.





Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Burton, son of Mr. & Mrs. Leslie B. Dyer celebrated his 10th birthday Monday at his home. The young folks enjoyed swimming and games and a treasure hunt proved exciting. Norman Johnson finding the treasure. Richard Dyer received the booby prize. Fancy cookies, cake and punch were served. The large birthday cake was in the form of a ship and was named General Knox, as Burton's anniversary fell on the same date as the general's. Those present were Stanley Conway, Frank Peterson, John Chilles, Norman Johnson, Murray Hopkins, Leslie, Joe, Phil and Richard Dyer, Edith Roberts, Carolyn Dyer, Mrs. Margaret E. Libby, B. L. Lane, Mrs. Frank Rogers, Alma Libby of Wollaston, MA, Mrs. Arthur Pierce and daughters Lorraine and Patricia of Lexington, Mrs. Carrie Thomas, Mrs. Frank Rossiter, Mrs. L. B. Dyer and Ada May Dyer, aged 8 months. All spent a most enjoyable afternoon and Burton received gifts and several sums of money.

Courier-Gazette July 28, 1932

Saturday evening at the home of Mrs. Fritz Skoog a very pleasant session of The Rambler Club was held. Games with music and dancing featured the entertainment, after a fine supper was served. The members of the club are Mrs. William T. Smith, Mrs. Laura Skoog, Mrs. Isabel Smith and daughter Erma, Mrs. Ethel Martin, Mrs. Lucy Skoog, Mrs. Alice Osgood, Mrs. George Swears, Mrs. Maxine Martin. C-G April 17, 1934 The husky looking birch tree which may be seen standing in Keith Carver's yard was a slender sapling 50 years ago. It was "set out" by the late Mrs. Lydia Bunker, so George Robbins tells us, on June 25, 1889 the same day that the good folk of Vinalhaven were celebrating the town's 100th birthday. There should be a special decoration placed on that tree when we celebrate next July. Another tree that was transplanted on June 25, 1889 was the horse chestnut which for many years stood in the front yard of the C.A. Shields residence.
