



A Children's parade, Aug. 24, quite an impromptu affair included the following participants: Joe Dyer, representing Man of the North; Phil Dyer, Shoe Maker; Burt Dyer, George Washington; Stanley Conway, The Frosty Man; John Chilles, Long-necked Man; Junior Dyer, Well Dressed Gentleman. Along the march to Main Street and back to Granite Street the songs "Springtime in the Rockies" and the Stein Song were sung quite lustily (ca.1931)

Capt. & Mrs. Ed Greenleaf and Mr. and Mrs. Fred Greenlaw picked 80 quarts of blackberries in 4 hours. Courier-Gazette Aug. 25, 1921

The B.G.Co. have shipped over twenty thousand tons of J.O. Brown celebrated his birthday Saturday. We are not telling how many candles were on the cake for no one would believe us. Congratulations and best wishes Mr. Brown and many more such birthdays. August 23, 1921

> Mr. & Mrs. George Swears were happily surprised on returning to their home Monday evening to find that a company of neighbors and friends had gathered during their absence having with them a large decorated basket containing china, linen, glassware and other very acceptable articles. The evening was pleasantly spent with three tables at cards and Mr. Swears favored the guests with several trombone numbers accompanied by his mother. Singing by Mrs. Osgood and ukulele selections by Miss Mary Osgood were also much enjoyed. Cake, sandwiches and coffee were served by Mrs. Skoog and Mrs. Martin. The party which had been secretly planned and twice postponed on account of the bride being called away on nursing duty, was reported a huge success.

Vinalhaven M.S.F.S. Standby Line Policy

The standby line, located along the guardrail on the road opens at 6:00 a.m. WORLD CLOCK TIME. Vehicles are not allowed to line up anywhere in the standby line until 6:00 a.m. sharp.

Passengers must be inside their vehicles, with tickets 30 minutes prior to scheduled departure time. Anyone not in their vehicles 30 minutes prior to sailing time will be directed to the end of the line. Vehicles are not to extend beyond the guardrail. Vehicles beyond the appointed standby line (the length of the guardrail) are not considered. If you do not get on the ferry you may leave your vehicle as long as you intend to travel on the next departing ferry and are in your vehicle 30 minutes prior to the next scheduled departure time. The standby is a first come, ability to

fit, first serve basis.


"Old Fish House Days"

#9 North Shore

When the North Island summer colony was founded back in the 1880's, some of the families, in time, emigrated across the Thoroughfare to our island's north shore where they built cottages. As youngsters, we would sometimes tag along with the boatmen who worked for them. In the boathouses we were introduced to the classic day boats: Herreshoff 12 1/2s, Crowninshield knockabouts, and the Penobscot patricians, North Haven Dinghies, all boats shared an elegant simplicity that reflected the essence of the colony. In the spring and fall we helped with scraping and painting and if one of the boats had an argument with a ledge that season, we'd get to see shipwright planking work done, woodwork that often involved bearding lines, rabbet lines, apex lines—boathouse geometry lessons, what days!

Many of the colony's original founders were very nautical and had big boats that saw a good bit of the world. They certainly were not seafaring explorers like Martin Pring and Samuel de Champlain, our notable nascent 17th-century explorers, but there is a sense of nautical adventure in their much later story of discovery here. However, even with all this blue water sailed, they seemed to develop a very exclusive East Coast Atlantic perspective up there, almost as if the Atlantic was the only ocean and this the only coast—and, if you follow the logic, Penobscot Bay, the only bay. There is a cited anecdote about this perspective, perhaps apocryphal, about one Grande dame being formally introduced to a couple from California at a Kent Cove tea. She asked how they liked it out west and they replied they liked it just fine, but it was quite hot. She said, "of course it is my dears, you are over 3,000 miles from the ocean there."





Recipe

Zucchini Bake

1 can Campbell's creamy chicken mushroom soup

½ cup sour cream

4 cups sliced, cooked zucchini

1 cup shredded carrot

1/4 cup finely chopped onion

2 cups herb seasoned stuffing

¼ cup butter or marg., melted

Sauté the onions in the butter or olive oil in a frying pan until onions are golden in color. Add sliced (1/4" ea.) zucchini and green pepper. Cook and stir over medium heat for 5 mins. Add tomatoes and season with salt and pepper; cover and cook for about 20 mins until tender. Pour hot mixture into a buttered casserole, sprinkle with grated parmesan cheese. Bake at 375° for 15 mins or until browned


