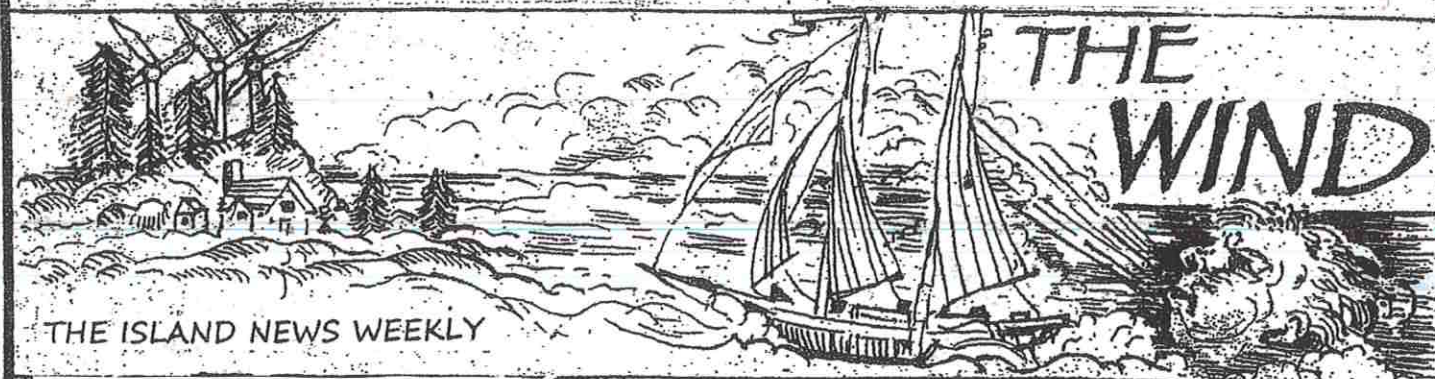

2021-2022 Property Taxes – Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. 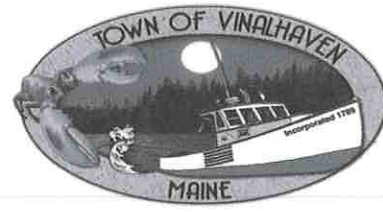

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Steamer *Blonde of Camden* was in the harbor, Sunday. She had been on a chase after a man, who stole two boats from Camden the night previous. They captured the thief with his booty in the vicinity of Brimstone Island and carried him to Camden.
Vinalhaven Wind Aug. 1, 1884

Dora Landers a young miss of School St, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Michael Landers, sat on the doorstep of her home and wished that she could do something to help the soldiers. Then she confided her desire to a playmate or two and they told older friends about it. This was the beginning of the small army of Willing Workers for the Red Cross campaign which resulted in a parade Tuesday afternoon of a dozen and one children of the neighborhood. They made an excellent canvass of the nearby streets, including the Main St. stores. With the Star-Spangled Banner and flags of the Allies it was a cheery sight to behold as funds were solicited for Red Cross work. The anticipated response was made and the children, even the 3 year old's, rejoiced to see the money come in, until the sum amounted to a dozen and one dollars. Then, somewhat weary of the day's march, they returned to the headquarters with \$13 added to the yarn fund and their willingness to do their bit well demonstrated. 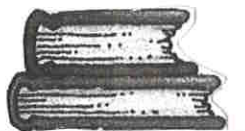
An impressive sunrise ceremony took place Friday at the Soldier's Monument Flagstaff when Walter Robbins of Pratt, Kansas, presented a 12x18' American Flag to Woodcock-Cassie-Coombs Post, American Legion. The presentation speech was made by Mr. Robbins and the flag accepted by Post Commander Clinton Smith and raise by Bruce Grindle and Carl Williams in the presence of member of Legion Post, neighbors and friends. The flag is to be flown day and night and by courtesy of A. A. Peterson a spotlight will be placed on it. After the ceremony those present were invited to the summer home of Mr. and Mrs. Robbins where coffee and doughnuts were served.

The Mardi Gras Fair and ball was a most successful affair for the combined organizations of Lafayette Carver Corps and Smith's Vinalhaven Band and for everyone who attended. The articles on sale in the afternoon found such a ready sale that many wished they had come earlier. The confetti and fancy caps added much to the gaiety of the dance and made the scene attractive to the spectators. The clarinet selections played by R. Month Arey of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra proved without a doubt to be the feature of the evening and the audience was glad of the opportunity to listen to such a rare treat. Dancing lasted into the wee small hours of the morning. Music was by the Arion Orchestra and about \$180 was netted

The Observer

There are only two places, Here, this
island off the coast of Maine, &
Away. There is a big difference be-
tween those who live Here & those
who live Away. There is no less a
distinction between those who live
Here & who the rest of us acknow-
ledge are really *from* Here & those
who live Here but who the rest of us
know are really *from* Away. Each of
us is firmly cast one way or the other.
We're either *from* Here or, one way or
another, we are *from* Away. These
distinctions, some subtle some not, are
laboriously learned & clear to most of
us, certainly those who've been here a
couple of generations or more. The un-
derstanding of newcomers is, for a
while, muddled; some cases clearer
than others. A lady who moves Here
from Boston in June is still *from*
Away in September. Simple enough.
The following year, however, she
thinks she's *from* Here. We all know
she's *from* Away. A few years later
she & we are again in agreement. She
is *from* Away. At some point she set-
tles down, sends some kids through
school & starts thinking she's *from*
Here again, until she succumbs to the
temptation to speak up at a school
board meeting & discovers she's still
from Away. Other circumstances are
less clear. A couple; one from Here &
the other from Away, settle down &
have a child, Ruth. Ruth grows up
Here, marries a local (different than
from Here) guy, & they raise a family.
Eventually Ruth passes on, having
never left. She wasn't *from* Here. She
only *was* Here. One can only be *from*
Here if you & your ancestors have
never lived anywhere else. One can-
not *become from* Here. A person can,
however, *become from* Away & such
a stigma is for keeps. There is no
redemption, no getting back on the
wagon. Away happens. But like
many unhappy circumstances, being
from Away can be improved upon. A
person *from* Away could, for example,
marry one of us; & some have, with
no more noble goal than to improve
their situation, or our quality of life.
Either maneuver can be dicey. pc

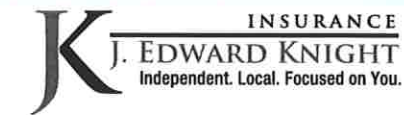

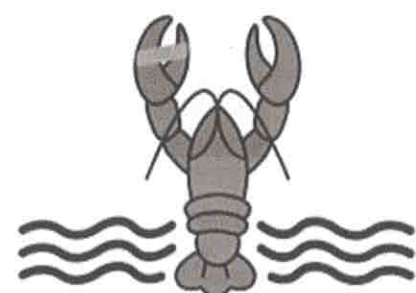

P is for *Pleasant River*. Local historian **Sidney Winslow** wrote in *The Vinalhaven Neighbor* (1939), that Pleasant River "extends from Fox Island Thoroughfare at the north and its southern extremity is at the old *trotting park*...near the Grange at Vinal's Cove. This river meets Mill River at the site of *Carrying Place Bridge*." Captain *A. M. Webster* owned and managed a quarry on the northern shore of Pleasant River. Stone from this quarry was sent to Boston and New York. In the early 1900s, he donated his boarding house to the *Grange* which was then skidded by horses over the ice to its current location. In 1904, the three-masted schooner *Margaret M. Ford* was built near this site. At one time, according to Winslow, small fish could be procured from the waters: flounder, pollock, smelts, and mackerel. Today the *Pleasant River Church, Pleasant River Grange* and several homes dot all sides of this area.
