



is for Trotting Park. The Trotting Park was the creation of several young men on the island. Even though they worked nine or ten hour days cutting granite, fishing, and other employment, they found time to build a trotting park on the North Haven Road across from F.S. Walls Watering Trough. The track was 30 feet wide and a half mile around. Entries for races at The Trotting Park came from Belfast, Rockport, Hope, Lincoln, Camden, Rockland, Bangor, and Vinalhaven. There was great enthusiasm for harness racing from 1884 to 1909. The purses ranged from \$50 to \$185. and a fare from the mainland, including admission to the park was 75¢. The last race in Vinalhaven was in 1909, with J.S. Black presiding as judge. In the winter, the same men raced with sleighs on Carver's Pond and Old Harbor Pond. Occasionally, men and women raced their sleighs on Main Street. Many of the first sleighs were manufactured at the State Prison in Thomaston. Sourced from Horse Nets,

### The Observer

On August 17, 1894, the United States Congress passed the latest of many iterations of the River and Harbor Act, which was first enacted in the early part of that century. The Act was generally intended to ensure safe passage, riparian rights and defense of the nation's many navigable salt and fresh waterways. On February 9 of 1895 the Secretary of War, under whose auspices the Act was administered, submitted to congress a plan for constructing a breakwater from Lanes Island to Green Ledge, a distance of more than a quarter mile, to protect Carver's Harbor from southern storm surges and from accumulating sediment. At the time Carver's Harbor was a valued and busy commercial hub, shipping prized granite all over the country. That wall was never built but it's interesting to note it was once contemplated as, today, the island addresses the likelihood of sea levels continuing to rise and eventually threaten the community and downtown area. A gated breakwater from Potato Island or perhaps Bar Island or Lanes Island, across the mouth of the Harbor to Smith Point, a wall of sufficient height to protect the area from the twice daily tides that will, during the next century, comprise that threat, is among the proposals that the Town's Downtown Revitalization and Sea Level Rise Committees might want to consider as we consider our options. pc

Middle and high school students are dropped off and wait near the middle school doors.






Please join us in welcoming Taylor Littlefield!
