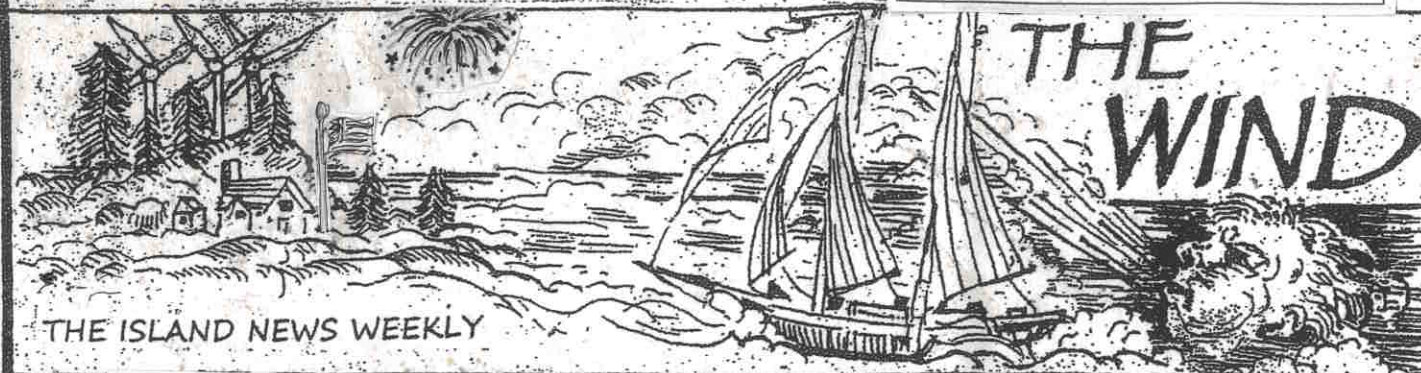

2022-2023 Property Taxes - Tax bills were mailed out on September 8, 2022. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1, 2022. If you sold your property after April 1, 2022, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner. Payments are due on November 1, 2022, and May 1, 2023. Interest will accrue starting November 2, 2022 and May 2, 2023. Please call the Town Office at 863-4471 or 863-4343 if you have any questions.

Dog Licenses - \$25 late fee is now in place for all unregistered dogs. All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new dog must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving dogs to Vinalhaven if these guidelines are followed.

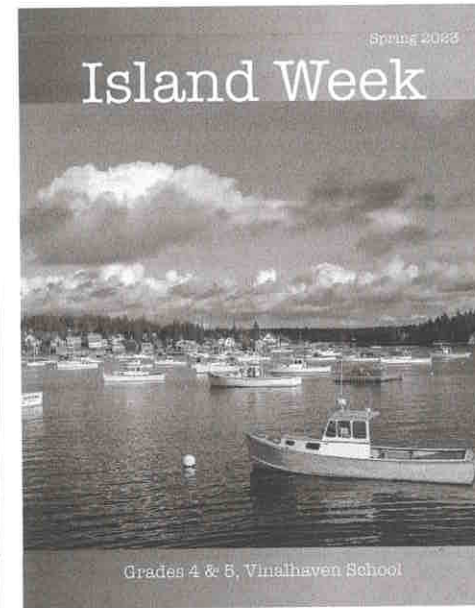


Hot off the presses! Island Week

It Is All Relative

Vinalhaven is a fascinating community. Road signs, trails, land plots and locations are named for early settlers and community founders. There is a strong sense of heritage and history here, especially so, being an island. Not all of us are so graced with this sense of extended relationships. However, kinship, community and belonging are more than a shared family name traced back over time. It is the shared experiences that connect us most. We all can recall family members and their quirks and eccentricities. These capture valuable and cherished memories. There is the odd uncle who started innocently collecting models of metal buildings and now has a whole room and attic devoted to his "memorabilia". These memories give us a connection with others in this universe. Then there are those collective experiences, such as vacation trips, which emerge into a permanent milepost of life. Remembered perhaps for fond experiences and particularly often for incidents of more embarrassing, likely illegal and certainly outrageous behavior. These recollections are shared at family gatherings to cement bonds of family and clan.

Family memories bridge generations. As our granddaughter headed off to college, her father admonished her about working hard and studying seriously. She had always seen her father as a high achieving, hard worker who had gained widespread respect within his profession. However, Grandma impetuously blurted out her long-held grievance about the father's less than stellar first year debacle at college. The impact of his speech lost a lot of its weight. However, this did give the granddaughter greater insight into her family and further cemented the grandparent - granddaughter bond.

Unfortunately, all these family and clan memories can pass with the loss of our elders, and we might lose some of the richness of existence. However, it can be saved. With the coming of summer and the occasions for family gatherings, opportunities will arise to make and recall more family and community history. One of my regrets is not asking my parents and elders more about their lives. I have half-formed snippets from disconnected stories. I wish now I had asked them directly or even better at a gathering of others that can help draw out more details and become more revealing. One further consideration extends to family recipes and those meals you shared year after year. My mother was a fantastic cook. I have a taste memory that holds those dishes she prepared, and most have never been matched. My mother's Kuchen was part of my young life and that of many of our family members. My nieces have often attempted to replicate it. Some efforts are close yet never match my memory of it. We lost part of our youth and a memory of joy she brought to us through her cooking.

So do this, write down for yourself, and for those who follow you, those special moments. Take videos to capture and show times that could be lost. Write down family recipes and how they were made. Try to make them while your source is still able to help you revise your attempts. One of the best ideas I have encountered occurred at a wedding where every attendee received a short, handmade booklet of the cherished family recipes from both sides of the wedding couple's families. Rejoice in your family, clan, and community. Write down those experiences so they can be remembered accurately by you and your future generations.

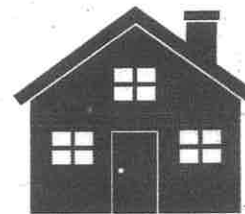

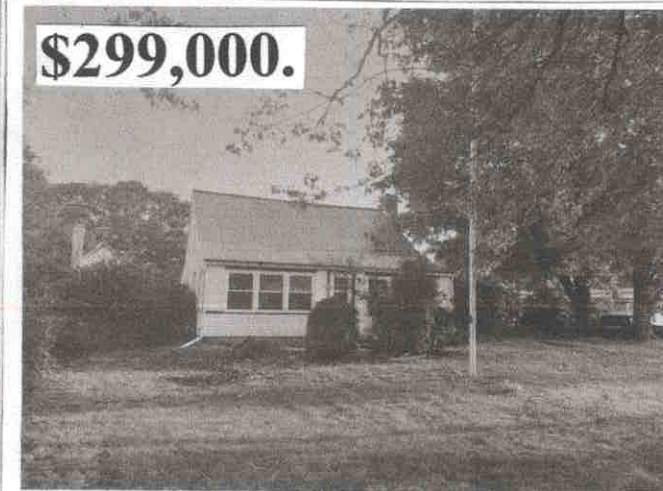

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Reginald Grant, son of Mr. & Mrs. Lawrence Grant, was host to a group of boys on his 9th birthday. Football, baseball and horseshoes furnished the entertainment. Refreshments served by Mrs. Grant. Reginald received many nice presents. Guests were: Dickie Witherspoon, Rusty Crockett, Barry Parsons, Teddy Adams, Raymond Beverage, Austin Grant. Invited but not able to attend were David Joy and Arnold Adams.

June 23, 1951

Commencement exercises will be held Thursday at 7.30 in Memorial Hall with a pageant entitled "When Marble Speaks." The cast is made up of members of the class and is under the direction of Miss Phyllis Black. Prophecy of the class will be given by Nita Eisner and class gifts by Miss Louise Burgess and Herbert Knowlton. The public is invited except for children under the 8th grade unless holding tickets. June 13, 1939

Alfred Orcutt has opened a grocery business in the building known as the Lane & Libby Store.

June 1, 1917

On Saturday evening officers Gray and Julian, armed with a warrant to search for intoxicating liquors, went through the Vinalhaven Drug Store, and after diligent search found nothing but several bottle of Rock and Rye, this they confiscated, and then made a visit to the Granite Hotel, making a thorough search of the premises, but nothing intoxicating was found. On Monday J.P. Armbrust, as principal of the Vinalhaven Drug Store, was summoned to appear before Trial Justice Kittredge and answer to the charge of keeping intoxicating liquor for sale. After a hearing, in which complainant claimed the liquors seized were used purely for medicinal purposes, Justice Kittredge dismissed the case and ordered the liquor returned. On Tuesday evening at 7.30, Mr. Lovejoy of the Granite Hotel appeared before Trial Justice Kittredge charged with keeping a drinking house and tipling shop. Several witnesses summoned by complainant were examined, all of whom pleaded total ignorance in the matter. The court decided that there was not enough evidence to warrant a continuance of the case and it was therefore dismissed.
