2021-2022 Property Taxes – Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1st, 2021. **If you sold your property after April 1st, 2021, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner.** Payments are due on November 1st, 2021, and **May 2nd, 2022.** Interest is accruing on unpaid November 1st payments. Dog Licenses - All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed. **All dogs not licensed for 2022 will now have to pay \$25 late fee per dog.**

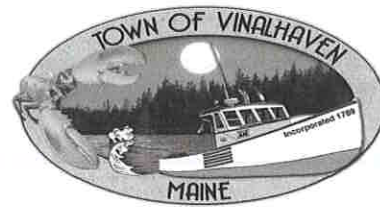

Employee of this class is responsible for the evaluation and assessment of all taxable property within the Town and the administration of all department functions. Work involves extensive field work, reviewing assessments, ensuring department operations are up-to-date, and maintaining the tax rolls. Work is performed under the general supervision of the Town Manager and is carried out with considerable technical independence in accordance with applicable laws.

The individual must have thorough knowledge of the principles, methods, and techniques of real and personal property assessment and valuation as well as knowledge of town ordinances and general law pertaining to tax assessment. VINALHAVEN SCHOOL *THANK YOU!*

Dear VH Community - Since *The Wind* came out last Thursday, I've already heard from adults who appreciated last week's article, mentioned they are going to do more reading with kids (thanks!), and suggested I post this again. So...here it is! ☺

Becoming good at shooting a basketball, playing guitar, and reading are all similar. With **20 minutes a day**, you can really improve in only a few months. Practicing for a long time, but only once per week doesn't help nearly as much.

If you help a young kid become a better reader, you help them **for a lifetime**. School, jobs, and vacations are all better when a person can read well. Parents, grandparents, neighbors, friends and siblings call all look for 20-minute opportunities to grab a book and read. Let a kid watch you read. They'll get curious. Read out loud, even when kids don't seem to be paying attention (they are picking up vocabulary). Read a story before bed. Read a story at breakfast rather than picking up your phone. Let kids look at the picture and guess where the story will go – then read the page. Traveling? Point to road signs and say the letters and words. **Make reading a game**, not punishment. "If we can finish reading this book by Saturday, I'm going to take you for ice cream!" Or swimming or fishing or to shoot baskets or to play music. By the way, singing songs helps with learning to read, and so does sounding out the names of all the players for the Celtics. Or, read about the 10 pro basketball players who were also musicians!

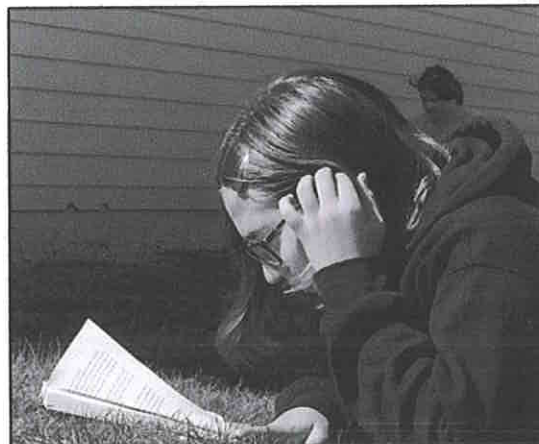

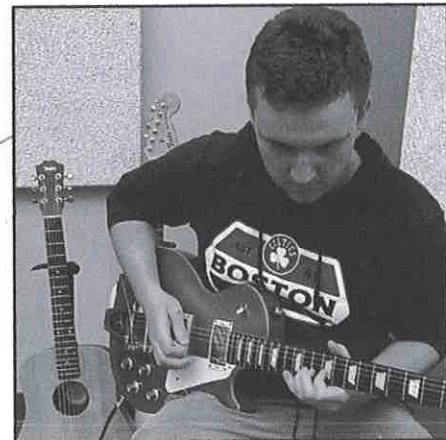

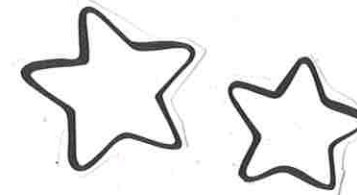

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Vinalhaven is looking to a big celebration on the Fourth of July. In the long line of the parade will be seen Fantastics, Smith's Band, floats representing the different orders, clubs, etc. Both the Silent Sisters and Twelve Old Maids have made arrangements for very attractive floats. There will surely be something doing in our little island town. During the day, games of baseball will be played by our local and out of town teams. At 6 p.m. a free banquet will be served to the returned soldiers and sailors who served in the World's War. This will be given by the Silent Sisters and the grand ball in the evening at the Memorial Hall will be given by the Twelve Old Maids. There will also be fireworks. *Courier-Gazette June 24, 1919*

Sandra Elaine Webster, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Webster, celebrated her first birthday Monday by entertaining these guests and their mothers: Marilyn Johnson, Roberta Sprague, Diane Bruce, Peggy Burgess, Kern Robinson, Betty Burgess, Cheryl Headley, and James Young. The table decorations were pink, blue and white favors, lollipops and baby rattles. Lunch included a large decorated birthday cake. The young hostess received many nice gifts. Others present were Mrs. Annie Conway of Belmont, Mass., Miss Elizabeth Forte, Frank and Michael Forte of Waltham, Mass., Pictures were taken by Ernest Clayter. *Courier-Gazette June 7, 1949*

E.L. Glidden is repairing damages at Tom Sorrento's store caused by the falling of shelves piled high with the choicest of chocolates. Hardly a pound of candy was lost. *Courier-Gazette June 4, 1918*

This item about a former local boy appeared recently in a Boston paper: "Ivan H. Poole of Wollaston, was the only person out of 25 recently given the Civil Service examination for the position of statistician for the Quincy Department of Health who passed, Thomas H. Green announced yesterday." Mr. Poole has been appointed and has already begun work in the new position. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Poole and is a graduate of Vinalhaven High School and the University of Maine. *Courier-Gazette June 15, 1939*

The new boat, Vinalhaven II, was launched June 17 at Southwest Harbor. The trustees are making every effort that the boat goes into service at the earliest possible moment. *Courier-Gazette June 22, 1943*

The presidential candidates in the field thus far are James G. Blaine of Maine and Benj. F. Butler of Mass. If the democrats, whose convention meets July 8th, put up a candidate equally as popular, we may expect one of the liveliest campaigns that has been known for years. *Vinalhaven Wind June 14, 1884*

Prescelle the hypnotist played a week's engagement here to packed houses in 1907. Prescelle gave a very interesting and highly entertaining performance which is remembered in detail by all those who attended. A special advertising feature of this entertainment was Prescelle's hypnotizing a young man and after causing him to go to sleep placed him on a couch in the window of the L. R. Smith Co. store where he lay on exhibition until he was taken to the Memorial Hall and awakened from his hypnotic state by Prescelle during the evening show. The evening show consisted of an exhibition of Prescelle's hypnotic powers and demonstration of mental telepathy. Prescelle left a profound impression in the minds of all those who attended his show and will perhaps be remembered as one of the outstanding entertainers ever in Vinalhaven. *Vinalhaven Neighbor June 29, 1938*

Monday after school Avis Mae Johnson entertained the following little friends at Lincoln's Bakery in honor of her birthday: Ernestine Carver, Carolyn Calderwood, Elizabeth Gray, Pauline Sanborn, Erdine Calderwood, Ellen Georgeson, Martha & Athene Thompson. A table was reserved for the little folks and decorated for the occasion, the favors were small glass baskets filled with candies. Ice Cream and Birthday cake were served. The little hostess received several gifts and a large birthday cake was made for her by Mrs. L. R. Smith, whose wedding anniversary fall on the same date. Little Miss Avis also presented Mr. and Mrs. Smith with a gift. The party was given by Mrs. W. Y. Fossett who also took snapshots of the little hostess and her guests. *Courier-Gazette June 4, 1928*

Big preparations are being made for the Fourth of July celebrations - Parade, sports, ball games and a dance. The parade headed by Horribles will start at 9 o'clock. Prizes for the three best floats \$25, \$15, \$10. Sports begin on Main Street at 10 o'clock. 100-yard dash, free for all, (all prize money \$3, \$2, \$1 unless otherwise noted); 222-yard dash, free for all; 1-mile race, free for all; 3-legged race, \$5; Old Man's Race (40 years and older) \$5, \$3; Bicycle Race, \$5, \$3; Dory Race in Carver's Harbor, \$10, \$5; Stilt Race. Afternoon at the ball grounds - Throwing baseball for distance; run and broad jump; hop, skip and jump; standing broad jump; A baseball game with married men vs. single men, prize winners \$25; tug of war, 10 men each side, prize for winners \$50; Smith's Vinalhaven Band all day and dancing at the Town Hall from 8 to 12 o'clock, music by Lane's Orchestra. Entries close July 3. All entries to sports must be made to Charles Chilles. Entries confined to residents of Vinalhaven. *Courier-Gazette June 23, 1925*

Old Fish House Days

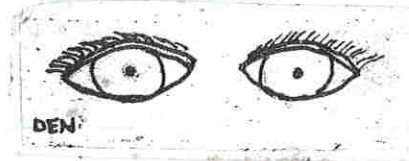
Island Tea Times

For decades, the ferry terminal sat between the B&M fish plant and the Vinalhaven Light & Power plant. In the late 50's, to accommodate the then big new boat, MV Everett Libby, the ferry operation was shifted to its present-day location. This move was welcomed by most islanders—but not by Orrie Gustavson as the new boat wharf sat right below his camp's view to the south'ard. His routine of watching seabirds, lobster boats and luggers headed downeast in serenity from his harbor perch was now interrupted by the sounds and sights of the "madding crowd." In island parlance, he liked this development "none too much."

However, his wife, Millie, a Massachusetts gal raised with all her family's English customs (her father was a punctilious, bow-tied Harvard Square banker) had a plan to use one of these customs to assuage some of Orrie's newly found consternation. She started having teatimes that coincided with ferry times for Orrie along with their friends and family. It worked! In time, Orrie did not seem to mind the hubbub below and even looked forward to the ferry's arrival and departures—especially if it was summer and there were freshly baked blueberry muffins to go with the tea!

It was not long before Orrie introduced his own signature event to the camp's daily social agenda around a boat time. At two bells, the time of the last boat's arrival of the day, tea was replaced with rum. These gatherings were a bit more animated than the teatime as you might expect. Stories abounded about eccentric islanders (many of whom were regular attendees), along with stories of messing about in leaky Island boats, stubborn gardens, and Orrie's briny tales from his times at sea. Often, when a guest shoved-off from these affairs, they often experienced a shift in ballast; the proclivity was a list to port. Island life, la dolce vital

Peter Bodnar Obituary

Peter Bodnar: Painter, lover of all things, immortal soul; completed his life on August 10th, 2021, in Vinalhaven, Maine. He left many unfinished canvases and unsaid words: if he did not respond to your correspondence, please know he still cared. He was born in Czechoslovakia, November 27, 1928. He was carried by his mother, Mary, to the United States, where his father, Peter worked for Ford Motor Company in Detroit, Michigan. They later moved to a small farm, outside Mt. Morris, MI. He spent most of his fifth year in the state hospital in Ann Arbor, where

he had acute osteomyelitis, poliomyelitis, scarlet fever, and chicken pox. He returned home with a crutch, a brace and a scar from his ankle to his knee.

As a boy, he spent the majority of his time drawing. He attended classes in a one-room schoolhouse. His artwork earned him a scholarship to the Flint Institute of Art. In high school he became a body builder and hitch-hiked to Indiana to see his hero, Charles Atlas. He built his biceps to 17" and could overhead press 400 lbs. His classmates voted him most likely to become "The Strong Man in the Circus". In 1947 he got a scholarship to Western Michigan University, Kalamazoo, to study art. He graduated in 1951 with a BA. During the summer he worked as a lifeguard on Potters lake, where he met his wife Phyllis Czuchna. (They eloped in the spring of 1952). He taught in public schools for five years. Teaching in Flushing, Michigan, he taught 40, twenty-minute classes a week. He would carry all his art supplies in his car, His students called him "Mr. Art". They loved the drawings he would leave on the black board: Indians, horses, and Indian villages.

He often walked (and drove) slowly, always taking the time to touch the earth and make a connection to the people and places where he worked and lived. Indian artifacts, arrowheads, knives, celts and hammers (many of which he found, walking in farm fields) lit his imagination. In 1955, he received an assistantship at Michigan State University and worked with John de Martelly in lithography. After receiving his MFAA in 1956, he headed to New York University, in Plattsburg, then on to West Liberty State in West Virginia and onward to the University of Florida, finally settling and teaching at the University of Illinois, Urbana for 32 years.

He built three homes; the first was an ultramodern, cement block structure with a shed roof, in Flint, which he built almost single-handedly. The second was a brick farmhouse, created with brick from the Urbana Railroad Roundhouse, torn down in 1961. He, Phyllis, and son Peter, cleaned, stacked, and moved this recycled brick to their 8.8 acres on Perkins Road in Urbana. His daughter Dawn sang work songs with her angelic voice while they labored. He laid hardwood flooring in the home, scavenged from a demolished church on Green Street, in Urbana. His third home was built off the shores of the Atlantic, in Vinalhaven, Maine; an island he, his family, and many of his students, deeply came to love since his first visit in the summer of 1958. The island house was built from indigenous spruce trees that grew on his 6-acre lot. The wood was pulled to the home site by a horse, milled and erected by Peter, his son Peter III and his students from the Louisville School of Art in the summer of 1998.

Peter II was an essential catalyst for change, growth and evolution of countless lives, a mentor to many artists on every avenue of creation. He placed great emphasis on the special ability of every individual to add something creatively positive to this world. He believed that every person's physical mark was special, an essential contribution to the universe, and worth of being cherished (Authentic Art).

While not intended by the artist to be either narrative or illustrative, Peter was satisfied with his works being viewed as non-prescriptive, Rorschach ink lot tests. (What the viewer drew from viewing his work was the right conclusion, for that individual). Critics and colleagues respected his art/life. After his first Chicago show, art critic

Fran Schulze, labeled him a "Authentic New Surrealist". Photographer Jerry Uelsmann wrote, "I have always treasured my Bodnar's above all else—May I join in the justly deserved hymns of this praise. In the beginning P. Bodnar created and created and created." Peter had an exhibition at Gallery 103, on the island of Kauai, Hawaii, with a former student, Tom Leiber, in 2009. Peter and his son Peter III, exhibited together at the Cinema gallery in 2014, in Urbana. He completed a series of 8 paintings in the spring of 2021. He had 40 One-Man exhibitions, 47 invitational exhibitions and 14 grants and fellowships. His work is represented in 20 major art collections and museums.

Peter is survived by his wife Phyllis, still living at their home in Urbana and sister and brother-in-law, Dr. Howard and Lorelee Knotts-Murad of Marina del Rey, CA. Peter and Phyllis gave life to five artistic/poetic children: Peter III, who is a teacher and artist in Louisville, KY, Dawn, a writer/editor and mother, married to writer/producer, Phoebe Sutton. They have two children, Skylar Sutton and Celia Sutton and one grandchild, Mallory Wise. Daughter Eden, actor, voice-over artist and mother, her husband Kevin, writer, actor and father and their three children, Ariel, Emerson and Tiernan Bodnar-Klein live in, Minnetonka, MN, Stephen, artist, teacher and father and his wife Heather, artist and mother are raising two children, Silvey Bodnar and Elizabeth Bodnar in Scottdale, GA and David, singer, actor, photographer, hybridizer and caretaker to Phyllis and the home stead, in Urbana, Ill.
