The Public Health Team meets on a semi-regular basis and more frequently when necessary. We will provide the community with relevant COVID-19 information in a timely manner. This collaborative partnership has been in place since March 2020 when Maine declared a civil state of emergency.

Active Case Count

As of Monday, January 10, 2022, ICMS is reporting that there are **31* confirmed cases** of COVID on Vinalhaven. This count represents the cases reported since December 26, 2021.

*This count only represents the confirmed positive tests that have been shared with ICMS.

From the School

Due to the rising number of COVID cases and low attendance of students in the school the Board has approved the recommendation to move to remote instruction until Jan 21st.

School was dismissed early at 1:00 today. Pick up of material will be at school tomorrow, Tuesday (1/11) from 12-2. Lunch can also be picked up at the same time as well for the entire week.
