#### Blondies

8 T unsalted butter, melted  
2 C light or dark brown sugar, packed  
¾ tsp salt  
3 large eggs (cold from fridge)  
2 tsp pure vanilla extract  
1 ½ C all-purpose flour  
1 tsp baking powder  
1 ½ C chopped pecans or walnuts, divided

Oven 350° Grease small pan.  
In med. heatproof bowl, combine butter, br. sugar & salt. Microwave until butter is completely melted, remove & stir until evenly combined  
Beat in cold eggs, one at a time, mixing until each egg is absorbed. Stir in vanilla.  
Combine flour & baking powder to sugar mix. Stir until completely mixed. Add 1 C nuts. Spread in prepared pan, spread evenly. Sprinkle remaining nuts on top.  
Bake 30-35 minutes, until top crust is shiny, middle is soft (not raw). Remove, cool before slicing.

**Dog Licenses** – All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed.

# Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Poppy

**Teenettes Club Organized** at Vinalhaven High. A new club was formed at Vinalhaven High School last week and has been named the "Teenettes." It consists of 7 girls, at present, who will meet each Wednesday evening from 7 to 10 o'clock. Each Teenette will pay 10¢ dues, which will be used at the month's end for a special supper or party. The first meeting will be at Lauretta Shields' home, where the girls will make ice cream. Members of the group are Janice Wadleigh, Sharon Healey, "Happy" and Georgianna Hansen, Barbara White and Shirley Dyer. *Jan 16, 1958*

**After the steamer Gov. Bodwell** arrived at Vinalhaven Saturday afternoon there was an altercation between the mate, W. E. Lakeman and a deckhand named Jude Herbert. The latter is a large-framed powerful man and he struck the mate several powerful clips. When the disputants arrived up-town the mate caused Herbert's arrest. This was accomplished by Deputy Sheriff White, who handcuffed the prisoner. The bracelets were removed after the lockup had been reached and Deputy White was stooping to fix the fire when Herbert dealt him a powerful blow that stunned him. Taking advantage of Mr. White's condition, Herbert made good his escape. Herbert is a Nova Scotian who has been employed on the boat a month or two. Capt. Dyer states that he did his work well and was peaceably inclined when he had not been dabbling with strong drink...according to all reports his volcanic temperament was in full eruption Saturday. **UPDATE:** After being taken to the lockup the offender made his escape but was recaptured when only a short distance away. Mr. White started to leave the lockup and his prisoner demanded that he go too. Upon refusal Herbert struck the officer a severe blow and took his leave. Up to Sunday afternoon Herbert had not been found. Monday it was learned that a stranger had borrowed a boat of one of the residents in the eastern part of the island and had failed to return it. Soon after, Herbert was located at Crotch Island and later again taken into custody at Stonington. He was brought here on Tuesday night's boat and given a trial in the evening. *Jan. 2, 1904*

**Tuesday evening the following** couples enjoyed a delightful outing at Round Pond, Mr. and Mrs. T. E. Libby, Mr. and Mrs. L. R. Smith, Mr. and Mrs. G. C. Jones, Mr. and Mrs. O. C. Lane, Mr. and Mrs. M.P. Smith, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Coombs, Dr. and Mrs. H. L. Raymond. Refreshments consisting of a delicious haddock smother prepared by Mrs. S. R. Lane and a variety of pies, cakes, etc. Two flash light pictures were taken. It is rather a novel experience, when one may enjoy camp life in and out of doors in January and the same evening walk across Round Pond and around it in the clear moonlight and spring-light atmosphere. *Jan. 25, 1908*

**Bernard Wilmoth and William Peach** lost their way in the recent storm going from Heron Neck to their boarding place at Mrs. Rilla Bray's. They had finished installing the heating plant at Heron Neck Light Station. They wandered about in the deep snow for more than 3 hours, until they saw the light in the tower at the Neck and found their way back. Mr. Peach froze both cars very badly. *Jan. 20, 1912*

**Arthur, aged 2 years**, son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Dodge, watched the Old Year out and the New Year in, and at midnight sang "Jingle Bells" before going to bed. *Jan. 4, 1934*

**The Triple M Club** took a hike Saturday to The "Fish Hawk's Nest." Twenty of the boys, and their guide Herbert L. Libby, with blankets and provisions arrived at camp at 5 p.m. and made ready for a good supper. The plan was to stay until 11.30 then leave for home, but at this hour it was snowing hard and they waited until 1.45 a.m. then broke camp, although all departed with genuine regret to leave their warm and cozy rendezvous, everyone had a jolly time and are anticipating another in the near future. *Jan. 27, 1920*

**Miss Blanche Smith** entertained the Rabat Joie Club at her home Thursday evening at Flinch. Refreshments were served. The members of the club are Misses Anna and Maude Coombs, Ada Brown, Augusta Clarke, Gertrude Wall, Lizzie Ross, Beulah Colson and Blanche Smith. *Jan 18, 1913*

**In spite of the storm**, the Night Hawks gathered at the Islander Inn on Friday night, where they enjoyed a fried chicken dinner. This was the club's annual Christmas celebration which, due to various reasons, had been postponed twice. Nevertheless, with the hotel still illuminated with the holiday lights, a large beautifully decorated Christmas tree still standing in a corner of the living room, and with all the snow outside, it still seemed very much like Christmas. Following the dinner, the club met at the home of Mrs. Winona Peterson where the remainder of the evening was passed in reviewing new literature and play cards. Honors at cards were won by Mrs. Doris Arey. *Jan. 13, 1953*

**The Wayside Service Station** crew has just completed an air compressor for the Vinalhaven Light & Power Co. This compressor was built of parts from a Model A Ford plus parts ordered from Kentucky. About 20 years ago, Frank Sampson and crew built a similar compressor for the town of North Haven which is still in very good operating condition. *Jan 21, 1958*

**The New AC Atwater Kent Radio** is now being demonstrated at J. H. Carver's Store. *Jan. 28, 1928*

"Can I have one? Pleaseeeee.....!"
