An island field of dreams Vinalhaven Little League team dominates

LAST MONTH MY ten-year-old grandson and ten other kids about his own age, encouraged by a large group of conspiratorial island adults, poured a pitcher of ice water over the head of an older island man who certainly had it coming.

In 1998, after too many years during which Vinalhaven had no organized baseball, Steve (Nipper) Ames and Dewey Sanborn cobbled together a bunch of kids they hoped would constitute Vinalhaven's participation in organized Midcoast play. They were too late that first year, but the teams have certainly been very enthusiastic participants in Oceanside Little League ever since.

During that time, Coach Nip and the team have enjoyed the help of others-like Dewey early on-most of whom were very enthusiastic dads who've been assistant coaches while their kids were part of the team. But Nip has been the stalwart bond that has held Little League alive and well, very well, in fact, on Vinalhaven.

On several occasions during those 23 years, Vinalhaven, given its much smaller school population, had to be given a waiver from regulators that would allow them to play an eight-year-old so they could have enough players to round out a team that's customarily restricted to nine to 11-year-olds.

During this most recent, his 23rd consecutive year, Nipper led the Ravens to the end of a season that can rightly be described as stunning. It's enough that they were undefeated. The best record ever recorded in major league baseball was 116 wins and 23 losses by the Cubs in 1906.

The Ravens' record for the year was 12 wins, no losses, but the particulars of those 12 wins would not be believed, were they not witnessed by so many of us and by so many awestruck opponents.

Let's begin slowly. The total runs scored by the Ravens during the 2021 season was 134, in excess of 11 runs per game. The total scored by opponents was three. That's 134-3!

But there's more! Nine of the Ravens' 12 wins were shut outs and the three that weren't account for the three runs scored by opponents.

But there's more—rather much more! Two were perfect games! A perfect game is accomplished when each three batters in every inning is retired in order without ever reaching base. No major league pitcher has ever recorded more than one perfect game and certainly none has managed two in a single season. Only 23 perfect games have been recorded during 150 years of major league ball.

The young pitcher who is responsible for this unbelievable achievement is Hunter Hamilton, who's been at it since he was eight but who will now, at 12, soon age-out of Little League and, given the particulars of his birthdate in the scheme of things, will not be eligible for high school ball for another year unless a successful petition for exemption is made.

Given Hunter's extraordinary performance, the Raven fielders

have not had the experience they might have gained if every now and then an opponent managed a hit. Still, practices have been and will continue to be focused on polishing skills that will be needed for another successful season.

Over the years, Nipper has acquired a perceptive eye for the insecurities that attend adolescence and for the respective strength of the kids who play for him and that's been fodder, not only for creating teamwork and achieving strategic placement on the field, but for overcoming those apprehensions. The Ravens are a single cohesive and enthusiastic unit, devoted to the game, to one another and to their coach.

Maine is moving to a state-based marketplace for insurance.

Q: What does this mean for me?

A: If you have shopped and chosen your insurance through healthcare.gov and live in the state of Maine, you will now be using coverME.gov.

Q: When does enrollment start?

A: Open enrollment begins November 1, 2021 and ends January 15, 2022.

If you enroll by 12/15/21, your new policy will be effective on 1/1/22. If you enroll by 1/15/22, your new policy will be effective on 2/1/22.

As of October 15, you can begin looking at plan options without actually creating an account, and the information won't be saved. On November 1, you will need to create an account and complete the application to have plan options appear.

Q: What if I do nothing?

A: You will automatically be enrolled in a plan that closest matches your current plan. If you are automatically enrolled, it **DOES NOT** guarantee that your current provider is covered. We strongly encourage all to go in and shop for plans that cover your provider as well as prescriptions.

Q: Do I need to make an account, even if I have one through healthcare.gov?

A: Yes, you do. This is a new system that will need you to create a new account with your current information.

Q: What if my application results say I qualify for MaineCare?

A: You should fill it out and it will automatically be sent to DHHS for review. If they deny MaineCare coverage you can go back to CoverME.gov and complete your application.

Q: What if I have questions about CoverME.gov?

A: You can call Leslie Dyer at ICMS for help enrolling in CoverME.gov at 863-4341 ext. 1114 or 466-5089.

ISLAND FIREBALL: Green flaming mass seen over
Vinalhaven early Wednesday morning. Several residents
observed a brilliant green ball of fire hurtling earthward at 8 pm
Wednesday night. The circular shaped object plummeted out of
sight several seconds after it was first sighted directly overhead.
One eye witness, Mrs. Olaf Holmquist reported that the sudden
appearance of the phenomena startled her as she walked along
Granite Street, and seemed to be plunging directly toward her,
then suddenly disappeared.

Courier-Gazette Nov. 1952

THE BLACK SPOOK that has been sitting on the cemetery fence in the dim twilight has given up its ghostly wanderings, after frightening everybody in the neighborhood. What a common occurrence these "Black Mariah" visitations were at one time and it is true that they caused considerable uneasiness among the populace. Generally, they turned out to be somebody watching wife, husband or sweetheart. Many of these "Black Mariah's." however, were mythical and only existed in the mind of someone who wished to stir up a little excitement.

Vinalhaven Echo Aug. 16, 1888

SINGULAR MYSTERY: For skeptics to unravel. Friday of the past week excitement prevailed here. More than two hundred people gazed in amazement and wonder upon a scene that was awe inspiring. It was a large wreath of smoke crossing the water from Lane's Island to Norton's Point apparently coming from out of the water. All the people at the Sands looked in vain to see what mysterious agency produced it, but nothing could be seen but the smoke rising as though coming from a steamboat's smoke stack. Its mystical appearance and origin so excited many that they took to boats and rowed out to it to ascertain and unravel its invisible origin but there was nothing to be seen by the watery exhalation of visible vapor curling up onto the heavens and vanishing into obscurity leaving the explorers more mystified than ever and destitute of understanding its obscure mystery. It looks monstrously absurd to believe that occult powers are at work in this vicinity, but many of the people who saw the phenomenon believe in the direct agency of supernatural power and say it is a premonition of something to come.



Letters from Fafa

My family spent every summer with my grandparents on the shores of Lake Michigan. We called my grandfather "Fafa" and my grandmother "Gama." Fafa (Harry Stiles) was an amateur naturalist. During the off seasons from 1952 (when we were 5 and 7) to 1955, Fafa would write letters to entertain us and maintain our interest in nature. I recently found copies of those letters in an old box of papers. Here is the 13th one in the series. Enjoy!

Dutchman's Breeches

May 18, 1953

Hello Boys:

Did you ever, on a walk through the woods, see a little wildflower that looks like a pair of white pants hanging upside down? Well, if you did, you saw "Dutchman's Breeches" - and that is a good name for they do look for all the world like the pantaloons worn by the boys of Holland.

If you have seen them, I wonder if you have stopped to inspect them. If you have, you have likely already learned what Fafa didn't know for years. There are two plants that look so much alike most people do not know the difference and call them both Dutchman's Breeches, although one is Squirrel Corn.

Actually there is a difference in appearance although it is slight. The leaves look almost identical so they are not much help, and the flowers differ only slightly.

The flower of the Dutchman's Breeches is white with the pantaloon legs rather long and spread wide apart. Also, the lower end, or the waistline, is tipped with yellow. You might like to know that in various parts of the United States this flower is called by other names: Soldiers Cap, Indian Boys and Girls, Little Boys Breaches, Butterfly Banners, and White Hearts.

The flower of the Squirrel-Corn has shorter pant legs and they are close together, while the lower end is tinted with magenta-pink.

Both flowers bloom early in the spring and last only a few days.

Now here is a puzzle for you. After the flower is gone, how can they be told apart, for the leaves are almost alike?

If you promise you will look sharply the first time you are in the woods, I will let you in on a secret. You can fool most people for they just can't guess how you can tell one from the other. They will think you are pretty smart.

When you see a plant that you know by the leaves is either Dutchman's Breeches or Squirrel Corn, you just stop and dig carefully at the root. You don't have to dig deep for the secret is close to ground level.

If you see a bulb-looking growth at the base of the stem and it looks like a pineapple, that is, it is made up of little sections, you can safely say Dutchman's Breeches. Even if the doubter stays there all fall and winter to see the plant bloom in the spring, sure enough, those Dutchman's Breeches flowers will appear.

But if you dig down and see some round, smooth, yellow balls, say Squirrel Corn and the plant won't disappoint you, for sure enough in the spring out will come Squirrel Corn flowers. Some people also call this flower Turkey Corn.

Now I have told you the secret, I can't fool you boys anymore. Maybe I shouldn't have told you, but anyway now only the three of us know.

Bourbon Sweet Potatoes with Apples and Pecans

A delicious side dish for Thanksgiving or special fall meals Submitted by Michelle Tullier

Ingredients

5 lbs sweet potatoes (about 6 large), whole

3 cups apples, cored, diced approx 1-in pieces, peeling optional

2 cups raw pecans (can sub roasted pecans if raw unavailable)

1.5 cups agave syrup, amber color

1 stick of butter, unsalted

1.5 t. ground cinnamon

1 t. ground nutmeg

½ t. cayenne pepper

1 t. coarse salt

1 cup bourbon whiskey



Preheat oven to 375°

Bake whole sweet potatoes (do not pierce with a fork) on a cookie sheet until just soft, about 45-55 min depending on size. Do not overcook; they will bake more when ingredients are assembled. Set aside to cool.

Grease bottom and sides of a large baking dish (13x9x2 or similar) with a pat of butter. Add the diced apples with a few pats of butter and bake in oven about 10-15 mins or until just softening. Set aside.

In a small to medium bowl, stir the cinnamon, nutmeg, cayenne, and salt into the agave and set aside.

In a medium to large sauté pan, toast the pecans for a few minutes lightly over high heat until they start to show some char marks (toast less time if using roasted pecans instead of raw). Add the remaining butter and reduce heat to a simmer. (Can use less than the full balance of the butter stick if you prefer.) Add the agave and spices and simmer about 5 mins. Add the bourbon and simmer about 6-8 mins more until sauce thickens to form a glaze over the pecans. Remove from heat.

When cool enough to the touch, peel the sweet potatoes and cut into approx. 1-in cubes. Add the sweet potatoes to the dish with the apples, stirring to mix. Pour the bourbon-pecan mixture over the top (no need to mix in it will blend while cooking). Place in oven. NOTE: If the pecan glaze has hardened and does not pour easily, put it back on a low burner to warm.

Bake for 30 minutes, basting occasionally with its own juices, and serve. Or, assemble this dish a day ahead and do the final baking when ready to serve. Or, bake fully, refrigerate, and re-heat the next day.
