





TideTrackers Spotlight on ...

What are all those rulers for?

The tall white boards marked in feet and inches are tidal gauges. They are set where the tides will reach and partially submerge them, in locations where flooding and storm surge is likely to impact our community.

How often are readings taken?

Ideally, each gauge is read at least once a month at the time of the highest predicted high tide.

What does the data show us?

The tide data we are gathering shows us how much higher the tides are than predicted, especially during a storm surge. During the Dec 23rd storm readings were as much as a foot and a half higher than the prediction. At some gauges those differences are very small; at others they are greater. Over time they may show patterns in how the actual sea levels are changing.





As you may have heard, the disruptions from the past week have influenced some



Have you received your new insurance card for this year?

It is important that you look at your insurance card and make sure your PCP (primary care provider) is listed correctly. If your PCP is listed incorrectly, you need to contact your insurance company. Having an incorrect PCP on your insurance will affect your billing and your claims will be denied.

Have you provided your new insurance cards to ICMS?

You must bring your insurance card and co-pay to each of your visits. Emailing your insurance information ahead of time is also an option. Email your cards today to Brooke Conway, our Outreach Enrollment Manager at bconway@icmsvh.org.



Do you or a family member currently have health coverage through Medicaid (Maine Care) or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)?

If so, you may soon need to take steps to find out if you can continue your coverage.

Be on the lookout for a renewal letter in the mail from the Department of Health and Human Services. To ensure you receive this critical piece of mail, make sure your contact information (mailing address, phone number and email) is up to date with Medicaid. Your notice could also go in your mymaineconnection.gov account, so be sure to check that as well.

Our Outreach Enrollment Manager, Brooke Conway, is here to help assist you with reapplying for Medicaid. If you received a termination letter, Brooke can also help you find affordable health coverage through the Marketplace. Browntail Moth Awareness Month

February 2023

Browntail Moths (BTM) are a threat to the health and safety of both humans and trees! February 2023 has been recognized as Browntail Moth Awareness Month in Maine to encourage people to take action to reduce the negative impacts caused by this invasive insect. Areas with hardwoods are especially vulnerable to infestations, which lead to long-lasting tree defoliation and branch dieback. The spread of the caterpillar's microscopic, toxic hairs -either from touching a caterpillar or from hairs that have become airborne- can cause trouble breathing and skin irritation similar to poison ivy, which can last for a few hours or up to several weeks. The hairs can remain an irritant for several years!

February and March are the best months to clip and destroy the webs of BTM, before the caterpillars hatch in April or May. Here's what to look for when identifying BTM webs:

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

Ted MacDonald says that two great local events took place just 40 years ago the 9th of this month (1898), one was that it was the date of sending the first message ever to go over the cable between Vinalhaven and Rockland, and the other was Ted was born the same day and date! VH Neighbor Feb. 23, 1938

Monday evening at the home of their parents, Mr. & Mrs. Howard Noyes, Chaney and Walter entertained their friends who are members of the J.E.C. and A.P.C. Clubs. About 18 were present. Dancing was a feature of the evening's entertainment with music by the Terpsichorean Orchestra. Lobster stew was served.

Feb. 10, 1912

On June 25, 1889 the town of Vinalhaven was 100 years old. The town's citizens, feeling that they should make some sort of demonstration in honor of the event, planned and carried out the greatest and most successful celebration ever held in Vinalhayen. The local populace in 1889 were never satisfied with mediocrities, civic pride was 100% and Vinalhaven must have the best of everything. An important part of the day's festivities was the parade which took place at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. Conspicuous among the features of this parade was the float which held a picture. The picture was painted for the occasion by local artist Frank H. Winslow and was 8'x10' in size and represented the discovery of the Fox Islands by Martin Pring, a British voyager, in July 1603. It was Pring who called the islands the Fox Islands because of the large number of silver gray foxes to be found here at that time. The picture of the discovery, for several years, adorned the wall of the public library which was then in the building now occupied by Fossett's Fishing Supply Store, what finally became of it we have never been able to find out. Vinalhaven Neighbor Feb. 2, 1938

A "Stocking Social" was held Thursday at the Union Church vestry. The program featured music, humorous readings and sketches. Feet were then measured, F. L. Roberts received the prize for having the largest foot and wearing the longest stockings. By the kindness of Charles L. Boman, moving pictures were shown. The entire program was much enjoyed by the large audience. A buffet lunch was served by Ethel Doughty, Arlene White, Lois Webster, Isabelle Calderwood and Lucy Coombs.

Feb. 11, 1941

On Saturday, a devoted bunch of friends and relatives and his cousin Sheila Burgess had Jimmy Oldroyd and his crutches out on the street. The roads were not bare so Sheila was rather "stumped" as what to do, until someone got a bright idea. A "stroller" was secured and Jim and cast were in it and all were having a most enjoyable morning!.

Feb 15, 1955

The first stone quarried on this island was taken from the quarry at Arey's Harbor in the year 1825, but a Mr. Tuck. This gentleman came from New Hampshire with a vessel and a crew of men for the purpose of getting some stone to build the prison in Charleston, MA. We were informed of these facts by one of our oldest residents, William Clayter, who also told us about them bringing their provisions and tools with them, among which was a quantity of rum. He will tell you the rum part of the story upon request. Vinalhaven Messenger Feb. 6, 1885

Our street lamps have arrived from Boston, and will be immediately set up. They were purchased by Mr. E. S. Bodwell and are of the newest designs. There are six of them. The locations have not as yet been decided on. It is unnecessary to observe the benefit, not to say anything of the improvement this will be. Many parts of our streets are dark and dangerous, and the need of having them lighted is very obvious. The cost of maintenance of the lamps will be only trivial compared to the benefit to be derived, and the citizens will no doubt respond substantially in order to support them. The women were the first to undertake this movement, hence its success We hope before another month to be no longer obliged to the moon for our light by night.

Vinalhaven Messenger 1885

Kenneth Anderson was pleasantly surprised on Valentine's Day by his mother Mrs. Charles Anderson and Dr. Ralph Earle in honor of his 17th birthday. Present were Carolyn Alley, Helen Dyer, Eleanor Hutchinson, Astrid Rosen, Jean Strachan, Marion Johnson, Ada Bray, Audrey Coombs, Fred Snowman, Harold Alley, Wyvern Winslow, Richard Libby, Stanley Young, Norman Johnson and Joseph Dyer. Games were enjoyed and ice cream, cake, sandwiches and two large birthday cakes were served.

Feb. 20, 1958

Ivan H. Olson of Vinalhaven, now serving with the U.S. Navy, has been chosen to serve aboard the LSM, the Speed Carrier of Attack that has been especially developed for Pacific Duty. Now stationed at the Amphibious Training Base in Little Creek, VA. Olson is going through the vigorous training program to prepare for duty as Boatswain's Mate on the swift new invasion vessel. The amphibious ship on which the Vinalhaven resident will serve has been designed with a shallow draft that enables it to negotiate the coral reefs of the Pacific Islands. It crosses the ocean with its cargo of tanks and machines and discharges them directly onto enemy-held shores over its landing-ramp bow. Willie, his brother is a Motor Machinist's Mate Second Class, USNR and is now on duty overseas.
