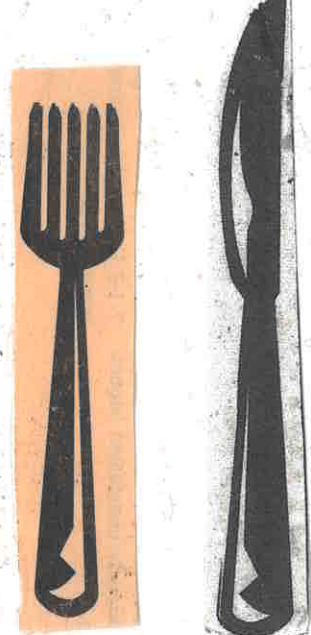

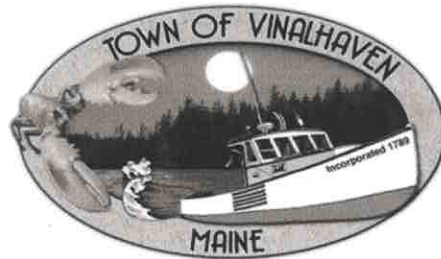

### Notes from the Code Enforcement Office & Planning Board:

In November 2023, the Town voted for revisions to the Land Use Ordinance for the first time since 2009. These notes are to let folks know what is new when it comes to permits and a reminder about other parts of the Ordinance that have always been there.

The Town's policy for Permit Expiration has been revised. Now, if the exterior of a structure is not finished within 2 years, the permit shall expire. You can take as long as you want on the inside, but the part of the structure that other folks have to look at must be completed within two years. A one-year extension can be applied for and will cost 50% of the original application cost. Any new regulations that have been approved since the original application will be enforced with the extension. Timeline for expiration of a permit is not altered by a change in ownership.



### 2022 Property Taxes Notice of Impending Automatic Foreclosure

2022 Tax Liens will automatically foreclose on March 19, 2024 if not paid in FULL by March 18, 2024. If the tax lien forecloses, the Town will OWN YOUR PROPERTY!

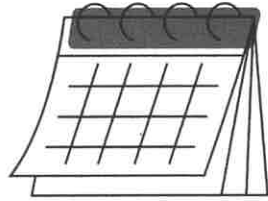

**Parking Ordinance Reminder:** Over the next couple weeks we will be posting sections of the Town's Parking Ordinance.

*It shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle on the public ways, or portion of public ways thereof, as herein described:*

- \* On the south side of Main Street, from west side of the Town Parking Lot to Clam Shell Alley
- \* On the south side of Main Street, within 26 feet of the intersection with Water Street
- \* On both sides of Water Street, the entire length
- \* On both sides of Atlantic Ave., from the intersection with E Main St. to the intersection with School St.
- \* On the east side of Atlantic Ave. from the entrance to ICMS to the intersection with School St.
- \* On the west side of Atlantic Ave. within 80 feet of the intersection with School St.
- \* On the west side of Atlantic Ave. from the intersection of Water St. to the intersection of Round the Mountain Rd.

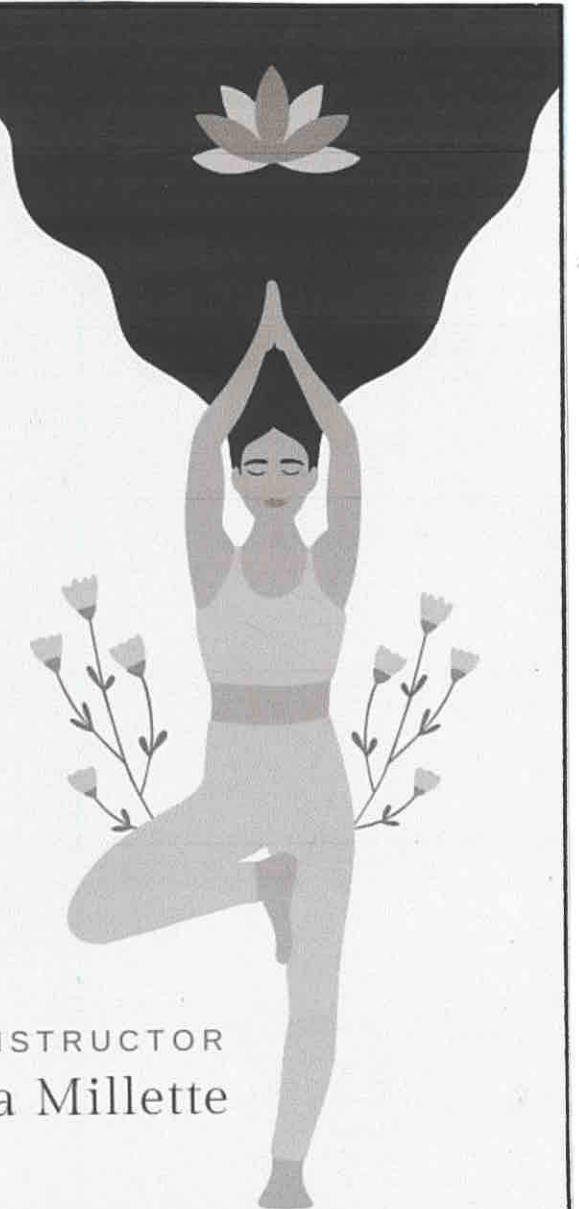

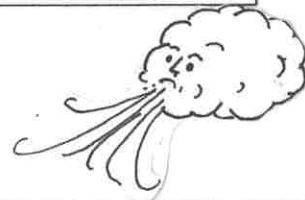

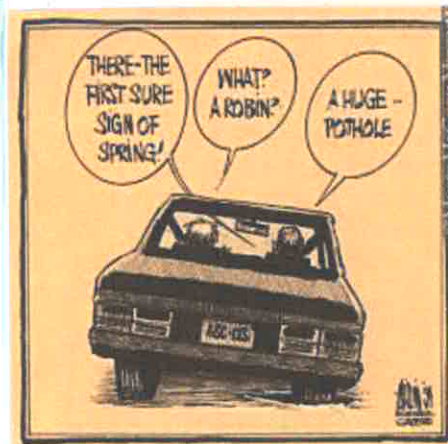

## HISTORIC DOWNSTREET

'To encourage, undertake and support the preservation and restoration of structures and objects of architectural and historic significance, located in and around the "downtown" area of Vinalhaven, Maine.'

Vinalhaven in the early and mid-1900's, captive because of logistics, was thriving because it was captive. Served by a wooden ferry that only carried two cars and made two trips a day, it could hardly be otherwise. There was little point in going off-island to go shopping; nor was there any need. Downtown sported two full service automotive garages—this before there were even many vehicles—twine and net shops, three full service groceries, a jeweler, two barber-shops, a hair dresser, a cobbler and millinery, a tin knocking shop, two pool rooms, a harness maker, a blacksmith, a wonderful bowling alley, four bakeries, two drug stores with companion soda fountains, a news stand, a legendary hardware store, a Five & Dime and dry goods store, four terrific restaurants, a tobacconist, a movie theater and a clothing store, L. R. Smith, that could only be described as 'full-service.'

The telephone exchange was upstairs over the clothing store. A team of local ladies, each understandably among the most well-informed handled and often took part, clandestinely or otherwise, in every phone call made by anyone anywhere to anyone everywhere.

The Downtown Project, soon underway, will favorably transform much of the functional components of Main Street, including replacement of the 1906 water line, an enormous and disruptive undertaking at the time, that transformed island life with the introduction of running water and which has sustained us with that luxury for 118 years, but is now clinging to life.

Perhaps the finished project will be sufficient to attract some novel retail; maybe we'll have three or four good restaurants to choose from as we did before the pandemic.

It was also voted to set aside the earnings of the water system, beyond actual expenses as a credit to the sinking fund established and to cancel the disputed water bill with the North Haven Golf Link Association. It was voted to again teach music in the schools. The new road given by Nelson Mullin, connecting the two highways from Library Hall to the new street north of the new church was accepted. *Mar. 6, 1924*

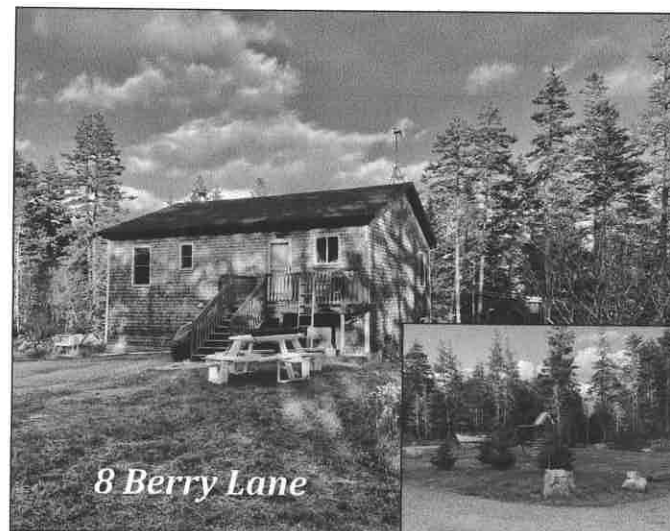
**Prospects of the boat** getting into North Have before April 1 do not seem very bright. The ice is reported as 22 inches thick. *Mar. 15, 1934*

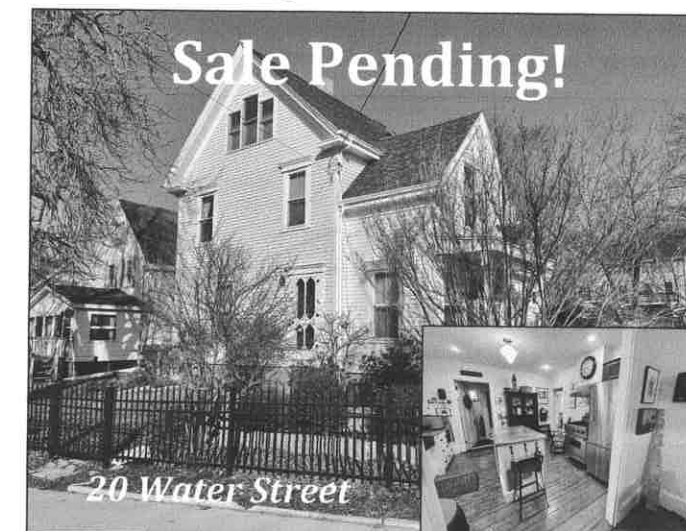
