2022-2023 Property Taxes - Tax bills were mailed out on September 8, 2022. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1, 2022. If you sold your property after April 1, 2022, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner. Payments are due on November 1, 2022, and May 1, 2023. Interest will accrue November 2, 2022 and May 2, 2023. Please call the Town Office at 863-4471 or 863-4343 if you have any questions.

Dog Licenses - \$25 late fee is now in place for all unregistered dogs. All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new dog must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving dogs to Vinalhaven if these guidelines are followed.

ICMS to End Remote Hypertension Monitoring Program

It is with a great deal of regret that ICMS announces the end of the remote blood pressure monitoring program effective immediately. The reasons the program is sunsetting are as follows:

1. The outside funding for the pilot program ended on February 1, 2023.
2. Insurance companies have either reduced their coverage or denied it for the remote monitoring service.
3. A large number of patients enrolled in the program are unable or unwilling to cover the co-pay or costs no longer covered by insurance.
4. The loss of a robust number of participants, along with the loss of insurance payments and outside funding, results in a significant financial loss for ICMS if the program were to continue.

Patients who had success with the program and would like to continue vigilant monitoring of their blood pressure are invited to keep the blood pressure cuffs and to contact their ICMS provider to work out how monitoring at home can continue. We are sorry for the loss of such a successful remote monitoring offering and will strive to identify other, more sustainable future opportunities. Do you or a family member currently have health coverage through Medicaid (Maine Care) or the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)? If so, you will need to take steps to find out if you can continue your coverage.

Be on the lookout for an envelope with a colored blue block from the Department of Health and Human Services as this contains a renewal letter. To ensure you receive this critical piece of mail make sure your contact information (mailing address, phone number and email) is up to date with Medicaid. Your renewal notice could also be posted in your mymaineconnection.gov account so be sure to check that as well.

Our Outreach Enrollment Manager, Brooke Conway, is here to assist you with re-applying for Medicaid. If you received a termination letter Brooke can also help you find affordable health coverage through the Marketplace.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

The selectmen contemplate cutting a large doorway in the vestry of the Town Hall and utilizing it for a hearse house and a place for the road machine. The town voted to raise \$50 for moving and repairing the hearse house, but this is considered insufficient from the dilapidated condition of which it is in. This is undoubtedly a very wise move, as it will ensure a permanent house, and it can be done cheaper. The selectmen are working on strictly economical principles, for the interest of the town.

Vinalhaven Messenger 1885

Mr. Editor: I saw by the last issue of the ECHO that in 1835 Thaddeus Smith was the largest tax-payer in Vinalhaven - it being \$25. This was a mistake. The largest tax-payer there was in this town (1833) was William Smith who paid \$30.43. The whole amount of state, county and town tax for the town of Vinalhaven for the year 1833 was \$1475.48. At this time North Haven formed part of Vinalhaven. The assessors were William Vinal, Francis McMullen and James Beverage.

Vinalhaven Echo 1885

Mrs. E. L. Glidden was hostess to the "No-Name Club" Thursday evening.

April 16, 1925

John Brown of Granite Island has opened a barber shop on Hurricane Island.

April 4, 1903

Mr. & Mrs. Vaughn Johnson celebrated their 22nd wedding anniversary March 27 by entertaining at supper and cards Capt. & Mrs. Edward Greenleaf, Mr. & Mrs. Leo Lane and Mrs. & Mrs. A. E. Libby. Mrs. Johnson was presented a large bouquet of jonquils. Mr. & Mrs. Johnson recently had the pleasure of seeing a picture of their son Norman in *Life Magazine* with a group of recruits at the Great Lakes Naval Training Station, where he is a student.

April 7, 1942

The Leopold & Co. granite quarries are still idle owing to the strike which went into effect April 1. About 200 men are awaiting adjustment of wages.

April 6, 1922

The American Legion Auxiliary will meet Thursday. Supper will be served at 5:30. Members are asked to take percale for quilting and a small prize for the beano game to be held after the business meeting.

April 7, 1942

Pretty and Attractive styles in millinery are displayed in the windows of the millinery stores of Mrs. A. P. Green, Miss Helen Brown and Mrs. C. E. Whitman. Mrs. Whitman has recently purchased the stock of Mrs. L. J. Barton, to which has been added a great variety of the season's novelties.

April 1913

The Library is now located in new quarters over Lyford & Ginn's drug store.

April 18, 1893

The Alarm of fire sounded here at 3:30 this morning, it was found that the lockup was in flames. It had not had an inhabitant for some time and the work was evidently that of an incendiary. The fire had gained such headway by the time the engine arrived that it was impossible to save the building. The village was soon at rest when again the bells rang out the cry of fire, again the firemen sprang to their post but too late to prevent the beautiful Grammar School building from being entirely consumed. The act had evidently been well planned and from appearances the building had been set in several places. The firemen saw that it would be impossible to save the building so directed their efforts toward protecting the outbuildings from catching and they were successful in saving them. A number of men went to the roof of A. A. Mahoney's house and with pails of water kept the flames at bay and though it caught in several places, no damage was done. A new building will be built at once and in the meantime school will be suspended unless rooms can be engaged elsewhere. The culprit had prepared material for the High School, but was evidently frightened away. About \$2,000 worth of books were burned, nothing being saved. It is estimated that it will cost \$5,000 to replace the school building. The cost of replacing the lockup is hard to estimate, as it is not known whether it will be built of wood or stone. We find many in favor of the latter, and the probabilities are that taking into consideration the fact that stone is so easy to get, it will be built of that.

LATER: Herbert Emery, suspected of setting this morning's fires, was found this afternoon hiding in the woods. He was arrested and immediately arraigned before Trial Justice Levi W. Smith. He was found "probably" guilty and placed under heavy bonds for appearance before the September grand jury at Rockland. In the charge of Constable Smith, he was taken to Rockland, where he was turned over to the proper authorities and confined in the Knox County Jail. He has made a clean breast of the matter, but denies that anybody else was connected with the case.

April 1894

A steam drill is being worked to prepare a well at the head of the wharf owned by the Vinalhaven Glue Co.

April 11, 1903

Mr. & Mrs. Scott Littlefield were the delighted recipients of a telegram bringing the good news that their son, Robert, is safe and well. He is stationed with the Asiatic Fleet in Australia.

April 7, 1942

J. Murray Howe and son Ralph have been staying at Haven's Inn, North Haven, for the past week. Mr. Howe is having his cottage on the Vinalhaven side finished and expects to occupy it this summer.

April 27, 1920



Spring Treasure

On the last stretch of road to the cottage a brooklet flows along side the road. It drains a bog into Crockett's River. It is low flow and during the heart of summer it is more mud than water. However, it is enough moisture to support a dense stand of Alder. These trees tend to stick out into the road and occasionally have to be hacked back. Also, in this roadside muck grows a real treasure. If we time it right with a trip up in April, we get to see a stalk of maroon and green protruding through the snow or cold ground. It is such a contrast, all else is brown, gray or black from the winter season. Here now, however, is the first sign of renewal, of hope for warmth and returning life. Soon all around will return to life and come forward. The stalk comes up strong even through snow. Then shortly after a stem arises covered with small purple flowers. All this is surrounded by the decay of last year.

It is something that I look forward to each early trip with the hopes of catching the emergence at its peak. This plant is special because it generates its own heat through the process of thermogenesis which allows it to project through the cold and snow. Later it produces broad leaves a foot wide and more in length. By the end of July or early August the leaves die, and the plant becomes dormant until next spring. Early bloom, early fade I suppose.

This plant is the familiar skunk cabbage known so well for its odiferous smell when its foliage is bruised or disturbed. For all its early spring show it is mostly associated with its smell and has a further hazard of being mildly toxic. Most animals avoid eating the leaves which contain a high level of calcium oxalate. A bite of the leaf is enough to cause a burning sensation in the mouth. Early native Americans used extracts for treatment of various ailments and extracts were sold commercially in the early 20th century. According to some accounts the leaves can be dried and used in soups and salads, not something I would attempt.

This growth of skunk cabbage fills a stretch of the roadside and is likely to remain there. The plant develops a strong root system going deep into the earth. In fact, the roots contract to pull the plant downward. Purportedly it is impossible to dig up and remove. Each plant can live up to twenty years and spreads its seeds to the surrounding area. I look forward to this early harbinger of spring, the maroon and green stems, and the purple flowers. Later I will enjoy the lush broad growth of its spreading leaves, but then stay away from it. The skunk cabbage is just one of the wonders of the Vinalhaven forest and woods.
