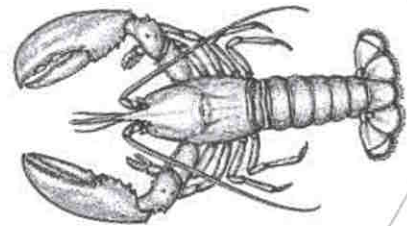

boil.

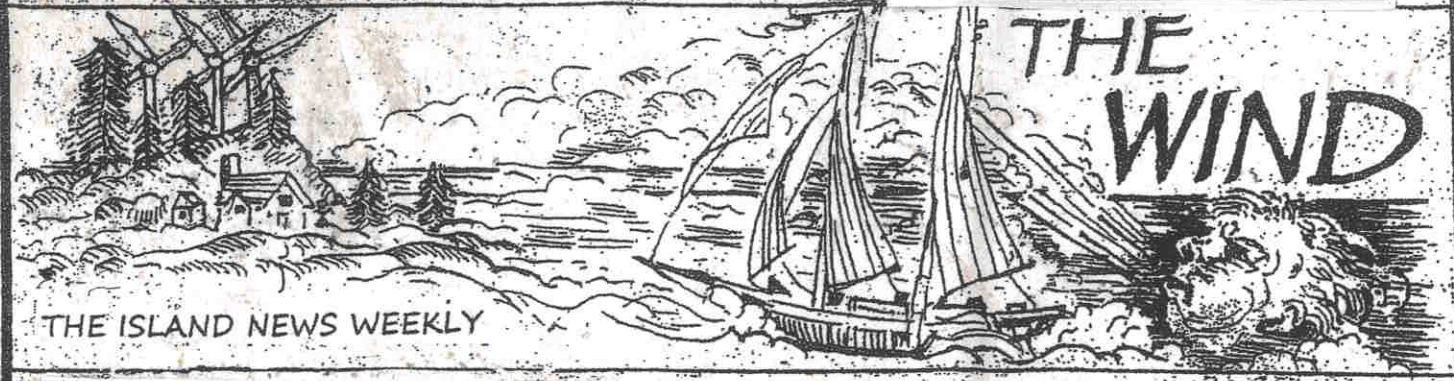
Drain thoroughly, pour salsa on,

2022-2023 Property Taxes - Tax bills were mailed out on September 8, 2022. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1, 2022. If you sold your property after April 1, 2022, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner. Payments are due on November 1, 2022, and May 1, 2023. Interest will accrue starting November 2, 2022 and May 2, 2023. Please call the Town Office at 863-4471 or 863-4343 if you have any questions.

Dog Licenses - \$25 late fee is now in place for all unregistered dogs. All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new dog must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving dogs to Vinalhaven if these guidelines are followed.

When I was a kid my friends & I went to great lengths to pick a secluded spot, to smoke, or misbehave but the parents in this little town of 1200 were an alert & conspiratorial bunch & we oft found our clandestine activities woefully transparent. One day we picked up a pack of Camels from Cascade Lanes and headed down the little 6-foot-wide alley between L R Smith & Helen Wadworth's restaurant to have a smoke. Cascade Lanes was O V Drew's very busy bowling & pool emporium. League bowling took place every night & the town was divided into imaginatively named teams of men & women involving nearly all the town's adults. Similarly cyclical pool & billiard tournaments meant the place was jumping nearly every day & certainly every night. I was one of a dozen adolescent pin setters who risked life & limb, certainly fingers, to return 10 can-lepins to their standing positions after each 3-ball frame was bowled. For ten cents a string, we huddled on a little ledge above the lanes as deadwood flew in all directions. 3 strings would give us the 27 cents we'd need for a pack of Camels. The east side of the alley was the west wall of Helen's restaurant. Helen was famous for her fish cakes, wonderful mouthwatering creations served 3 at a time with a little pile of homemade sausage patties and home fries that started out in the oven before being transferred to a stove top sauté pan to be finished off with peppers and onions. The west wall was L R Smith, a bustling clothing store that sold oilskins & other foul weather clothing to lobstermen but also children's outfits and infant apparel, men's and women's clothing, casual and fine formal wear. Upstairs over the clothing store was the telephone exchange. A team of local ladies, all mothers, all members of the operator's guild and all among the aforementioned conspiratorial parents, handled and monitored every phone call without exception. The operators, four of them, manned the switchboard, one at a time, 24 hours a day &, except during the colder months, with the window open. As we headed down the alley toward mischief we'd have heard, if we'd paused to listen, first the sound of ringing then my Mom's voice, "Hello" "Pat, this is Mabel down to the switchboard. Phillip & Jo Jo just headed down to the carriage house and Phillip was smoking and carrying a bottle." "Land sakes, Mabel, will it never end? I'll send his dad down.

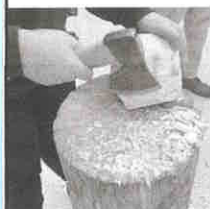

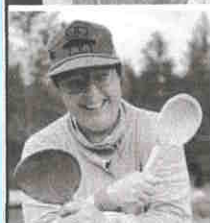


Spoon Carving For All

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

The Health Council held its 4th of July celebration Saturday. It proved to be a great success with the Council netting \$2,200. The parade was made up of several interesting floats, the Vinalhaven bands, fire trucks and Dot Sutcliffe's nursery school. The children were dressed as nurses and firemen. Judges of the floats were Mrs. Jenkins, Howard Hugo and Philip Jameson. Awards for the floats - 1st prize: Kenneth Anderson, prettiest; George Swears, funniest; the most original was a split between Dr. Ralph Earle and Bryant Eaton. The cash awards were returned by the recipients for the benefit of the Health Council. The winners of the Penny Sale were - Lee Osgood, ball, bat & mitt; Jill Oakes, baby doll & clothes, Bob Lloyd, model boat; Ruth Philbrook, child's knit dress; Carolyn Holmquist, tablecloth & napkins; Helen Ames hand crocheted bag; Howard Snowman won the Down East packages donated by B&M Factory; Cherry Taylor, sweater; Susan Burgess and Kevin Hopkins, angora rabbits. At the ball held in the evening at the Town Hall, Miss Lauretta Shields, daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Victor Shields was crowned queen of the Health Council by Harold Haskell. Miss Shields will later attend the Lobster Festival as Rockland as a representative of Vinalhaven. Miss Shields and her attendants led the grand march at the ball. July 11, 1959

A Vinalhaven Woman who between June 20 and July 20 picked 50 quarts of field strawberries and 15 quarts of blueberries by hand, in the midst of the many rains, at the same time she was doing the housework for her family, the number of which varied from 4 to 7 persons. Mrs. Charles E. Young is her name and we would like to know who can equal her performance. July 25, 1922

A surprise party was given to Marietta Hansen Monday evening at her home in honor of her 16th birthday. The evening was spent playing records. Those present were Doris Tupper, Shirley Dyer, Sharon Healey, Dennis Tupper, Georgianna Hansen and Carol Smith. Birthday cake and punch was served. July 16, 1959

Mrs. Clarence Kneeland and her young son William recently received from her husband, Corp. Kneeland, who is with the 10th Mountain Division in Italy, the Bronze Star Medal and Good Conduct Award, which he received May 13 for outstanding bravery and efficiency under combat and the citation accompanying the award, also a picture of Corp Kneeland taken as Maj. Gen. David Ruffner pinned the medal. July 13, 1945

Don Patterson and a party of six, while motoring from North Haven Sunday ran into a ditch at the sharp turn on Crockett's Hill the car turning turtle! No one was seriously injured and only slight damage to the car. July 10, 1923

A large group witnessed the launching of a 27' power boat owned by Dr. Herbert Parsons of NY. The builder was Gosta Skoog. The boat, the *Marnie P*, named for the daughter of the owner, is powered by a 90hp Gray engine and her speed is 13 knots July 29, 1947

200 bars of lead arrived on steamer Vinalhaven weighing a little over 12,000 pounds. The lead will be used for ballast in Mr. Thorvald Ross' new boat now under construction at the Coombs Boat Shop. VH Neighbor July 13, 1938
