2022-2023 Property Taxes - Tax bills were mailed out on September 8, 2022. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1, 2022. 

As a final writing project of the year, junior and senior English students wrote an "I Have Something to Say" essay. The assignment was to write about something-anything-they wanted to share, with the knowledge that they would share the essays with their classmates and perhaps with the public. Every single one of the essays was amazing, insightful, and heartfelt. Not all the students opted to have their essays shared with The Wind, but many did. Here is one.

Certified Nursing Assistant by Gracey C. Warren

In the eyes of some people, I may become "only a CNA" but I will be much more. I want the opportunity every day to make an impact on people's lives. CNA's get paid for more than simply washing people, making beds, and all the other tasks that come with the job. We have chosen a profession that demands direct care from us. We need to show patience, compassion, and support daily, no matter what kind of day we are having. I'm not only a "CNA" I'm a CNA.

A CNA is in charge of getting the residents in and out of bed, toileting them, showering, bed bathing, taking them to their appointments and activities, and assisting them with walking when they want to go for walks. Reporting any health issues to the supervising nurse. Emptying catheter bags. Setting up meal trays, and documenting food and fluid intake. Making beds. Keeping the residents' space clean and tidy. Turning bedridden residents to prevent bedsores.

I will be the CNA in many patients' lives, who will be providing them with activities of daily living. Washing, dressing, bathing, eating, some patients may not be able to do these things themselves anymore so they will depend on me. I will be there for tough days; I will give emotional support even when I just want to cry too. I am the one they will rage at, venting their frustration, anger, confusion, and fear. I will perform care, even though doing so will put me in a position of being physically and verbally abused at times by the hands of those I care for.

As a CNA I'll be the one who hears "I want to go home" from patients sometimes several times a night and comforts them. I will make a difference by offering my support to my residents. The staff becomes the only family a resident has. I will become their source of love, and friendship. I will be the one who tries to heal loneliness and depression in the residents I care for.

One of the most important things, I will let them know that someone still cares about them. I will be the one who listens when no one else listens. I will listen to my patients' repeat stories from their past over and over again, offering my words of encouragement over their accomplishments and memories. I want to be the one who ensures they know they still have great worth as human beings, even though their lives have changed. I'm not "only a CNA" I'm a CNA.
