## Harbormaster Notice

Traps and equipment must be brought to the parking lot and loaded each day- no equipment is allowed overnight in the downtown parking lot. This ordinance is in effect until Labor Day. Any abandoned boat trailers will be taken to the dump soon. Come get your trailer before this happens. Please remember to give the ferry boat some room to get out of the Harbor. The captains of the ferry boat are asking for a little consideration - please give them some. Also, please slow down coming and leaving the harbor you are causing damage to your friend's skiffs that are tied up to the floats with your wake. The limit at a town float is 16 feet. If your boat is over that footage you have to find another place to dock. Big outboards used for hauling are not exempt- please move them. If you are a non-commercial boat owner and your boat is under 16 feet you need to tie up at the downtown float, not the floats at the ferry boat. The end of the floats are for pick up and drop off only. We are working on having two more floats at the ferry boat ASAP.

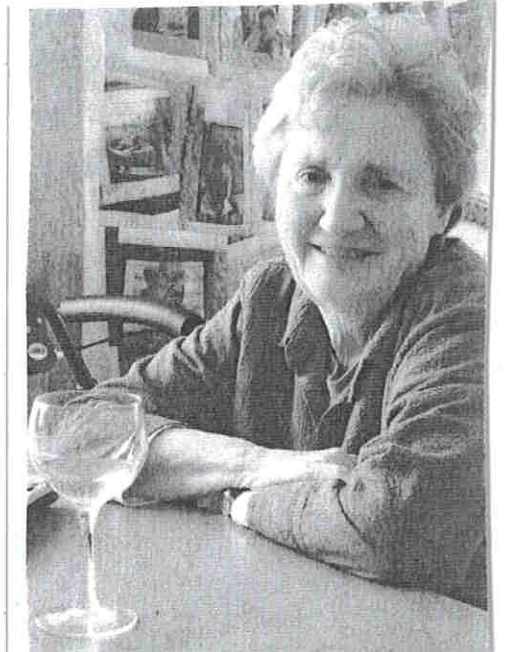

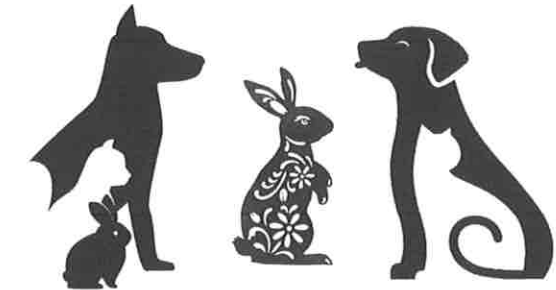

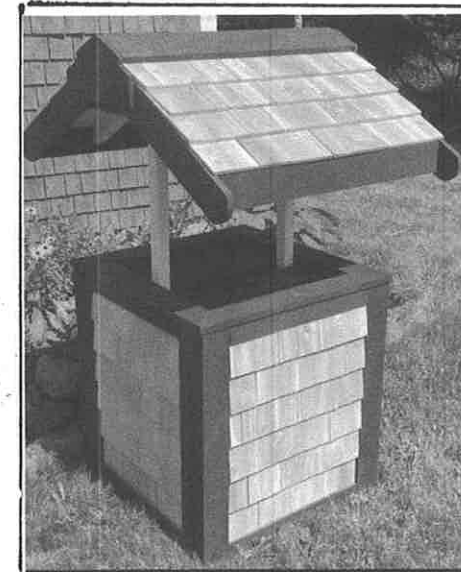

**Too Much Zucchini? Do you have any interesting recipes to share ...please submit to The Wind! Here is one to get you started....**

### Dilled Zucchini Pickles

16 Cups Zucchini, sliced thin  
2 Cups Celery, chopped fine  
2 Cups Onion, chopped fine  
1/3 Cup Salt  
-mix, cover with ice cubes, leave 3 hours, Drain well....  
Combine:  
4 Cups sugar, 2 Tbs. Dill Seed &  
4 Cups White Vinegar  
Heat, stirring until rolling boil. Then add veggie mix, heat again to rolling boil and jar with 1-2 pieces garlic in each jar. (follow proper canning procedure) approx.. 8 pints. *from recipe box of Mary Ewell*

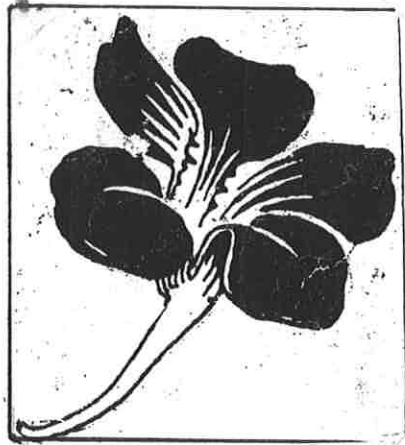

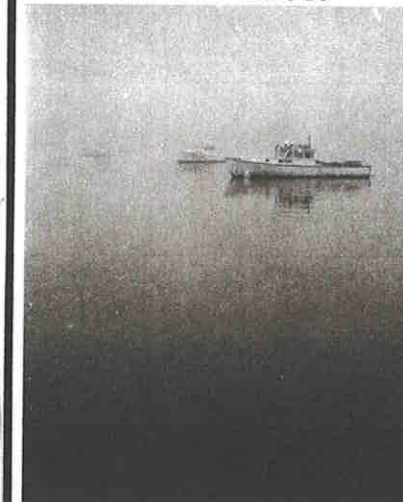

### "Old Fish House Days"

#### #17 Salted Trawl

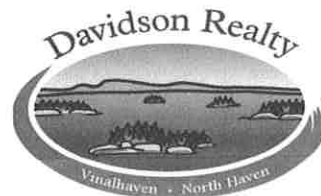
"An' two young fellers I know  
Bait up a tub of trawl while  
they're cleanin', said Disko, lashin'  
the wheel to his taste." -- "Captains Courageous"  
~Rudyard Kipling

When we were kids and had nimble fingers, we baited a lot of trawl down at the fish plant. We could bait a tub in about two hours. One tub was typically 3000 feet of tarred cotton mainline tied together in 10 strings with about 500 hooks. The hooks were attached to the strings via two feet lines called gangions (snoods) and these were secured to the mainline by swivels. The line had to be coiled and the hooks properly lined up so the whole works paid out, uneventfully, for a moving set, ideally done on a running tide.

We worked in a wide, rectangular room flanked with oak benches that were as thick and solid as a schooner keel (and about as slick, too). There was a bank of windows overlooking the harbor which brought in good light, even though those windows were not exactly what you could call clean. The place was always full of salty characters spinning droll yarns, from the likes of Wooster Coombs recounting his dory days on the Grand Banks to Arvid Holmquist drifting back to his granite cutting years on Hurricane. It was always loud, lively, and busy—"Grand Central Ganging Room."

For the most part, our longliners were quite satisfied with our baiting—except for one, old Sands Eaton, a curmudgeon's curmudgeon was Sands! He used to complain to us that we did not use enough salt for his trawls, worked too slow, and so on. We'd had enough. Next baiting, his tubs all got 100 pounds of extra salt put to 'em and boy were they heavy. Well, when he saw us after this sabotage of surfeit, he was some mad, damning us up and down something fierce he was. But he kept us on, and I don't remember Sands ever complaining again about going light on salt in his tubs. However, he still found plenty else to complain about, we were slightly better than fog in his complaining compendium.

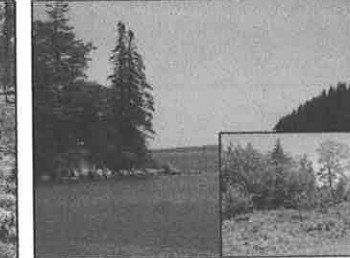

Birthday cakes and ice cream were served. Pictures were taken of the young guests of honor.

Courier-Gazette Mar. 30, 1948

**Donald Oakes** age 12 and Laurence Oakes age 13, recently cut one-half cord of wood—a good record for youngsters.

Courier-Gazette Feb 6, 1940

**John Frederick Chilles**, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Chilles, has won the honor of being the best kite maker in town. He makes them to stay up. Recently he made just an ordinary paper kite, put her up and there she stayed for three days and three nights, quite an endurance test. One of his playmates remarked, "John doesn't need anyone to make his kites, he makes them himself and they always go up."

Courier Gazette Apr. 10, 1934

**The feature of the week** was the opening of E. G. Carver & Sons new store on the north side of Main Street, opposite the old store. It is a fine improvement to the street, a modern up-to-date structure and fully equipped with the latest electrical refrigeration. Saturday afternoon it was opened to the public and inside it also presented a fine appearance with its decorations of large baskets of cut flowers and Jardinières of ferns. Mrs. E. G. Carver and Mrs. Albert Carver were assisted by Mrs. Albert Headley, Miss Dorothy Thomas and Mrs. Owen Roberts in presenting gifts of candy, cereals, glassware, fruit, balloons, etc., to the large number of persons gathered to inspect the new store. "Yours for Service," is the motto of the Carver stores, both old and new. They make a specialty of Monarch Super-Quality Foods, of which the store has a fine display.

## A MEMORY

Today was the funeral and memorial for the Grand Dame, Dot Webster. I spoke this story then, and figured it was time to write it down. It's good to do that, especially when the story is about something or someone who was a blessing to you, to the world.

My wife, Ingvild and I were driving to our rental cottage on Blunder Lane. She is much newer to Vinalhaven but is very open to the ways of this Magical Place. We were wending our way up the curvy, tiny dirt road, ever going upward. As we approached 12<sup>th</sup> Street, (in NYC we live on 11<sup>th</sup> Street!) a little woman came out, with curiosity, determination, etc. I took a good look at her glowing face, her deep, kind eyes, and assessed the situation.

I stopped the car, turned off the engine, pulled up the brake and said to my wife. "We are in for a Vinalhaven Moment." Ingvild is open and always ready for all things Vinalhaven! We sat there as she approached. She introduced herself as Dot. Right away she offered her full hospitality! She found out we were staying at Candace Hyde's home, right next to her! "Come on down, anytime, and visit please! If I am not here, help yourself to anything in the 'fridge, any food you find, anything!" It was a treasured 15-20 minute 'getting to know you' encounter with Dot! It was correct to turn off the engine; these great moments are few and far between, so grab 'em while you can!



In so many ways it was a Blessing to seize this moment. It is my best Vinalhaven memory, one I will never forget. We went on to see Dot, talk, see her selling stuff at the Flea, all those good things. Whenever we saw her, it was, "how are you, Dot?" This was always followed with her shouting out, 'I'm fine, Great to be Alive' or an exuberant, 'LIFE IS GREAT!!!' Always something like that! With her passing I'm reminded of an idea I encountered some years ago. When great people are called back to their maker, think about how they lived. With Dot's way of living, you have a great choice. Harold "Hal" Anderson, 82, of West Islip, NY, passed away on July 20, 2021, surrounded by his loving family. As a respected educator, coach, and school administrator on Long Island for more than four decades, he will be remembered for the profound positive impact he had on thousands of students, and the kindness, friendship, and mentorship he extended to his colleagues throughout his career. As a beloved husband, father, grandfather and esteemed member of the West Islip community, Hal was known as a genuinely kind, sincere, caring friend to all, who possessed an unabiding love for his family.

Born on November 24, 1938, Hal grew up on the island of Vinalhaven, off the coast of Maine. He learned early the value of hard work and perseverance from his father Henry, his mother Flavilla, and his stepmother Louise, traits that he would later pass on to his children and grandchildren. As a result, success followed him at every turn, and his list of achievements and accomplishment is long. He was a strong student and a standout athlete who excelled in basketball and baseball, his first love growing up, and the place he shared a close bond with teammate, friend and cousin, Walt White. His prowess on the diamond and in the classroom saw him skip a grade in school, allowing him to play varsity baseball as an eighth grader. He would eventually play semi-pro baseball as a pitcher and middle infielder.

At the University of Maine, he was a multi-sport athlete in baseball and cross-country and a top performer in the ROTC program, earning his bachelor's degree in history and government. As a member of the U.S. Army, he graduated from jump school and rose to the rank of First Lieutenant. As an educator, he earned post-graduate degrees in counseling and administration, spent 17 years at Bemer High School as a guidance counselor, and was twice named Coach of the Year as a varsity baseball coach at Massapequa High School.

But for all his accomplishments, his legacy lies in the many, many students who loved and respected him, and to this day, continue to remember the positive effect he had on their lives. Whether you were the valedictorian or a struggling student, class comedian, star athlete, accomplished musician, or that kid who always seemed to find trouble, "Mr. Anderson" had a unique ability to connect with students in a way that few could and help them find their way through their school years and beyond. For that, they were forever indebted to him. Perhaps the only place on earth he cherished as much as his beloved Vinalhaven was his adopted hometown of West Islip. A resident for over 50 years, he was a principal at West Islip High School and Udall Road Middle School for 25 years and has a well-earned reputation as a true gentleman, a consummate professional, a class act, a loyal friend and trusted neighbor, someone who others tried to emulate. Hal and his wife Mary raised seven children, all excellent students and standout multi-sport athletes at West Islip High School, and have been staunch supporters of many school, community, and athletic programs.

Hall served as president of the West Islip Association of School Administrators, chairman of the Middle School Translation Committee, and as a member of the West Islip Lionheart Committee. He coached Little League baseball and youth basketball, was a 40+ year member of the West Islip Athletic Boosters Club, a 25-year member of the West Islip High School Athletic Hall of Fame Committee, of which he was honored as an inductee in 2012, and a member of the West Islip American Legion. He also served as a baseball and softball umpire and basketball referee for many years. A huge sports fan, a dedicated father, and doting grandfather. Hal could always be found on the sidelines not only in West Islip, but across Long Island, and across the country, rooting for the Lions and cheering on the Anderson-Ilchuck-Scorica clan on countless fields and courts over nearly half a century. He was their biggest fan. Hal Anderson was truly special; an extraordinary man of honor and integrity with a magmatic personality who brought people together. He leaves the world a better place through his spirit and kindness.
