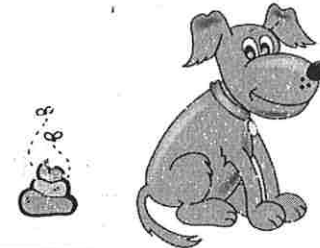

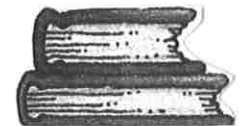

2021-2022 Property Taxes – Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1st, 2021. **If you sold your property after April 1st, 2021, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner.** Payments are due on November 1st, 2021, and **May 2nd, 2022.** Interest is accruing on unpaid November 1st payments. Dog Licenses - All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed. **All dogs not licensed for 2022 will now have to pay \$25 late fee per dog.**

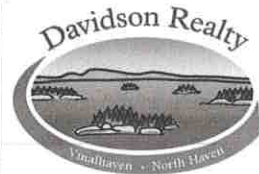

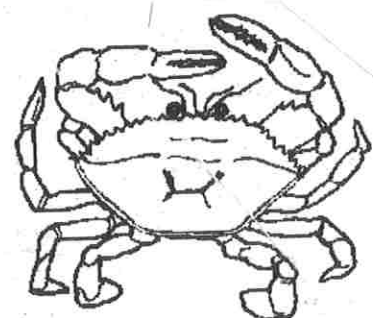

someone—certainly her.

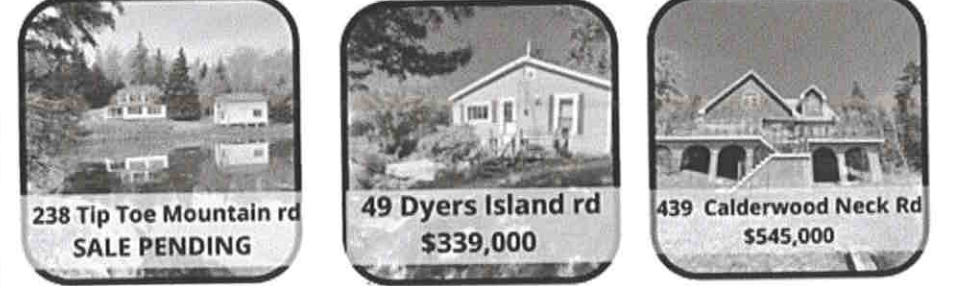
At The Hop stirs all sorts of things

windows down, while Buddy Holly
sings *That'll be the Day*, or *Peggy
Sue*. Sometimes though, during those
rides, I should really pull over and get
ahold of myself for the sake of others
as when Johnny Tillotson sings
Without You.

not a good thing for someone my age
but I'm only vulnerable on Saturdays

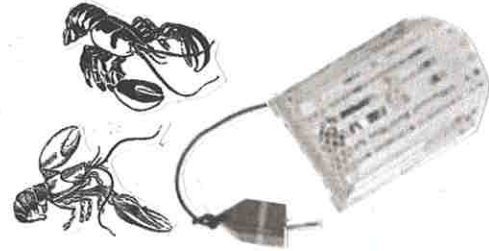

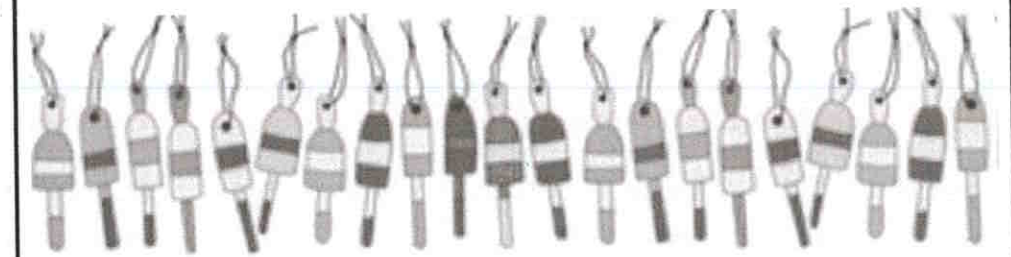

The Summer of Walter

Walter Cronkite was an American icon, a reliable newsman whose signature sign-off station "and that's the way it is." Walter refused to allow his personal beliefs to influence his job to report accurate news. It was his integrity and commitment to fair reporting that made him the "most trusted man in American." For me, one of his most endearing qualities was that he loved Maine and sailing around Penobscot Bay.

If there is such a thing as an unassuming 64-foot yacht, the two-masted vessel owned by Walter Cronkite was it. While some owners turn their boasts into floating palaces, Walter's Wyntje was the kind of boat on which you could spill your wine and not worry about being thrown overboard. Every boat Walter owned from the '60s till his death was named Wyntje, the name of the first woman to marry a Cronkite in the New World in 1642.

The year 1989 was the Vinalhaven Island's Bicentennial. Walter was asked to be the Grand Marshal of the island's celebration and attendant parade. Both gracious and generous, he accepted our small town's request and with little fanfare sailed his Wyntje into Carver's Harbor.

The parade consisted of fire engines, floats, vintage cars, and most of all proud island residents. The marching band was made up of musicians old and young, experienced players and novices alike. What they lacked in harmony, they made up with heart.

Many, many of my family members attended the celebration. Our growing gaggle gathered in front of the "Star of Hope" building (then home to the late artist, Robert Indiana). As Grand Marshal, Walter was given a seat of prominence, high up on the horse-drawn, steam powered, fire pump which had been used by the fire department from 1900-1920.

Vinalhaven's downtown is so small that onlookers get to enjoy every parade twice: once as the caravan heads through town, and then again after it makes a quick U-turn at the town's bandstand gazebo and heads back the way it came. As Walter came by on the parade's first pass, our little throng of our friends and family waved and in unison, cheered "Hi Walter!" On his return leg just a few minutes later, we waved a second time, just as enthusiastically, and once again in unison, warmly cried out, "Bye Walter!"

Mr. Cronkite laughed, smiled, and waved back at us. It's the little things in life that matter.

L Is for Lockout/The Great Lockout of 1892. When Granite Cutters Union members demanded a nine-hour workday and an increase in wages the Granite Manufactures Assoc. moved to smash the unions. No union quarry worker could obtain a job in any other stone yard or quarry in the country. Therefore, a group of men formed the Fox Island Cooperative Granite Co. in the fall of 1892, and started work almost immediately on contracts for curbing, crosswalk, and paving blocks. By spring of 1893, Vinalhaven workers were upset with the Cooperative because they had not yet been paid for work done on the paving contract. When workers asked when pay would come, they were told that, "Mr. Grant," who had procured the contract, "is to arrive soon and will bring the money with him." Weeks, then months passed, while groceries and supplies dwindled, and bills grew. Still there was no sign of Mr. Grant. One day, when things appeared to be at their bleakest, news finally came that "GRANT HAS COME!" Local businesses once again began to prosper. The lockout soon ended, and work resumed at the Bodwell Granite Co.'s quarries and cutting yards. Sourced from *Horse Nets, Holliwoggers, and Littlefield Blue* (VH Historical Society)

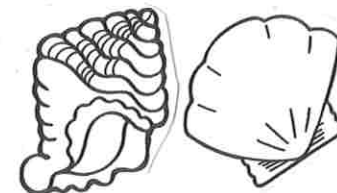

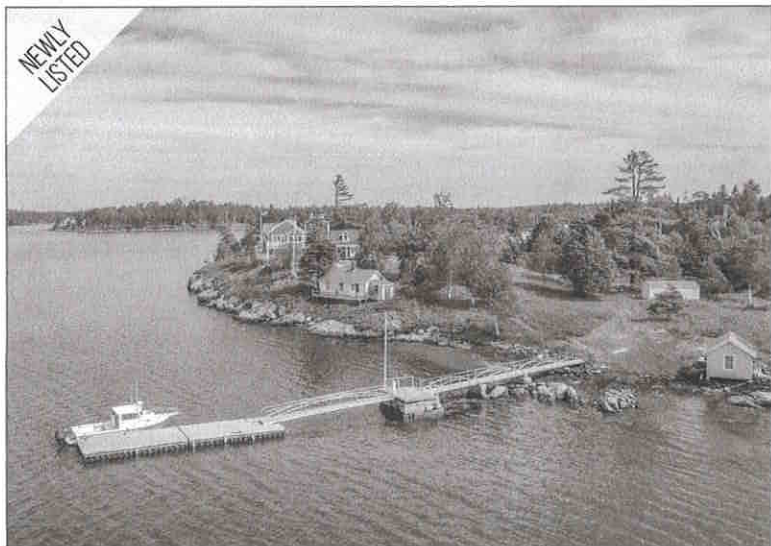

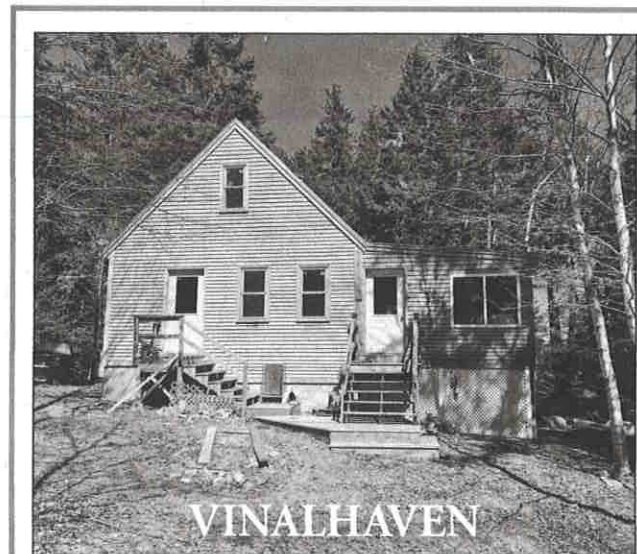

Excerpt from The American Coast Pilot – 1842; Fox Island Passage

(Sailors, imagine navigating the Thorofare for the first time using this as your guide, before there were any buoys, let alone GPS!)

On Browns Head at western end of Fox Is. Thoroughfare, a fixed light stands two rods from the shore and 80 ft. above high-water mark. Fiddler's Ledge bears W ¼ S distant 3 miles. Fiddler's ledge from Crabtree Pt. W S W about ½ mile. Fiddlers Ledge is above the surface at two hours ebb. Crabtree Ledge bears from the light W by S about 1 ½ mile. This ledge may be seen breaking at high water with a little motion.

In running from Owls Head light for Fox Is. Thoroughfare, bring the light to bear W and steer E ½ S until you bring the Browns Head light to bear E N E and steer for it till you are within one cable's length from it. When abreast of the light and between the light and the Sugar Loaves, steer N E ½ E for Young's Narrows. There is good anchorage between the Sugar Loaves and the light in 7 ½ fathoms at low water.

The entrance to Young's Point is narrow at low water off which lies a ledge of sunken rocks which are covered at high water. There is also a quantity of sunken rocks at the larboard hand which lie off the Dumplins. These Dumplins are three islands which you leave on your larboard hand. Your course in this passage is E S E about two miles keeping your starboard hand on board, when you will make Deep Cove on your starboard hand. You may run into said cove and anchor in 7 fathoms of water. Here you may ride safe in any wind.

When you leave this place bound eastward you steer E S E till you come up to a clear spot of land where the trees have been cut off. As soon as said spot bears W S W, you steer E N E for the middle narrows. You will see two large white rocks in the middle of the passage unless at high water at which time they are covered about one hour. You may go on either side. Continue E N E about one league when you must keep your starboard hand on board as there are several sunken rocks and ledges on your larboard hand which are covered at high water.

You will make the eastern narrows on your starboard hand and as soon as you bring it to bear S S E, you may run through where you will find a fine harbor which is safe to ride in all winds except E N E. When you pass the eastern passage of Fox Island, you must steer E N E about 4 miles which course will carry you into a large bay that lies between Fox Island and Isle-au-haut.
