





2021-2022 Property Taxes – Tax bills were mailed out on Sept 1st, 2021. Tax bills were sent to the owner of record on April 1st, 2021. If you sold your property after April 1st, 2021, it's up to you to forward the tax bill to the new owner. Payments are due on November 1st, 2021, and May 2nd, 2022. Dog Licenses - All dogs 6 months or older need to be licensed, including visiting dogs in town for 10 days or more. Please bring current rabies certificate and \$6 for spayed/neutered or \$11 for male/female. A new puppy must be vaccinated & licensed once reaching 6 months of age, and if adopting an older dog or if you are just arriving in town, you have ten days to register. There is no late fee for new or newly arriving puppies/dogs if these guidelines are followed. All dogs not licensed for 2022 will now have to pay \$25 late fee per dog.



DETERMINATION OF CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION

TO: All Interested Persons

DATE ISSUED: August 9, 2022

As required by Section 6 of the State of Maine Rules Relating to Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund Chapter 230, the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) staff prepared a "Justification for Categorical Exclusion" on behalf of the Vinalhaven Water District of Vinalhaven, Maine to exempt a proposed project from the formal environmental review requirements.

The proposed action is the replacement of approximately 930-ft of water main on Main Street, from High Street to Water Street, on the island of Vinalhaven. Work will include a bridge crossing, services, hydrant(s) and appurtenances. Work is anticipated to begin in Spring 2023.

The Drinking Water Program's review of the proposed actions has indicated that it meets the criteria of "Categorical Exclusion" listed in subsection c (II) of Chapter 230. The project is not likely to have significant effects on the quality of the environment. Specifically, the proposed action is the replacement of existing water mains with new mains in the same general location.

Therefore, a Categorical Exclusion from formal environmental review as provided in Section 6 of the State of Maine Rules Relating to Drinking Water State Revolving Loan Fund Chapter 230 is being granted. This exclusion may be revoked at any time if 1) the project is altered and no longer meets the requirements of a categorical exclusion 2) new evidence shows that serious environmental issues exist or 3) a local, State or Federal law is being or may be violated.

Project documents are on file and are available for public review at the offices of the Vinalhaven Water District and the offices of the Drinking Water Program. Comments relative to this decision may be submitted to the Department of Health and Human Services Drinking Water Program.



The Observer The treasure that is the Vinalhaven Historical Society was first envisioned in the mid-sixties by folks like Elliott Hall, Ray Sennett, my German teacher, and others and during the intervening sixty or so years has become the repository of all that is and certainly all that was Vinalhaven. The island has an extraordinary history, and it is all either on display or tucked away there at the Museum. I get communication all year long, every year, from folks all over the world who, having just discovered or long known of an island connection, want to discover more about the lives of their ancestors. I refer them immediately to the folks who staff or volunteer at the Historical Society and invariably hear glowing praise and gratitude for the help they received. The Society occupies its huge building, owned by the Town and once a church on the mainland—an extraordinary story in itself—with the understanding that the Society will be responsible for its maintenance. I think, after sixty years of such demonstrative benefit to our community, that the Town should take over the upkeep but that's a subject for another time. Meanwhile, the Historical Society, supported entirely by donations, just makes ends meet and, each year, has to ask for support from those of us it serves so very well. Old Fish House Days

Strawberry Fields

Elbridge, known to all here as Buster, remembered his first time as the Washington School, now the Town Office, and once the home of the esteemed Vinalhaven Press. Buster's flash memory is not inside the school but rather lining up outside on the steps waiting to go in. This time came back to him recently when he was in the building with an old classmate. The two had not been there together in decades.

The four-room schoolhouse was built in 1896. In Buster's Day to the left, going in, was kindergarten (Mullen/Davis), and to the right, first-grade (Martin). Directly above kindergarten, via the wide, creaky staircase, second grade (Melin), across from there the royal realm, aka third grade (Doughty). By the time he navigated through all the rooms, Buster felt he had a good grasp of the scholastic basics: he could read, write, add, subtract, multiply, divide, name some of the Maine counties, sing the scales and spell Mississippi forward and backward—so he claims!


Buster and his old classmate reminisced about Lucille's chocolate milk deliveries to the school which they both enjoyed. Lucille was the island's beloved milk lady, and her cartons were always outside the classrooms in neat little piles for their first-morning break.

From Lucille the two got around to those breaks, recesses, and what ever they could remember about them. There was a merry-go-round and a slide and, in cold weather, usually on a dare, some poor kid would get his or her tongue stuck to one of these fixtures. It was always very dramatic but usually resolved quickly with tongue intact. There was a fire escape chuted connected to the third-grade classroom and it attracted the recess climbers, despite the teachers discouraging them. They all played marbles; the playground was ruled by rapacious gladiators who vanquished the defeated, hapless first graders mostly, to Barton's to buy new marbles so their plunder could continue. (At the store, Mrs. Candage always helped assuage their various states of humiliation and destitution, Buster was a regular.) The last recess memory is the jaunt to nearby Shields Grocery for candy. For the first to get there, Cleo or Wyman would fetch the partitioned, homebuilt, particular shade of green tray from beneath the counter which included all the essential candy groups. Most selections cost a nickel or a dime and after the transaction was completed, and a thank-you was said, all skedaddled back so they had time to enjoy their choice before they had to go back to class.

Weeks later, Elbridge again drifted back again to those years. He thought about Indian summer days there sitting at his desk as the season's late light filtered through the colossal windows, flooding the rooms in ethereal afterglows. The light, in tandem with the views of the pond below, was astounding even to a boy and it caused a strong emotion in him, an epiphany, albeit he then had no language to explain it as such. It was, he knows now, the beginning of his sense of place, something that would profoundly develop as it does for many—if not all here—into a life's observation of the divine wonders, infinite curiosities, and boundless beauty of the skies, coves, and granite ruins of his craggy island home that floats in the waters of the Wabanaki dawn.

Tidbits from the Vinalhaven Historical Society

A lively demonstration was made in town Tuesday night, by the people in celebration of the end of World War II, (V-J Day Aug. 14, 1945[United Kingdom]). Church bells rang, whistles, horns and bon-fires made things lively. Children with noise-makers and grown-ups shouted their joy at the long looked for era of peace as this day marked the end of the war and all it horrors.

Courier-Gazette Aug. 17, 1945

Freeman Leadbetter entertained Joseph Calderwood, Mrs. John Beggs and son Jack, Wednesday, at a chicken dinner. After dinner Mr. Calderwood gave a talk on the settling of Arey's Harbor. Mr. Leadbetter's home (Sunny Acres) was once the home of Mrs. Beggs' grandparents, Benjamin and Betsy Arey.

Courier-Gazette Aug. 14, 1941

Mac Gilchrist, son of Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Gilchrist celebrated his 7th birthday at his home Friday. Those present: Marion and David Balfour, Lermond Doughty, Valois Young, John Washburn, Edward Dyer, Timothy Lane, Clarence Conway, Dexter Wadsworth, Richard Hocking, Peter Williams, Harold Anderson, John Arey, Walter White, Michael Bunker, Kenneth Conway, Robert Bennett, Robert Butler. Valois Young won the prize for the Donkey Game. Lunch was served. Favors were baskets of candies and Hum-a-phones. The big attraction was the sawdust pudding as each child drew a prize.

August 1, 1944

Twenty-four large polished granite columns were shipped Wednesday, by the B.G.Co. for the Indiana State Capitol. They have started up their polishing mill for the purpose of polishing a part of the Cornish course for the Harlem River Bridge, and they have shipped over 20,000 tons of granite MONTHLY since last March. The Sands Quarry has a capacity for supplying more granite than any granite quarry in the United States.

Vinalhaven Echo ca. 1888

E. G. Carver & Son will open their new grocery store on the north side of Main Street Saturday afternoon for inspection by the public, and will start business Monday. The store has all modern improvements including automatic refrigeration. It is electrically lighted in all departments and arrangement is made whereby all incoming stock and goods for delivery are handled at the door near the rear of the building. Aug. 6, 1931



Efforts to get the boat ashore failed as the mainsail caught fire as well, so the passengers had to quickly abandon the ship. 

FIEC seeks former members owed refunds.

Between 2020 and 2022 FIEC retired \$54,400 in capital credits to its current and former members. Unlike forprofit utilities whose excess revenue goes to shareholders, cooperatives reinvest the revenue in the electric system and return it to its members when the equity is retired.

The Board approved the retirement of equity from the years 1977, 1978, 1981 and 1982. For individuals who had electric service during any of those years, FIEC will credit current members on their July electric bill and mail a check to former members.
